MOASCAR	MARCH	24th.	Australian Mounted Division Headquarters moved into buildings lately occupied by A. & NZ.T.C. & D.Camp Headquarters. All signal work now to be dealt with by Moascar Signal Office.	
"	"	31st.	Unit paraded and was inspected by G.O.C., A.I.F. in Egypt. A.M.S. Circular No 3, reference vacancies for post-war employment in Commonwealth Arsenal was promulgated and applications called for. The Signal Training Unit's equipment, was either returned to Signal Park Abbassia during the month; or transferred to 2nd Signal Squadron, (Australian) for use of communications in connection with the unrest of Natives in Egypt.
