

The operation commenced at 0530. An Exchange was pushed forward to 11th A.F.A.Bde Hgrs att.26.b.8.2. at 0600. From this point direct line to 10th A.F.A.Bde was taken over and line laid to 6th Aust.Army Bde. Forward Report Centre was then moved to H.26.b.8.2. and Exchange at H.11.b.7.4. was cut out. Line to 6th Aust.Army Bde on this point was put direct to new Fwd Exchange at H.6.b.8.2. Lines at old Fwd Exchange were bridged through as follows: - two pairs to Div'l Arty were joined to pairs running to new Fwd Exchange, thus providing two direct lines from Div'l Arty to new Fwd Exchange. Line from 10th A?F.A.Bde to old Fwd Exchange was reeled in. The 11th A.F.A.Bde took the place of the 6th Aus.Army Bde in advancing, and closely supporting the advance of the United States Infantry. The C.W. Wireless Set with 6th Aus.Army Bde was sent to the 11th APM A.F.A.Bde. At 1400 all Brigades were ordered to advance and cover a North and South line running through eastern outskirts of BUSIGNY, When the order to advance was received, it was decided to form a new Fwd Exchange in the S.W. corner of PREMONT. Mounted Order lies moved with Brigades to their new positions, then came back and reported each Brigade's location to Fwd Exchange at PREMONT. A Battery line from 11th A.F.A.Bde to H.25.d.7.6. was taken over and extended to FREMONT. It was not possible to lay any more pairs from D.A. to Fwd Exchange, as no further supplies were in sight, and there had been no time to reel in cable already run out. Fwd Exchange at H.6.b.8.2.was cut out and all Brigades notified. Fwd Exchange at PREMONT C.4.b.5.0. was established at 1600 with direct communication to Div'l Arty. Two linemen were (Arthy Dec. The whole personnel of the Section worked continuously from the morning of the 8th until the evening of the 11th without ceasing. 5A Sub-Section moved to PREMONT. Communication to Batteries was established by telephone. 5B Sub-Section moved to PREMONT with Batteries in the vicinity of C.12.b. Owing to scarcity of cable, one pair only was laid making a party line of all Batteries.
	loth		R.A.H.Q. Detachment. Attack continued at 0530. Direct line was laid from Fwd Exchange to 6th Aust.Army Bde at C.6.d.7.4. This line exhausted all available cable. All Brigades moved from PREMONT at 1100. To provide communication it was decided to establish a Report Centre at the 10th A.F.A.Bde without telephonic communication to D.A. Motor and Mounted D.Rs were held in readiness at this Report Centre. 4th Aust.D.A. Hqrs closed at G.28.b.2.8. (Sheet 62B) at 1100 and re-opened same hour at C.6.d.5.0. As a temporary measure 6th Aust.Army Bde line was utilised to PREMONT Exchange. At 0300 cable wagon was sent back from Fwd Report Centre to reel in old lines running back to G.28.b.2.8. In the meantime 4 miles of twisted D3 cable was obtained from O.C. Signals 5th Aust.D.A. A line was then run from D.A. to new Fwd Report Centre which was established at V.28.b.9.2. this line was through and working at 2500. During the night communication by D.R. was very difficult owing to road craters and all bridges in the area having been blown up by the enemy. Despatches were delivered to Brigades chiefly by Runner, who went across country. 5A Sub-Section moved to BECQUINY with Batteries in vicinity of BUSIGNY. One pair was laid all Batteries being put on party line. 5B Sub-Section moved to BUSIGNY. Batteries moved to V.11.a. and d. one pair was paid to all

This line was through and working at 0130. At 1200 11th A.F.A.Bde moved to V.10.d.5.2. and line was extended from old to new position. The horses of the cable wagon team were completely knocked up and a fresh team was obtained from 4th Aust.D.A.C. Cable wagon again commenced to reel up lines not in use. difficulty was experienced in carrying out communication owing to no Signal Stores being available, it not being possible to draw Stores from thise Company which was in rest about 70 miles back and the 30th United States Division who were working under not having any stores available. Great difficulty was experienced in maintaining communication to 5A Sub-Section. Batteries owing to the repeated area shoots of the enemy. 5B Sub-Section moved from V.16.d.6.2. to V.10.d.8.4. As Brigade in this position was very close to Batteries a separate pair was laid to each Battery. R.A.H.Q. Detachment. 30th U.S. Division was relieved by 27th U.S. Division at 1000. At 12th same hour command of Field Artillery covering this Division passed to C.R.A. 4th Aus.D.A. Forward Exchange was moved to V. 15. b. 6.8. 11th A.F.A.Bde line was extended and used to 2nd Aust D.A. A party line was laid to A.R.P. and 4th D.A.C. at V.9.c.6.8. 10th A.F.A.Bde moved to V. 16.b.2.9. a direct line being established from this point to Fwd Exchange. At 2000 a liaison line was laid from 10th A.F.A.Bde to 54th U.S. Infantry Brigade at V. 16.b.2.5. Right Group H.Q. moved to V. 10.d.9.5. with direct communication to Fwd Exchange. 5A Sub-Section improving existing communications. 5B. Sub-Section. As it appeared unlikely that Brigade would not move for a day, a second pair was laid to all Batteries. R.A.H.O. Detcht. Reeling in all lines which has become spare by Brigades moving forward. 13th Line was laid from Fwd Exchange at V.16.c.5.1. through at 1500. The 3rd and 5th D.As less Headquarters moved into this area and came under command of 4th Aust. D.A. 5A. Sub-Section moved to BUSIGNY, Batteries remaining in old position. Battery lines extended to BUSIGNY. 5B Sub-Section. C.W. Wireless working well. During the moves of the past seven days this method of communication was of great value when lines to D.A. were cut. D.
