





OFFICER COMMANDING AUSTRALIAN HEAVY ARTILLERY TRAINING DEPOT. BULL POINT BKS, ST BUDEAUX, DEVONPORT, of month's work, etc.

NOVEMBER.

- 1. The work during the month has been good, and quite up to the standard of previous months.
- 2. The health of the troops has greatly improved from the previous month, practically no fresh cases of Influenza having occurred, and therefore sickness has been very slight.
- 3. Discipline for the month has been very good and quite up to the standard of previous months.
- 4. During the month 133 O.Rks.were sent overseas to France and 17 O.Rks. to No.2 Command Depot, Weymouth, for return to Australia as unfit.
- 5. The clothing and equipment is in good order.
- 6. Owing to the depleted strength of the Depot through men being sent overseas and to schools of instruction no further progress has been made in regard to the football season, and therefore the idea of playing any matches has had to be adandoned.
