



This morning the Brigadier accompanied by an Officer of the 4th Field Company saw a demonstration of the system of rapid wiring in each Battalion. His observations are as follows:-

A compromise between the 4th Divisional and 45% 4th Army sealed pattern. Not as good a demonstration as either of the other three Battalions.

A very good exhibition, and exactly in accordance with pattern laid down by 4th Army.

Except that QW 12 men were used instead of 9 and that both aprons were done simultaneously the task was really done as laid down by the 4th Army. Time slower than Srth 14th Battalton.

The 4th Divisional pattern. Quick and simple. Arrangements will be made for a squad later from the 14th Battalion to demonstrate the 4th Army pattern simultaneously with 16th Battalion squad.

One Battalion has been wiring at night with gas masks and on broken ground with a party representing the enemy firing Verey Lights. This is excellent practice and the Brigadier desires such training to be included in next week's programme.






