

REVIEW BY OFFICER COMMAND ING AUSTRALIAN HEAVY ARTILLERY TRAINING DEPOT

The work during the month has been very good, the men taking a keen interest, and all specialists chasses are doing well. The health has been very fair; a few men going to hospital with Influenza, these being chiefly amongst the latest reinforcements. The discipline is very good and practically no crime in the unit for the month, and reports received from outside sources as regards the behaviour of the men have always been very satisfactory, combined with their clean and soldierly appearance. The clothing and equipment are in good order. The quotas of Signallers which have been sent to the Signal School at R.B.A.A.Heytesbury have been very good and in one instance out of fourteen who returned on completing course eleven obtained a fst class pass, 2 a 2nd.class pass, and 1 failed to qualify. One man in particular passed out with 100% in all subjects.
