

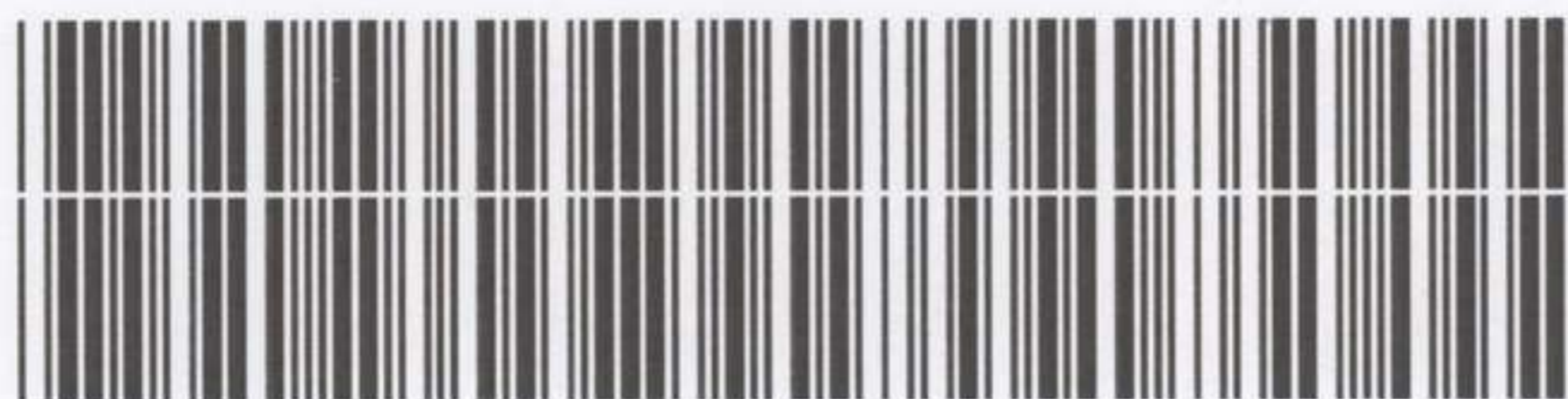

4th AUSTRALIAN PIONEER BATTALION.WAR DIARY.A/C.O's Appreciation for Month of October 1918

During the early part of the month the Battalion were camped near ROISEL and attached to Aust. Corps for works, but as the C.E. Corps Troops found that he could manage without us, we were not called upon.

The Battalion was therefore rather unsettled during this period as we did not know at what minute we might be called upon to go on works or to return to our Division. The mornings were taken up with training, and inter Company football matches were arranged for the afternoons.

On the 9th we entrained at ROISEL for AMIENS and thence by Route March to DREUIL and AILLY-sur-SOMME.

The move was one of the best that this Battalion has had; we did not entrain at ROISEL until 1000 and all the men were in their billets by 1800 the same day.

There were no parades held during the next four days, with the exception of a Church and a bathing parade.

The remainder of the Month has been spent in training, special attention being paid to the Lewis Gunners and Signallers.

The afternoons have been devoted to football, at first Inter - Company and then Inter - Battalion games. Major C.D. HORNE M.C. was responsible for the organising of the sports, and with the assistance of the Sports Committee arranged a very good programme of matches. The men have taken a keen interest in the sports.

6 Educational Classes were organised by Lieut HIRST and taken over later on by Corporal MEEK. The men are very interested in these classes; though as yet we have only been able to teach elementary branches of the subjects.

The Y.M.C.A. as usual have done everything in their power to interest and amuse the men, and arranged for some very instructive lectures.

There is one matter that is certainly worthy of note, and that is the absence of crime in the Unit. During the period that we have been in billets, there has not been a single case of A.W.L. and apart from overstaying leave in England, there has only been one man up for Orderly Room.

The Divisional Guard was supplied by the Unit for the first time in its history, and the G.O.C expressed himself very satisfied with same.

Two of the 1914 Officers have left to proceed to Australia during the month, namely.- Lieut/Colonel RUTLEDGE and Lieut HORNE.

4th AUSTRALIAN PIONEER BATTALION.WAR DIARY.SPORTS Appreciation.

Since the 14th October 1918 Recreational Training has been carried out every available afternoon in conjunction with the general training of the Battalion.

Games consisted of Inter - Company competitive matches of Australian Rules football, Rugby and Soccer, also a Cross Country Run of 2 Miles.

The premier Company to date is 'A' Coy. Taking a win as 2 points, a draw as 1 point each and a bye as 2 points, 'A' Coy (including one bye) has 8 points 'C' Coy 4 'D' Coy 4, 'B' Coy 2.

'A' Coy has to its credit also the Cross Country Run. H.Q. cannot be included in the competition by reason of its difficulty in raising teams.

From the Inter - Company matches it was possible to select Battalion teams for each class of football. The Rugby and Soccer are both strong combinations, but it is hardly so with the Australian Team, by reason of the Battalion being maintained with Queensland blood. Rugby should therefore be treated with priority, and rank as the Regiment premier sport.

Of the Inter - Unit matches played the first Rugby fifteen has had two wins and one defeat. The second Rugby fifteen one defeat. The Australian rules 18 has had 4 defeats. The Soccer eleven one win and one defeat.

The Cross Country run developed considerable interest. The most pleasing feature being the large percentage of Officers running, also the teams consisted of men usually onlookers at football.

In the Divisional Boxing Tournament the Battalion was represented in four of the classes but owing to the lack of training nothing could be expected of the men. In future if the Battalion nominates men for boxing, those men should be all billeted together, exempted from all duties and parades, and if possible treated with extras on the Army menu card. Reasons for same are obvious.

Of the interest displayed in sport throughout the Battalion quite a lot can be said. Generally speaking in the Ranks it is good, when it is lacking it can in most cases be attributed to the officers. Apart from the Sports Officers and the few others who have given a lot of time up to sport; of the others it may be said that were it not for the sports of an afternoon being a parade, they could not tell you where the sports ground is situated.

It seems such a pity, because when where and whatever an officer takes a lead in, his men will follow suit.

Two very noticeable features of visiting teams recently was the number of Officers that rode bicycles five to six kilometres to see and barrack for their Battalion Teams. It was so of another small Unit that every officer was present with a large number of men armed with Megaphones, and even yelling through a Megaphone is exercise, and it is exercise we want.

The above spirit is lacking among a large number of the Officers of this Battalion, and it is very noticeable to outside Units, and more so to your own men in your own Platoon.

SUPPLIES. These have been good throughout the month. The reduction in scale is now in force but whilst the Battalion has been in billets and the men have been able to purchase feeds its effect has not yet been noticed.

D.A.D.O.S. Portion of the winter issue of clothes have been made, otherwise the drawings have been normal.

COMFORTS. These have been received in increasing quantities and the foodstuffs have been a welcome addition to the rations, and over 1 pair of socks per man have also been received in addition to other clothing.

BOOTMAKERS. Have been kept steadily occupied.

TAILOR. Still has more work than one man can possibly cope with.

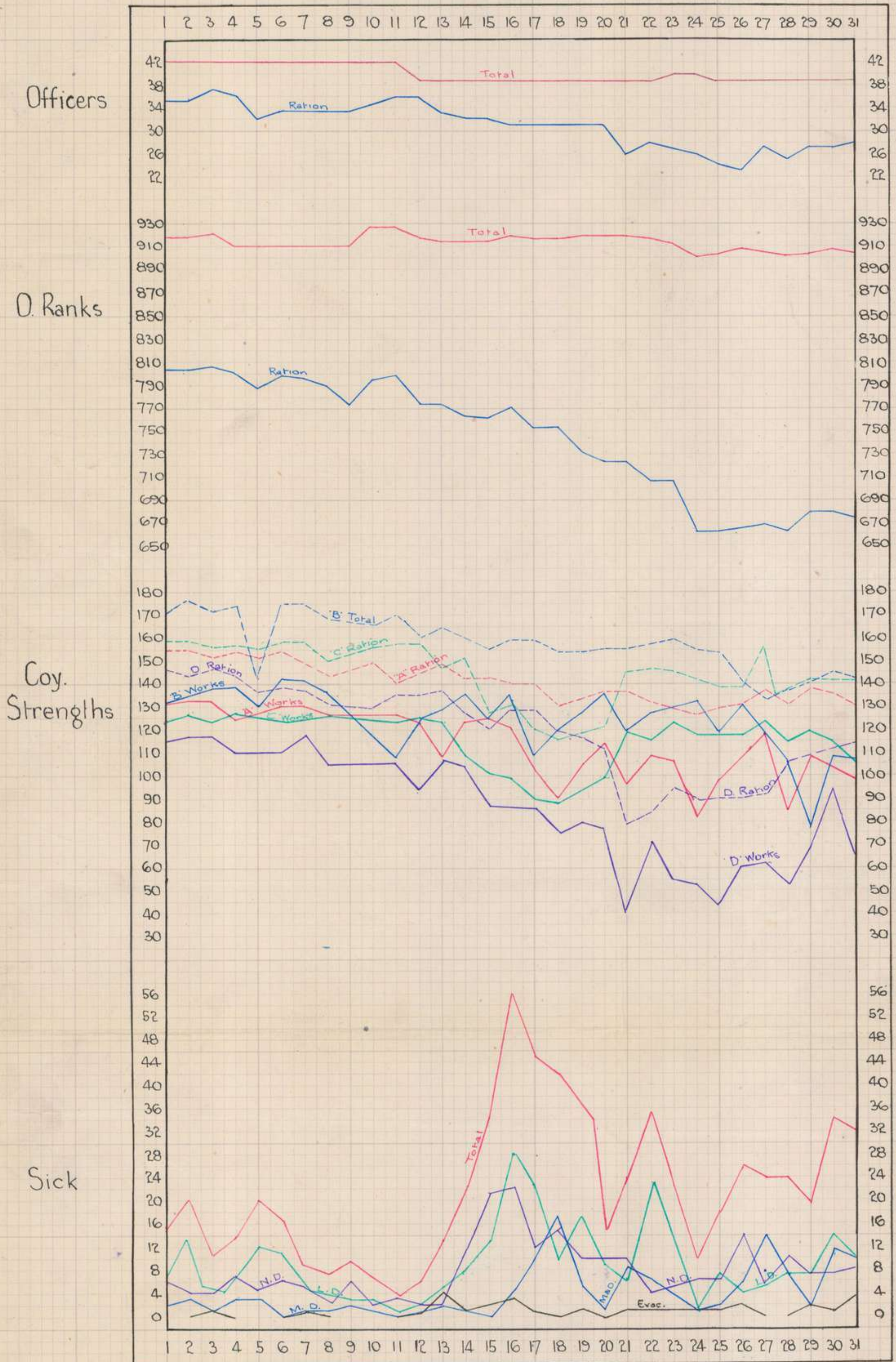
