The month of February opened with Engineer Headquarters at SCHERPENBERG; 4th Field Coy at BRASSERIE Camp; 12th Field Coy (less 1 section) in LARCHWOOD TUNNELS; and 13th Field Coy at SPOIL BANK TUNNELS, carrying on the policy of the Division; - viz., 4th Field Coy with 50 Infantry attached, and working parties of up to 700 Infantry, employed on Second Zone (Corps Line); 12th Field Coy working with left Brigade on left Divisional sector; 13th Field Coy working with right Brigade on right Divisional sector.

Appendix No. I (map) on comparison with Appendix No. II submitted with January War Diary, will show the progress; whilst the War Diaries of the Field Companies will give daily detail of the work.

The policy of work is to push on the tramway communications in order to lessen the long distances now necessary to carry material of all kinds to the forward positions.

With the same object in view tracks are being laid from the front line to each Group.

When the tramways are completed, mule tracks will be constructed as alternative routes in case the tramlines are badly cut at any time.

All the communication trenches have been deepened in parts, and the intention is to deepen them throughout to give cover from view and shell fire.

Each post in the outpost line is being wired for all round defence. When these are completed each Group will also be wired for all round defence. ~~Wire~~ Wire will be constructed between adjacent Groups. The wire system of the groups will then be connected with the wire system of the front line in order that the front line may be covered by a mass of wire obstacles.

The Reserve Line will also be well wired to a depth of about 100 to 150 yards. The Wire system of the Reserve Line will also be connected with that of the strong points, which are close to it. Eventually all the communication trenches East of the Reserve Line will also be wired.

The trench systems are necessarily somewhat disconnected owing to the nature of the ground. Eventually it will consist of three separate groups, i.e. HOLLEBEKE, KLEIN ZILLEBEKE and SHREWSBURY FOREST.

It is intended to connect up the two latter systems if possible by utilizing the old German trench through JUMPER WOOD, and IMAGE AVENUE also forms a connection. Owing to the Canal it will be difficult to connect the two former. Each system is covered by the Groups or Outpost lines to the East.

The Front line will be duckboarded and revetted with 'A' frames throughout, but only selected portions will be prepared as fire positions.

SCHERPENBERG			<p>It is intended to erect shelters in the front line to give the garrison shrapnel proof cover and protection from the weather.</p> <p>The SHREWSBURY FOREST System will be provided with a Support Line. The Front line of this system will be on the forward slope to obtain observation, and the Support Line will be just in rear of the crest and can be utilised as the main fighting line. There are a number of old German concrete dugouts immediately in rear of the Support Line which are at present used for the garrison.</p> <p>The Reserve Line is a continuous duckboarded trench revetted with 'A' frames. This trench also will be prepared as a fire trench at certain places. It is now being provided with splinter proof shelters for the garrison.</p> <p>A Reserve Line South of Canal has not been closely reconnoitred, but the present site is an old trench which runs through the Western part of Square 0.5.c. This will be put in hand when more pressing work is completed.</p> <p>It is intended to join up the Front Line about JUMPER WOOD with the Reserve Line along the Northern slope of KLEIN ZILLEBEKE Spur. This trench could be utilised as a fire trench in the event of the enemy capturing the SHREWSBURY FOREST SPUR.</p> <p>The Front and Support Line of the SHREWSBURY FOREST system will be joined by a trench through JULES FARM and another about the CUTTING.</p> <p>SOUTH OF CANAL.</p> <p>(a) One in OAK SUPPORT covering the Southern face of HOLLEBEKE Spur and the ROOZEBECK Valley, and</p> <p>(b) the other on the North side of "DOG LEG" Wood, made by opening up some old German trenches, which covers the Northern slope of HOLLEBEKE Spur and the ground East of the Railway embankment.</p> <p>NORTH OF CANAL.</p> <p>(a) A small post in OLAF AVENUE to fire down the Canal and Railway bank as this ground is dead to the slopes on the North and South.</p> <p>(b) The Southern extremity of the Reserve Line.</p> <p>(c) A portion of old German trench which has a certain number of German concrete shelters. This post is on the KLEIN ZILLEBEKE Spur about half-way between THE CLUSTERS and the Reserve Line.</p> <p>(d) Part of an old German trench just in front of the Reserve Line in IMAGE WOOD on the CORNER HOUSE - GRAVEYARD COT Road.</p> <p>(e) A post in IMAGE AVENUE, by two tall trees. From this post almost the whole valley is overlooked as far as JUMPER WOOD.</p>	<p><i>ADJT</i></p> <p>4TH AUS. DIV. ENGRS.</p>

SCHERPENBERG			<p>(f) In the Support Line South of IMAGE AVENUE, and (g) another North of the Avenue about 200 yards South of LOWER STAR POST. It may be found necessary to construct another post just North of STAR POST, even though outside the Divisional area, in order to deny a view into the SHREWSBURY FOREST Valley.</p> <p>The supply of R.E. material through ordinary channels has been very short, chiefly in regard to corrugated iron, for which there was a heavy demand for revetting the lower portions of all trenches owing to the wet nature of the ground; the timber supply was so short that the Corps Commander issued orders that it was to be used for most urgent work only. This shortage affected practically all revetting material, 'A' frames, expanded metal panels, hurdles, duckboards, and forest pickets, and until the latter part of February the supply could not cope with the demand. Nevertheless, owing to excellent work done by salvage parties working under the direction of Major HANCOX, the progress of work in the line was not hindered. Appendix No. III shows material actually taken into stock from salvage, and in addition, to this large quantities of material were taken direct to forward works. Average number of flat Decauville push-trucks carrying R.E. Material forward was 350 per week.</p> <p>Major S.H. HANCOX had the misfortune to be thrown from his horse, receiving severe injuries to his head necessitating 10 days stay in hospital. He was transferred from Div. Engineers and appointed temporarily to the command of Australian Railway Companies, - 24/2/18 Appendix V.</p> <p>Major C.C. RIDDELL, D.S.O., O.C. 12th Field Company, returned from England, (where he was temporarily commanding Engineer Training Depot, U.K.) and resumed Regimental Duty. During his absence Capt. E.P. NORMAN, M.C., carried out duties of O.C. unit satisfactorily.</p> <p>Captain (now Major) C.R. MERRILLEES appointed as M.O. 4th Aust. Div. Engineers.</p> <p>During the tour of the 4th Division in the line 600 notice boards have been made and painted at ELZENWALLE Dump, two signwriters being constantly employed.</p> <p>Instructions received from Chief Engineer, Aust. Corps (Appendix No. VI) reference relief by 1st Aust. Div. on night 1/2nd March. Preliminary arrangements were made early, forward parties from 1st Aust. Div. being sent ahead on 24th, so as to be thoroughly in touch with the work at the actual handing over.</p>





Issued under Australian Corps Order No. 18 of 22/2/1918.

1. In consequence of the relief of the 4th. Aust. Divn. by the 1st. Aust. Division the Engineer & Pioneer reliefs will take place as detailed on attached table.
2. The reliefs will be arranged direct between the CRE's and C.O's. concerned and will be completed by MIDNIGHT March 1st-2nd.
3. Every effort must be made to ensure that the loss of work during the reliefs is reduced to a minimum.
Advance Parties including Officers and O.R. must be detailed to report to Units not later than 25th. February.
4. The Two 1st. Division Field Coys. under CRE - CT can be maintained as skeleton Coys. until relieved by the 4th. Aust. Division.
5. On completion of relief:
 - (a) The Three 1st. Division Field Coys. and 2½ Coys. 1st. Pioneers will be available for 1st. Divisional work.
 - (b) Two Coys. 4th. Pioneers will remain under orders of 4th. Aust. Division and will be available for training & rest.
6. Rear Zone Defences.
 - (a) CRE 4th. Aust. Division will take over from CRE 1st. Aust. Divn. all responsibility for the maintenance and repairs of the Rear Zone Defences in the Aust. Corps Area. All papers and drawings in connection with these defences will be handed over on completion of relief.
 - (b) The Wardens at present detailed from the 1st. Division will remain on this work and will come under the orders of the CRE 4th. Aust. Division.
7. The Infantry Party (Strength 110 Officers and O.Rs.) detailed from 4th. Aust. Division for employment with 184 Tunnelling Coy RE on C.H.A. dugouts will not be relieved.

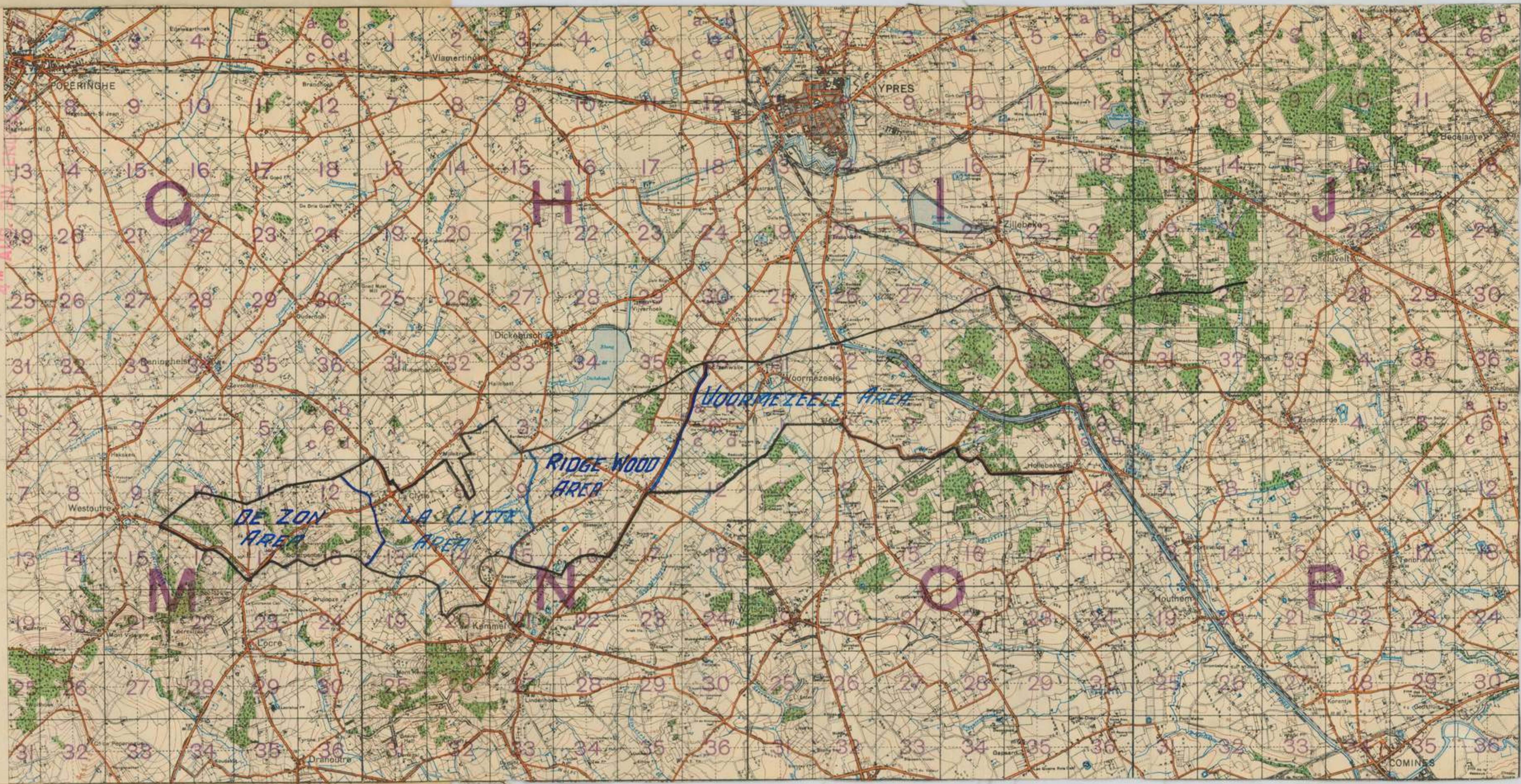

Salvage Scheme for Australian Corps Area.

Personnel.

Each Brigade will detail one Officer and 30 men to be solely on Salvage. These parties will work under instructions from the Divisional Salvage Officer. Divisional Salvage Officer will detail one M.C.O. to be attached to each Brigade and one other rank to each Battalion, this M.C.O. will be responsible for Brigade Salvage returns and the other rank for the Battalion returns.

Dumps.

A Dump will be established for each Brigade in the line, alongside of a loop in the light railways, and on the main road that ration wagons use. These Dumps will be as far forward as circumstances will permit. The Brigade in the Reserve or Support Area will establish a Dump at the most convenient place for all units in the Brigade. This Dump will also be alongside a loop in the light railways, and the main road. Each Battalion in the line will establish a Dump at the head of the Communication trench that carrying parties must use when returning from the line. The Battalion will also establish a Dump at a point where ration wagons or ration trains off-load. The Divisional Main Dump will be established at :-

Scheme.

Battalions in the line will be responsible that the line is cleared, and also any Salvage that may be in the vicinity of the line. Salvage collected will be placed either at the Communication trench Dump or at the Ration transport Dump. Every Officer in charge of carrying and working parties returning from the line will be personally responsible that each man of his party carries some salvage to the ration transport Dump. The Brigade Salvage Officer will have this transport Dump cleared by returning transport to the Brigade Salvage Dump. The Divisional Salvage Officer will have the stores salvaged evacuated from this Dump. The Brigade in reserve or support will clear their own Salvage under instructions from the Divisional Salvage Officer. The Brigade Salvage details will also be engaged on clearing "Pockets" in the Area, and will co-operate with the Divisional Salvage Coy.

R.E. Stores.

R.E. Stores will be collected in Dumps and the Staff Captain of the Brigade notified of the location and contents of these Dumps.

Transport.

No transport will return from the line empty but will load up with Salvage and dump at the Brigade Dumps.

Returns.

Brigades will render a return weekly to the Divisional Salvage Officer showing the stores evacuated, classed as "Serviceable" or "Unserviceable". The results of each Brigade Salvage effort will be published in Divisional Orders showing monetary values and quantities.
