


General.

During this Division's tour of duty in the line, 2/6/18
to 13/7/18, communications were very easy to maintain, in fact
very rarely were the various Units out of touch by enemy
action. The greatest number of breaks was caused by
Aust. Inf. Personnel bombing for fish in the SOMME RIVER.
All other means at our disposal (Viz. Visual, Wireless,
D.R.L.S. Messenger Dogs., and Pigeons.) were tried put and
tested quite satisfactory. Visual, Wireless and Pigeons were
used daily, more with the object of keeping the Personnel
on the alert and giving them practice, rather than as an
altermative.

complete chains of both Visual and Wireless were established from the front line to Div. Hqrs. thus each means was independent of the other. The tendency to abolish heliographs in place of Lucas Daylight Lamps was dissounted during this tour of duty. The weather was generally fine and bright, and much good work between Brigades and Division was got in, however during the dull or cloudy times the Lucas Lamp was invaluable, but in the long distance during sunshine it was impossible. The short supply of Pigeons, although Brigades were demanding a greater supply, proved quite sufficient for Trench Warfare.

The Messanger Dogs have not proved their worth, the selection of the dogs asks for more attention, in that some of the dogs were reliable one day yet unreliable the next.

The work of Officers and Personnel was, as usual, excellent, Linemen particularly working long hours on buried cable and Canal Routes.



General.

Line Communications. Reference Appendices 12 and 13.

Previous to the relief of the 5th. Aust. Div. Sig. Coy. on

2nd. June 1918. parties were sent forward to reconnoitre

the area and learn existing lines. Linesmen from No.1 Section

were sent to man routes etc. on the 1st. June.

Communications on taking over were not entirely satisfactory.

Canal Cables which were being relied upon mainly were becoming faulty, owing to continued cutting by men bombing the canal for fish. Canal Cables were not sufficient, as 13th. A.I.Bde.

(Left Bde.) moved to J 19 (Appendix 11.)

A considerable amount of construction and maintainance work was carried out and in addition cable was buried whenever parties were available, routes were surveyed, and progressive work planned.

June 16th. Completed Poled Route.; Establishing Test Box at Y.S.

June 17th. Establishing Test Box at Y.S.; Fitting up
Dugout at I 34 d 3.3 for Signal Office.

June 20th. Continuing Bury from L.N. to J 19 c 4.6-- 375 yds. completed.

June 21st. Continuing Bury from L.N. to J 19 c 4.6-300 yds.

completed.; Bury between Y.S. and L.N. blown out at 2 am.

Bde. lines put through poled Route to Woollen Mills. Bury O.K.(10 (am.

June 22nd.) Continuing Burged Route from L.N. to J 19 c 4.6 " 25th.)

June 29th. (Assisting Corps Bury from Y.S. to B.S. . 655yds. "30th.)
completed. Burying Cable from Adv. Divsn. F.Y. to Centre Bn.
P 12 b 8.5 Personnel from 4th. and 3rd. Pioneers. 2000 yds. completed.

During the first two or three weeks in this sector considerable trouble was caused to all lines in the Canals by consistent bombing for fish. Steps were taken and this trouble was a good deal abated.

Schools.

On 5th June advanced training for Battery Signallers
was commenced by 11th. A.F.A. Bde. and on 6th. June a school
was commenced by 10th. A.F.A. Bde. 1 N.C.O. and 9 Sigs.
per Battery attended.

On 22nd. June the secong Signal Course of No 5.

Section terminated. Students were very keen on the work, and the results were quite satisfactory.

On 23rd, June. a third Course was held by No. 5. Section. 8 Students attended -- 2 from each M.G. Toy.

Wireless.

During June 1918 all W/T Personnel were rationed by Bdes. Sections to which they were attached.

As no carrying party was available, W/T Personnel carried all accumulators, stores, instruments etc. to and from all Stations forward of Brigades.

W/T Personnel at R. Bn. R. Bde. 0 24 a 4.6 buried P.B. base lines 200 ft. long and about 2 ft. 6 ins. deep, without any assistance.

P.B. and Amplifier Stations each listened in (for conversations of a "suspicous" nature on telephone lines.) for 8 hours each day. This practice caused a considerable drain on 4 volt. accumulators.

Owing to limited possibilities of visual in this sector, it was found inadvisable to dis all other means of communication for a definite period, but steps were taken to increase the number of messages sent by this method. Fullest use has been made of the possible visual stations in the area, and the practice has been to send unimportant and short routine messages and acknowledgements of sealed packets etc.by this means. All stations on the attached plan are manned and in constant use. To get additional units not already in communication by visual would take a large number of transmitting stations with additional personnel, and the service would then be too slow and cumbersome to be of any value.

The Artillery have a complete system forward of Group H.Qs, and where it is not possible to get direct communication, use is made of a transmitting station or runners to neighbouring batteries. A diagram of Artillery visual system will be forwarded as soon as completed.

It has been found in practice that it is better to have a constant watch and see that sufficient use is being made of visual, than a set period, for the following reasons:-

- (1) During the set period the number of messages are curtailed and there is a corresponding increase over the wires afterwards.
- (2) A constantly manned station gets slack in keeping a sharp lookout if it knows that its unlikely to receive messages other than at stated times. This is most important as delay in visual is generally caused by a bad lookout and waste of time calling up.

Herewith report on dogs used in this Division area for week ending 15/6/18, and table of runs with times attached.

The 4th. Bde. were without Dogs for the period 8/13th. inst. On the 13th. Inst. dogs Nos. 101,102,103, were sent out to Bde. and sent to Bns. on evening of 14th inst. and released on thier first run on morning of 15th inst. running from Bn: Hqrs. to Bde. Hqrs.

Their first trip was unsatisfactory, each dog taking from 8 to 15 minutes linger on the trip than runners, but better results are anticipated for future runs.

On the 7th. inst. dogs Nos. 137, 138 and 139 were sent to 13th. Bde. being used on the left Bn. sector running from Corps in line to Bn. Hqrs. Their work was fairly satisfactory. War dog No. 139. after doing two runs in excellent time. failed to return on the third run, and it is feared he was shot by an enemy sniper.

On the 13th. inst. Dogs Nes. 137 and 138 were delivered by Dogs Nos. 131, 132 and 133. Dog No. 131 did has first run on 13th. inst. in excellent time, but on second run on 14th inst. took 1 hr. 55 mins. longer on the same trip. He will be tried again on the same rum during the ensuring tour of duty. Dogs. Nos. 132 and 133 show fair time for the trip and better results are expected.

Dogs Nos. 119, 120, 121 were sent to Reserve Bde. and have not been used up to the present. They will be taken forward tomorrow 16th. inst. to learn the area in anticipation of Bde. releif.

The Division on the Left, to whom the dog was attached, were informed, but ere they made any arrangements to collect same, dog No.117 broke away and bolted, and has not been heard of since.

The Dogs in the Left Bde. Sector were run from Coys in the line to Bn.H.Qs, a distance of from 2 to 3 kilos. In this Sector Dog 119 did not show up too well, in one instance taking 7 hrs.,28 mins. to do the trip. War Dog No.131 seemingly could do with a little more training, doing his first run in good time, but following runs much overdue. War Dog No.113 was on one occasion released with an untimed message, and attention was called to the Bn. concerned.

Good work by the dogs on the Right Bde. Sector was unfortunately spoilt by a lapse on the part of War Dog No. 101; otherwise the runs were satisfactory.

















A.D., SIGNALS.

Reference your T 41/4 of 8/6/18.

It is recommended that, if possible, 7 pair brass be made with each leg under separate insulation as in quad.

Conductor to be at least size 18 copper.

The present 7 pair brass conductor is too light for Morse circuits.

Lead cable is not suitable for burying forward of divisions excepting in rare cases where ground is fairly open and work can be done in daylight.

quad iron armoured is not suitable for overland work, as it takes longer to lay out than D 5 or D 8, and is a great deal harder to maintain and repair quickly.

7 quad brass sheated cable should prove highly satisfactory even if 50% heavier than 7 pair brass, especially if made on
the same principle as quad cable, i.e., each wire under a separate
rubber insulation. Each wire being under a separate rubber
insulation would save both the silk and enamel insulation on the
present 7 pair brass sheath cable. Silk insulation is useless
where cable is liable to get damp, and it tends to short eircuit
the pairs in the present 7 pair cable.

7 pair brass sheath each wire under separate rubber insulation, No.18 conductor without silk and enamel insulation.

Quad brass sheath similar to above with No.16 conductor.

7 pair quad brass sheath as in 7 pair brass sheath.
