



Chaplain H.H.HARPER, of the 16th Battalion next read a translation of the School Master's Speech to the Troops. The Officer in charge of the French Mission next spoke. The ceremony over, the Battalions marched back to the square, where the bands played the British and French National Anthems.	111


#### FRENCH PATRIOTIC MEETING.

31.10.1918.

- 1. The inhabitants of PICQUIGNY are placing flowers on the graves in the British Cemetery, tomorrow, 1st November and have expressed a wish that the Australian Troops billetted in the town attend the Ceremony. The 13th and 15th Battalians will attend.
- 2. Battalions will be at their starting points at 2.p.m. ready to move off.

Starting Point, 16th BATTALION. 16th Bn.OFF.MESS.) facing

The 16th Battalion will block up close to allow the French
people to take their place immediately behind them.

3. Battalions will be formed up at cemetery as indicated below:-



- 4. When the Ceremony is over at the British Cemetery, the 16th Battalion will march back direct to the starting point and remain there until joined by the 13th Battalion.

  The 13th Battalion will proceed by track shown in sketch to old Cemeterywhere flowers will be placed on the few graves of the British Soldiers there. The Battalion will then march via OLD CHATEAU, and steps to Town Square blocking up close to the 16th Battalion.
- 5. Massed Bands will play French and British National Anthems in the Square, after which the troops will move off under direction of the Battalion Commanders.
