BOHAIN.	14th.		Fine and frosty. The group marched at 9 a.m. and halted for an hour for the midday meal. After lunch the narrow road was continually blocked by motor transport, principally French. The column reached BOHAIN about 4.30 p.m. The town is packed with troops and the billeting very close. There are about 4,000 inhabitants here who have survived the German occupation. As far as can be ascertained we will be here for over a week.	
	15th.		Fine day after a frost. Units cleaning up their billets and mending the holes made by shells in the houses. Capt. Cornish left to take up temporary duty as D.A.A.G. at Div. Headquarters. There was a meeting of C.Os. and Unit Commanders of the Bde. Group at 2.30 p.m. Points noticed on the <del>XXXX</del> last march were brought up and uniformity of equipment generally was discussed. The Field Amb. and Engineers are to have a Drill instructor from the Brigade to assist them. Training begins to-morrow. - Bn. drill, Route Marches and general smartening up. Sketch showing <del>general</del> dispositions of Group. (Appendix)	Appendix 7.
	16th.		Fine day but cold after a very heavy frost. Bns. training. Meeting at Div. H.Q. at 11.30 a.m. to discuss various points noticed on the march and affecting future moves. It is proposed to attach the T.M.B. to Bde. Hdqrs. permanently, and to relieve the transport supplied by Bns. by dumping the tool reserve. This will set free a G.S. wagon. Italian whistling rockets were tried to-day, but I don't think they are an improvement on the means we have already at our disposal. They are used by the Italian Army as a gas alarm. The rocket is fired out of a paper tube by pulling a string. It rises about 150 feet then bursts setting <del>fire</del> free a parachute with a tube attached. The tube contains a burning composition which causes the whistle which lasts about 20 secs.	
	17th.		Black frost and very cold. Church parade for the whole group. Instructions for the advance to the Rhine received. Bde. Maj. visited VALENCIENNES, MONS, MAUBEUGE, and Le QUESNOY with Col. Neligan.	
	18th.		Frost in morning and a little snow about midday. Bns. training and bathing. Conference at Bde. H.Q. at 2 p.m. C.Os. of units in the Group attended. The problems connected with the advance into Germany were discussed - such as transport and stores to be carried.	
	19th.		Overcast but warmer. 9th., 10th., & 11th. Bns. on Route march. 12th. Bn. Battalion

	19th		parade and cleaning up streets. Information has been received from Division that "C" Bde. group will march on 23rd. to MAZINGHEIN area, and on 24th to AVESNES area. Composition of Groups has not been definitely decided yet. All maps except the 3 100,000 sheets we pass through are being returned to railhead. It is probable that we do part of the journey by train, but if by road our general direction is for DINANT on the MEUSE. The men are taking their stay here very patiently, and the discipline has never been better. Prisoners of War and repatriated civilians are streaming into the town from the East every day. - Most of them come from the South of Belgium - about CHARLEROI and PHILLIPVILLE.	
	20th		Frosty weather continues. Bns. route marching except the 12th. which is carrying out Bn. work. We are to march in two stages to CARTIGNES - further than that nothing definite is known. - It is even rumoured that we aren't going to Germany at all.	
	21st		Fine day after a frost. Bns. training. Div. order for the move of Bde group to MAZINGHEIN and thence to CARTIGNES received. Everyone is very tired of BOHAIN; after parade there is nothing to do except see one of the two concert parties or the cinema.	
	22nd		Fine with cold wind. Bns. continue training and prepare for the march to-morrow. Bde. Order No. 153 issued. (Appendix) The transport question has been solved by dumping all the mobile reserve of S.A.A. and tools at the reinforcement camp. Empty limbers of the S.A.A. Sect. D.A.C. have also been distributed to Bns. The mails at present are very irregular. G.O.C. inspected 11th. Bn. in full marching order. - The clothing and boots are unsatisfactory and the turnout generally is disappointing.	Appendix 8
MAZINGHEIN	23rd		Fine after a frost. Bde. marched to MAZINGHEIN area. - The march was carried out smoothly and no men fell out. Rations for 24th. did not arrive until late. Order for move to CARTIGNIES. (Appendix)	Appendix 9
CARTIGNIES	24th		Fine frosty weather continues. Bde. continued the march to CARTIGNIES. Roads narrow and several blocks occurred. Otherwise a good march. No men fell out. 	26th		<p>Units cleaning out billets and scrubbing the mud off themselves. The weather is foggy but no rain. G.O.C. attended a conference at Corps H.Q. about repatriation etc. No definite information has yet been put on paper. The Corps Commander to be Director General of Repatriation and General Hobbs taken command. Though the late Corps Commander has been in command for over 8 months no one in the Bde. has yet seen him. The group is likely to be here until about 4th Dec. then 3 days march to CHARLEROI area.</p>	
	27th.		<p>Cold and overcast - roads very slushy. G.O.C. left for one months leave in England. Lieut. Col. Rafferty assumed temp. command.</p>	
	28th		<p>Overcast and cold. Transport and billets inspected. We are making efforts to turn out the transport S.A.A. Section wagons well on the next march. Both are being given every assistance as regards clothing and help to clean the wagons and harness.</p>	
	29th		<p>Cold and wet. Little work being done - but the village is still being cleaned up and shows a wonderful improvement since we arrived. Capt. Bean, Commonwealth Historian left Bde. after staying a few days to collect details from Bns. of different actions.</p>	
	30th		<p>Foggy after frost, and very cold. Units carrying out parades, educational and recreational training. Bishop Frodsham one time Bishop of N. Queensland arrived to lecture on Democracy and the Empire. He is staying at Bde. H.Q. 9th. Bn. Rugby team played 1st Bde. "B" team. 9th lost 6 to 5. ## Instructions for the Move of a Division by Rail

The following instructions regarding the move of a Division or part of a Division by Rail are republished for the information of all concerned. It is essential that all Officers are fully acquainted with these instructions.

1. Strategical Trains will be used for the purpose.

A strategical train is made up of -

- 1 Officers Coach
- 30 covered trucks
- 17 flat trucks
- 2 brake vans

Each covered truck will carry -

- 40 men
- 8 L.D. horses or mules
- 6 heavy draught horses

Each flat truck will take on an average 4 axles.

No personnel or stores will be allowed in the brake vans at each end of the train nor on the roofs of the coaches.

No covered trucks will be used for luggage as this restricts the space available for personnel.

2. Infantry Transport will arrive at the Entraining Station 5 hours before the time of the departure of the train; Infantry personnel 1½ hours before time of departure of train.

Both transport and personnel of all Units will arrive at the entraining station 3 hours before the departure of the train.

3. Each Infantry Brigade will detail a working party of 2 Officers and 100 men with a cooker to report to the R.T.O. at the entraining station at least four hours before the time of departure of the first train for that Brigade Group. This working party will act as a loading party for the whole of the entraining from that station. This loading party will be commanded by an Officer not below the rank of Captain.

The O.C. or an Officer from each party will report as early as possible to the R.T.O. at the entraining station in order to obtain full information as to his duties. This Officer will also make arrangements with the Area Commandant concerned for his party to be billeted as near as possible to the entraining station. This loading party will proceed by the last train leaving the station.

A similar party will be detailed for the detraining station.

G.O's C Brigades will detail an Officer of the rank of Major or Senior Captain to represent the Bde. at the entraining and detraining station. This Officer's name should be published in the Bde. Order for the move and made known to all concerned.

4. A complete marching out state will be sent down to the R.T.O. at least 3 hours before the departure of the train, shewing the number of Officers, Other ranks, horses heavy draught or light draught, the number of 4 wheeled vehicles, 2 wheeled vehicles and bicycles in order that the accommodation on the train can be checked by the R.T.O. prior to the Unit entraining.

5. Billeting parties provided with bicycles for all Units of the Bde. Group will proceed on the first train from each station.

6. All Units will be completely entrained ½ hour prior to the departure of the train.

7. Breast ropes for horse trucks will be provided by Units. Ropes for lashing vehicles on to flat trucks are provided by the Railway authorities.

8. Pickets will be provided at all stops for each end of the train to prevent troops leaving the train without permission.

9. Lewis Guns will be provided whenever possible for each train. These guns will be mounted in suitable places on the train and used against low flying hostile aircraft which attempts to attack the train.



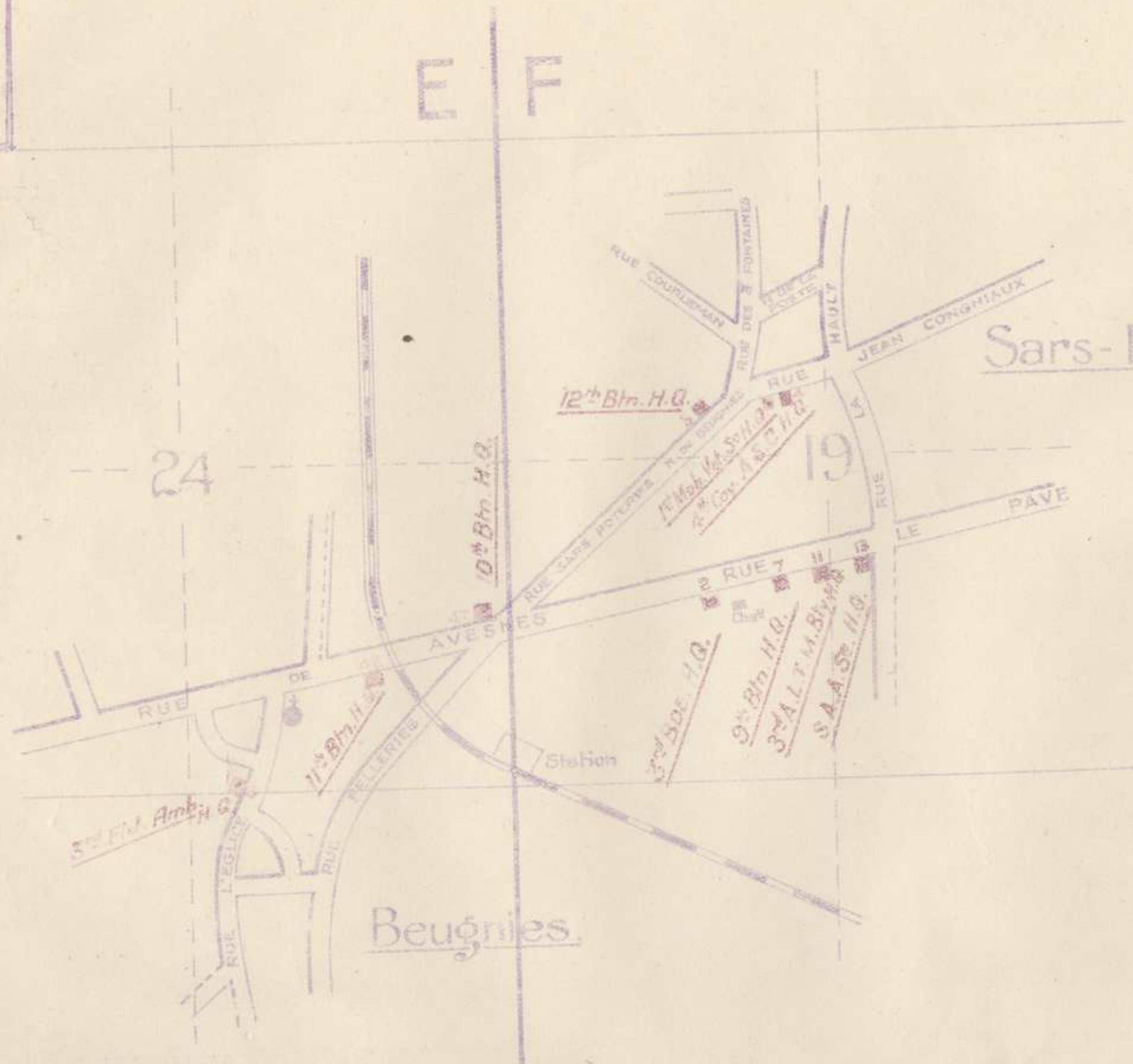

BEUGNIES	25th.		Bde. Group moved to BEUGNIES and on arrival at about 1 p.m. men are soon settled down comfortably. Troops are accommodated mostly in Glass Factories and Barns, and as a fair amount of straw is available in the village these are soon made habitable.
