There will be 3 stages in the operation, each stage forming one objective. These stages are shown on the attached map:-

The first stage on objective in RED The second "BLUE GREEN

The objectives of flank brigades are also shown.

(a) The RED objective runs through point J.8.b.8.7. along the eastern edge of HANEBEKE Wood to point J.2.b.20.15.

(b) The BLUE objective includes the capture of IRON CROSS REDOUBT and runs on line eastwards of IRON CROSS REDOUBT to points J. 3. c. 5.5. and J. 3. c. 40.85. - East side of ANZAC - point J. 3. a. 10.75.

(c) The GREEN objective is on the line J.3.d.O.6. J.3.a.75.20. - J.3.a.5.5. - J.3.a.2.8.

Troops will consolidate on the GREEN line under
cover of the barrage. Subsequently the barrage
will be moved forward, when outposts will be
established.

3. Enemy's Defensive System:

objectives consist chiefly of a tached shell holes positions, concrete positions, old gun pit positions, and defended buildings.

at IRON CROSS REDOUBT, and the trenches about J.2.b.8.4. may be expected to be held. Counter attacks must be expected to come during the day from the east through the wood in J.3.d. and along the north edge of the POLYGONEVELD.

During the night or a fog, counter-attacks may be

expected anywhere along the Brigade front.

4. Action:

(a) The 5th Aust. Inf. Bde. will attack on a 1-Battalion frontage, with 4 companies represented in the front line, extended in depth.

(d) System of Attack:

The 20th and 19th Battalions will be drawn up on forward slopes east of WESTHOEK RIDGE, the 17th Battalion west of BELLEWAF DE RIDGE, in the following formation:-

Distances between waves will lengthen out to 70 yards as soon as barrage permits.



Special arrangements will be made in each Company to ensure correct direction. The magnetic bearing will be taken for each company, and special officers will be detailed to check direction. The night previous to the attack, direction officers will visit WESTHOEK RIDGE for the purpose of picking up landmarks, stars, etc., which will assist in the advance.

Principles to bear in Mind:

The troops are to be reminded -(1) to keep as close as they can to the artillery barrage.

(2) to rush each post occupied by the enemy, immediately it is discovered, and envelop it.

(3) to keep their rifles clean, and fire on every favorable target.

(4) always to be prepared for counter attacks. (5) enemy aeroplanes will probably endeavour to harpass the front line, which they are

are consolidating. The front line will continue to consolidate, and the hostile planes will be engaged by every possible rifle and Machine gun in the support line.

(m) Monpers-up:

Each battalion sector will be divided up into 4 company sectors. Company mopping-up parties will clear these areas thoroughly. Special parties will be told off to deal with known enemy positions.

After morping up, the morping up parties will

become supports to their companies.

Touch between Brigades: Between the 7th and the 5th Aust. Inf. Bdes. special parties will be detailed on the RED line by 20th Battulion to establish connection at J.8.b.4.9. (bend in the road): on the BLUE line by the 18th Battalion, road east of IRON CROSS REDOUBT at point J. 3. c. 4. 4.: on the GREEN line by 17th Battalion at point J. 3. c. 85.55. north end of JACOBUS TRENCH!

Between the 27th Inf. Bde. and 5th Aust. Inf. Bde -The 27th Inf. Bde. anticipate possible trouble in passing through HANEBEKE WOOD. They will probably use smoke. All ranks must understand that this is not to be mistaken for thesmoke barrage put down by our artillery. (see para 6). The 20th Battalion must be prepared, if the 27th Inf. Bde. is held up, and they can cross through the wood or South east of it, to contain the wood and engage the enemy from the rear. The 27th Inf. Bde. may find it necessary to come into our area, to pass through the wood. Similarly some of the 20th Battalion may find it necessary to go into the area of the 27th Inf. Bde. to get through the wood.

Special instructions will be issued by the C.O. 20th Battalion to ensure that connection is made with the

27th Inf. Ede. on the RED line.

on the BLUE line, when ANZAC has been captured, the 18th Battalion must be prepared to assist in the capture of ZONNEBEKE REDOUBT, if such steps are necessary. (o) Machine Guns:

The O.C. 5th Aust. M.G. Company will detail 1 Section to accompany each attacking Battalion. The remainder will be held in reserve on WESTHOEK RINGE in the vicinity of Brigade H.Q. Their positions will be reported to Brigade H.Q. Special distribution is as follows :-

A short field of fire to the front will suffice, provided the facilities for flanking fire are good.

Battle Order. Waterproof sheets will be carried rolled up on the back. Each man will carry 220 rounds of S.A.A., 3 Rifle Grenades and 4 sandbags. Each mopper-up will carry a tool in addition in the proportion of 3 shovels to one pick.

6. Artillery Barrage:

The artillery co-operation will include a number of separate artillery barrages by field and heavy artillery. They will be arranged to include -

A creeping barrage by field artillery, which the infantry will follow closely. Artillery Barrage Map is attached.

(b) A creeping barrage, beyong the field artillery barrage, by heavy artillery which will not only creep forward but, during the pauses at each objective will jump back and creep forward a second time.

(c) Certain standing barrages on known hostile concen-

(d) In addition, c unter-battery work will be cartied out vigourously as long as the enemy's artillery is firing on our infantry.

Regarding (a) (i) The field artillery barrage will be put down 150 yards in front of the infantry jumping-off line at zero. The assaulting battalions for the Red objectives will at once move up close under it.

(ii) At Zero plus 3 minutes the barrage will commence to creep - the first 200 yards at a rate of 100 yards in four minutes, then at the rate of 100 yards in 6 minutes up to the protective barrage line 200 yards in front of the Red objective; here it will halt for 45 minutes.

(iii) It will then advance to the protective barrage line in front of the Blue objective at a rate of 100 yards in 8 minutes and will halt on this line for 2 hours.

(iv) Finally it will advance to the protective barrage line 200 yards beyond the Green objective at a rate of 100 yards in 8 minutes.

(v) The protective barrages on the Red, Blue and Green objectives will contain for the first minutes a proportion of smoke to indicate to the troops that the several objectives have been reached.

7. Patrolling:

It is essential that active patrolling be carried out each night before the attack day, to debar the enemy from moving near our advanced posts and to cover reconnaissances of that area in connection with the selection of the best jumping-off lines.

(b) Following the attack, and moving with it, the Brigade Signal Section will establish a forward Brigade Station in a position and as close as possible behind the newly captured position.

(c) After the capture of the 1st objective this Bde. Forward Station will be astablished in dugouts or shelters at about J. 2. d. 2. 2. and will be fix-d here until ZERO plus 3 hours,

when it will move to J.2.b.95.35.

(d) The Bde. Forward Station will be in touch with Brigade Advanced Readquarters at J.7.b.65.95. by Power Buzzer, Cable, Visual and Eunners. U.J.d. 65.10.

- (e) The function of a Bde. Forward Station is to collect and distribute information and messages from front and rear, and uses one central route for passing this traffic backwards and forwards. The route to be followed will be through relay posts at J.8.a.25.90. - J.2.d.2.2. and J.2.d.65.70. Messages will be accepted at any of these relay posts and passed back by runners.
- Battalions Forward Command Posts will be established on 3. similar lines to Bde. Forward Station, at points chosen by Bn. Commanders.

Bn. Forward Command Posts are collecting moints for information from Companies and front line units. Their position will be made known to all Company and Platoon Commanders, Runners and Signallers.

- 4. Officer in charge of Bn. Forward Command Fost is responsible for the laying and maintenance of a line to Bde. Forward Station. He will also have a power buzzer which will work normally to Bde. Forward Station, but under extreme circumstances, to Advanced Bde. H.C.
- A central Bde. Visual Station at J.7.b.7.9. will accept 5. messages from any point in the Bde. Forward Area. All messages from forward will be DD DD.
- Pigeons will be supplied to 2nd and 3rd attacking 6. battalions - 8 to each. Birds will not be used except in cases of extreme necessity.
- 7. Power Buzzers, if available, will be issued to each attacking battalion. Messages sent by rower Buzzer can be picked up by the enemy, and therefore up to zero, must be sent in code or cypher. After Zero hour, it is desirable that all messages shall be sent in code, but the tactical situation or urgency of the message will decide whether cypher, code, or olear, is to be used.

Appendix No. 2

Power Buzzers with Battalions should send only when the station is out of touch by all other means, and then for short and very important messages only.

For a considerable time after the attack, it will not be possible to maintain more than 2 lines across NO MAN's LAND -1 for artillery and 1 for infantry. In consequence -

(a) all messages must be curtailed.

(b) telephone conversation except in cases of extreme urgency or importance, is forbidden.

Attention is drawn to the fact that telephone calls take time to get through and always tend to become protracted. The line therefore, is blocked, and prectudes perhaps the sending of 3 or more important messages.

Information from captured documents shows that conversation on the telephone in connection with fatigue parties, stores, etc, has given the enemy reliable information of our intended movements. All such messages should be sent by telegraph and rullerphone, or by runner.

Unless an acknowledgment can be obtained, all messages

should be sent by alternative means.

Fullerphones will be used on all lines with D III superimposed

REPORT ON OPERATIONS FROM 19th/20th Septr - 21st/22nd Septr.

GENERAL:

VALLEY and the POLYGON WOOD - ANZAC HOUSE ridge. There were three objectives. One Bn. was allotted to each objective, with the remaining battalion held in reserve.

Each objective was attacked on a four-company

front, extended in depth.

In the formation adopted provision was made for support, moppers-up and carrying parties which formed an integral part of each company.

PRELIMINARY PREPARATIONS

2. In addition to the various memoranda, maps and aeroplane photographs issued, a practice attack was made over ground in the vicinity of CLAIRMARIAS FORET previously prepared with representations of significant artificated features with which the attackers were likely to come in contact.

When the Brigade moved into the forward area facilities were available for parties to visit the front line and see the ground over which they were to attack.

The Model Trenches at BUSSEBOOM, which each battalions' Officers and N.C.O's. were aboute to visit, proved of incalcuble value in producing confidence and as accurate a knowledge of conditions and natural features as could be produced.

MACHINE GUNS.

3. All the guns of the 5th.A.M.G.Coy., were mobile. One Section was allotted to each attacking Battalion. Positions were previously selected for them and definite work allotted.

5 guns in all were put out of action during the operations, 2 whilst moving forward, and 2 in the Div. Strong Points. These were, however, soon replaced. After the Green Line had been captured and consolidated, the machine guns moved forward and at one time there were 12 in the area between the Green and Blue lines. 4 were, however, withdrawn and held in reserve.

There were few opportunities of engaging enemy

targets. The barrage supplied by the groups and batteries was excellent and if considerable utility in preventing the development of enemy counter-attacks.

STOKES MORTARS.

4. Patrols were sent out on night of 19th/20th inst. and reported that the area in front of the jumping-off line up to the road running S.E. and N.W. through J.S.a. and J.2.c. was clear, but that the enemty still occupied a post at approximately J.2.c.65.30.

Two mortars were ordered to engage this position with rapid fire at Zero, for one minute. Afterwards, on inspection, this position was found to be full of dead Bothes.

4. (continued)

Stokes Mortars were not used during the operation, although to provide against any contingency, 2 mortars were allotted to each attacking battalion.

on reaching the final objective, the O.C. 5th A.L.T.M.Battery was instructed to take up a position in the vicinity of IRON CROSS REDOUBT.

ARTILLERY.

The barrage afforded by the artillery was excellent, and the testimony of prisoners bears evidence of its disastrous and annihilating effects. The calls for counter-battery and barrage fire were immediately answered.

The attacking troops are loud in their praises of the work done by the gunners.

RABBIT

6. The practice in spapshooting proved most valuable SHOOTING & in enabling men to take advantage of fleeting enemy HIP FIRING. targets, that otherwise might have gone free.

Hip firing was used by the 18th Battalion during its advance to the BLUE line with great effect. On the move the "two men" method was adopted (one directing the gun, the second pressing the trigger). The results were good. Enemy party of 8 was killed with one burst at about 250 yards.

SIGNAL COMMUNI CA-TIONS.

Communications were based on the principles laid down in S.S. 148. The Bde. Forward Party assembled with 20th Battalion on the jumping-off line and laid the first section of cable to Relay Post No. 1 at J.8.a. 35.85. Moving in 4 sections, the Bde. Forward Party advanced with the moppers-up, making direct for No. 2 relay post at J.2.d.2.2. At 6.55 a.m. a line was through to Advanced Bde. H.Q. and at 7 a.m. the first message reporting the capture and consolidation of the 1st objective, went through. About 8.30 a.m. a detachment moved to No. 3 Relay Post at J.2.d.9.7. and immediately established visual communication with Advanced Bde. H.Q. By 9 a.m. one pair of cable was through to Bde. Forward Station.

From 10.15 a.m. until relief by the 6th A.I.Bde. telephone communication along this route was good. At 8.45 a.m. signallers from 20th Battalion established a station with the Brigade Forward Station, in direct communication with the C.O. 20th Battalion, on

WESTHOEK RIDGE. At about 9.30 a.m. 18th Bn signallers arrived at Bde. Forward Station and established a station in the

vicinity. Afterwards when the 18th Bn moved to ANZAC a line was laid to them there, and communication established

with the 17th Bat talion through the 18th Bat talion. The Power Buzzer was damaged in the initial stages of the attack. It was replaced in the afternoon but the fact that the earth leads were too short, and the condition of the accumulators rendered it unserviceable.

Visual was fairly good throughout. Runner relays were found to be most useful. The relay system also proved of value in the maintenance of telephone lines.

DISPOSITIONS THE ATTACK.

On the night 18th/19th inst. the 19th Bn relieved PREVIOUS TO the 22nd Bn in the front line, left sector, At 6.30 a.m. 19th inst. Advanced Bde. H.Q. opened at J.1.d.65.10.

During the afternoon of 19th inst. small parties of 20th Bn were dribbled up to the assembly position on BELLEWARDE RIDGE from which they moved to the west slope of WESTHOEK RIDGE under cover of darkness at 10 pm. 8. (continued)

The 18th Bn moved by overland track N. of YPRES - MENIN Road to BELLEWARDE RIDGE, being in position there by 10.45 p.m. As soon as the 20th Bn moved forward on to the tape, the 18th Bn advanced to the position on the west slope of WESTHOEK RIDGE, until the guides reported to lead it into position on the tape.

The 17th Bn reported in position on BELLEWARDE RIDGE at 3.25 a.m. on 20th inst. and moved later to the attack in accordance with order.

The 19th Bn remained as garrison of the old front line.

All battalion Headquarters were established on WESTHOEK RIDGE.

NARRATIVE

At 11 p.m. Captain STEELE, 5th Field Coy. A.E. OF OPERATIONS. reported that the tapes were satisfactorily laid. At 11.50 p.m. on 19th inst. the 20th Bn guides and markers left for jumping-off line. At 12.5 a.m. on 20th instant instructions were sent to 20th Bn to move forward to tapes as soon as the guides reported back.

> At 3.30 a.m. report received that the 17th Bn had arrived at BELLEWARDE RIDGE. At 4.40 a.m. 20th Bn

reported in position.

At 5.5 a.m. 18th Bn reported in position. At 5.35 a.m. just before the barrage opened, the enemy was observed to open fire on 7th Bde sector, and at 5.37 a.m. he commenced shelling our front line.

At 5.40 a.m. our barrage came down. The enemy barrage now closed down heavily on WESTHOEK RIDGE, but only lightly on the forward slopes. By 6.5 a.m. enemy barrage had died very noticeably and his light guns

operated spasmodically.

At 6.11 a.m. a single set of RED flares was seen to go up, showing that the 1st objective had been reached, and 4 minutes later RED ground flares were seen beyond the line of the 1st objective. The Companies were now seen forward of the first objective rapidly digging in, while our barrage had halted on the crest of the ridge above.

At 6.19 a.m. the enemy barrage thickened and settled on the crest and forward slope of WESTHOEK RIDGE. The first batch of prisoners arrived at 6.23 a.m. The enemy now began to send up pairs of WHITE flares and at 6.44 a.m. sent up WHITE bouquets on our direct front and left flank. 3 minutes later his barrage on the WESTHOEK RIDGE ceased. At 6.54 a.m. more WHITE bouquets were sent up by the enemy, and 4 minutes later his barrage re-commenced lightly, lower down the forward slope of WESTHOEK RIDGE. News received now stated that the 20th Bn had had slight casualties and was digging in forward of their objective. The shelling of the forward slope and HANEBEKE WOOD increased. The enemy's barrage dropped to intermittent shelling at 7.5 a.m. and became erratic.

By 7.24 a.m. our barrage had moved over the ANZAC RIDGE and the 18th Bn were seen moving over the Ridge in good formation. A runner brought word that the 1st objective had been taken and that consolidation was

in progress.

At 7.30 a.m. extensive movement was reported on the BLUE line crest. Orders were issued for the 17th Bn to move forward. At 7.41 a.m. 3 WHITE flares from ANZAC were reported. The 18th Bn encountered little opposition, except at J.2.b.8.2. in advancing to the BLUE line, the small groups here and there being mopped up before they could offer any resistance.

At J. 2.b.8.2. thirty-six prisoners and 2 Machine guns, were taken a TelefuAkeANZAC & 15cm howitzer, 2 machine

also a dog carrying a message: - "Retake shell hole line, artillery fire to be regulated by light signals".

As the barrage moved forward an R.A.P. pill-box in the vicinity of garter point was captured, and 15 more prisoners. During the advance a machine guns from DRAUGHT HOUSE (D.27.c.) caused casualties but was knocked out by our barrage.

The concrete pill-box was badly smashed, the trenches obliterated, and only a few traces of wire were found. ANZAC was found to contain two rooms and an observation tower on top. A small Australian flag was placed on ANZAC and remained there until destroyed by enemy shell fire on the 21st inst. No difficulty was experienced in keeping touch with the flanks.

At 7.50 a.m. hostile barrage on HANEBEKE VALLEY increased. 17th Bn were seen advancing over BELLEWARDE RIDGE in artibary formation. The advance of this battalion was one of the noteworthy features of the operation.

the BLUE LINE were observed.

At 8 a.m. 19th Bn platoon at CHINA WALL, formingg garrison of battalion strong point, instructed to move forward.

At 8.32 a.m. 18th Bn reported line J. 3. a. 3.5. - J. 2. b. 95.00. Peached.

At 8.40 a.m. observers reported that consolidation was proceeding on the 1st and 2nd objectives and that 17th En were nearing BLUE line. The Battalion had crossed the WESTHOEK ridge at 8. a.m. in good order and moved steadily down and across the HANEBEKE CREEK where it met with a few casualties from enemy artillery; but the advance was not checked and soon the leading waves had passed the 20th Battalion, who were consolidating the 1st objective, and found the 18th Bn in advance of the BLUE line. As soon as the barrage permitted, the 17th Bn passed through the 18th Bn. and commenced consolidating the green line. No opposition was met with, the barrage having killed or driven back any of the enemy previously on that position. 17th Bn. Advanced H.Q. were established; at J. 3. c. 75.95. approximately. About 9 a.m. the enemy shell fire had shortened range and was falling heavily on the consolidating line. His planes came over and fired on our troops, but only a few casualties resulted. The 18th Bn Lewis Guns in rear did good work and soon succeeded in driving them off.

At 9 a.m. it was reported that the 18th Bn was in

touch with the 7th Bde at J. 3. c. 4.5.

At 9.5 a.m. 17th Bn right company reported that GREEN line had been reached, consolidation in progress, and in touch with flank companies.

At 9.10 a.m. 17th Bn right centre company reported _ "Consolidating on line J. 3. a. 8. 3. - J. 3. a. 7. 5. ".

"In touch with 6th K.O.S.B's and "C" Company (left sector company)".

By 12.30 p.m. the GREEN line was consolidated on the line J.3.c.8.6. - J.3.a.55.55. - J.3.a. RXXXX 0.5.

It was found that the 18th Bn had at some points established themselves on the GREEN line. To prevent unnecessary congestion and to allow for reorganization instructions were sent to 17th and 18th Battalions at 1.45 p.m. that the front line was to be held in two sectors, 17th Bn Left, 18th Bn Right, and that the readjustment was to take place under cover of darkness.

9. (continued)

The battalions were to be extended in depth on the GREEN and BLUE lines. By this time 18th Bn H.Q. were established at ANZAC and 17th Bn in pill-box at J.3.a.35.35.

At 1.30 p.m. information was received that the Divisional strong posts were being constructed at J. 3. a. 0.4. and J. 3. c. 3.6. Message was sent to 5th A.M.G. Coy. at 2 p.m. to place a Vickers M.G. in each strong post.

At 2.25 p.m. observers reported that enemy were collecting for a counter-attack in the vicinity of the BUTTE in POLYGONEVELD. They were, however, dispersed by our artillery.

Much movement was observed during the afternoon

about HELLES, I.13.b.

At 5.45 p.m. 20th Bn were instructed to take up a line along the road munning N.W. and S.E. through in J.2.b. and d.

About 6 p.m. enemy infantry was seen moving in the vicinity of I.10.a.7.8. and 9 enemy planes came over our lines. S.O.S. signals were sent up on our right flank. The enemy were caught under our barrage and dispersed. The hostile barrage opened about 6 p.m., grew intense, and lasted till 6.30 p.m. About 6.45 p.m. it again became heavy and an unconfirmed report stated that enemy were heavily counter-attacking on right of 2nd Aust. Division. The 19th/Bns we-re ordered to hold themselves in readiness

and 20th to form defensive flank.

At 7.25, 7.47 and 7.57 p.m. S.O.S. signals were seen on the right of our Bde. sector. The enemy shell fire slackened at 8.15 p.m. and by 8.23 p.m. had practically ceased. The Divisional strong points had been blown out by enemy barrage, but not many other casualties were suffered.

The night passed quietly. Our artillery opened heavy fire at 4.30 a.m. on 21st instant, but the enemy retaliation was feeble.

The enemy had large stretcher-bearing parties out on the afternoon of 20th and morning of 21st. His casualties were apparently serious. It is difficult to estimate the number of enemy dead in the Brigade sector, which must however, have amounted to nearly three hundred.

The division of the GREEN and BLUE lines arranged between the 17th and 18th Battalions was carried into effect, and the battalions gradually drawn to their own sector - 18th Bn on right of I.3.a.7.2. and 17th Bn on the left.

The front line was connected throughout and

support line dug on the BLUE line.

on the afternoon of 21st about 6.30 p.m. the enemy opened a methodical bombardment of ANZAC, GARTER POINT, and the front line area.

S.O.S. signals were sent up on the right and left of the Brigade Sector. The shell fire slackened and had practically ceased by 8.7 p.m.

The 5th A.I.Bde. was relieved in the left sector by the 6th A.I.Bde. on the night 21st/22nd. Relief was completed by 2.15 a.m.

FOR IMPROVE-

10. The only alterations suggested are that -

(1) Instead of leaving a mopping-up platoon and a carrying platoon for each company, there should be one Company detailed wholly for mopping-up and one for carrying. This gives more centralization of command and control.

(2) one screen of ground scouts with remainder

of troops in section column.


