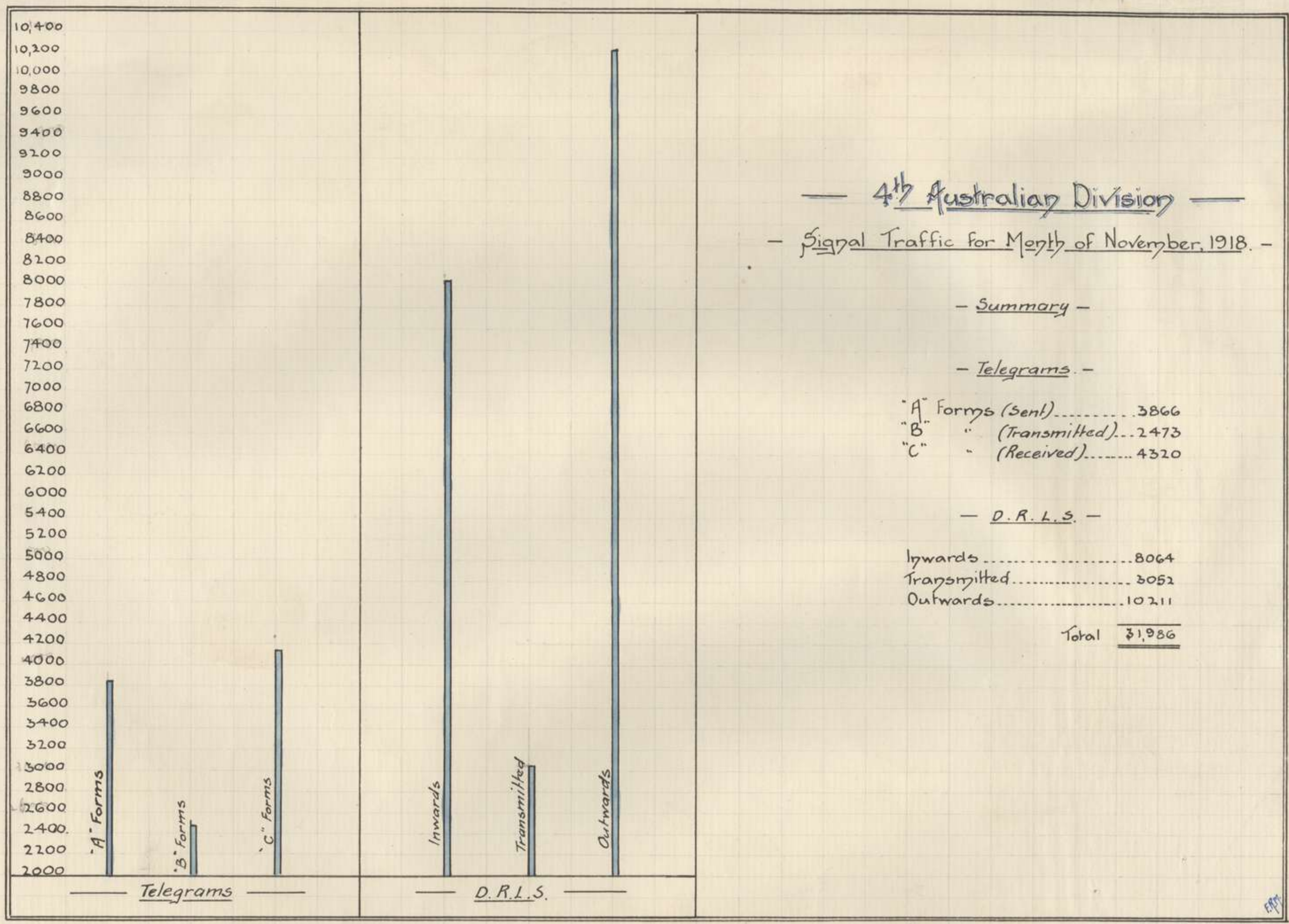

## SUMMARY OF EVENTS - November 1918.

The month opened with all Sections of the Company except those with Artillery Units, in rest in the CAVILLON Area. Energetic training in accordance with sub-mitted Syllabus of training. Divisional Signal School was in operation under supervision of C.O. of the Company. Communication during the period was carried out with normal methods. Telephone circuit superimposed with sounders worked to each Infantry Brigade. Communication to Australian Corps indirectly through FLIXECOURT Exchange. Other important Units of the Division were supplied with Telephone communication where possible. Nos. 2, 3 and 4 Sections and No. 5 Section were in touch with all Battalions and Companies respectively by telephone. D.R.L.S. was carried on as usual; the list of local Units was not heavy. Those close to Signal Office collected traffic from these offices.

The R.A.H.Q. Detachment and 5A and 5B Sub-Sections were still with 4th Aus. Div'l Arty in forward areas under 32nd Division, 9th Corps. The operation - the crossing of the Canal de la SAMBRE at 1<sup>st</sup> OISE on the 4th November, was successfully accomplished by 32nd Division. Communication, although satisfactory became increasingly difficult to maintain owing to rapidity of changes of Units, and the intention of Commanding Officers, and casualties to men and horses through sickness and wounds.

During the move of the Division to BUSIGNY Area, it was impossible to keep in touch by telephone. Motor Cyclists were extensively used on these and subsequent moves.

Notification was received on 11th November that hostilities would cease at 11am. Notwithstanding this, training was persisted in, in view of the possibility of operations re-commencing.

In BUSIGNY telephone lines were limited as very little construction had been attempted, owing to the rapidity of the advance. Great confusion and delay was occasioned by the untidy condition of the Signal office left by the 6th Division in FRESNOY-le-GRAND.

The shortage of lines was also felt in the SAINS-DU-NORD Area where no British routes existed, and enemy routes were found damaged, and took several days to repair.

In view of the fact that orders were issued, that this Division would form part of the Army of occupation to enter Germany, general preparations were commenced to ensure the smart appearance of all Sections of the Company. Daily parades, rifle inspections etc were carried out by all Sections. Orders were issued subsequently however, cancelling the advance into Germany for the Fourth Army.

Wireless, both Spark and C.W. were extensively used during moves. One C.W. Set being withdrawn from Div'l Arty, enabled Div'l H.Q. to keep touch by this means. On several occasions message traffic for Brigades was handled exclusively by Wireless.

After the 11th November, communication became easier to maintain once it had been established, mainly owing to the absence of bombs and to the fact that transport kept to made and used roads.

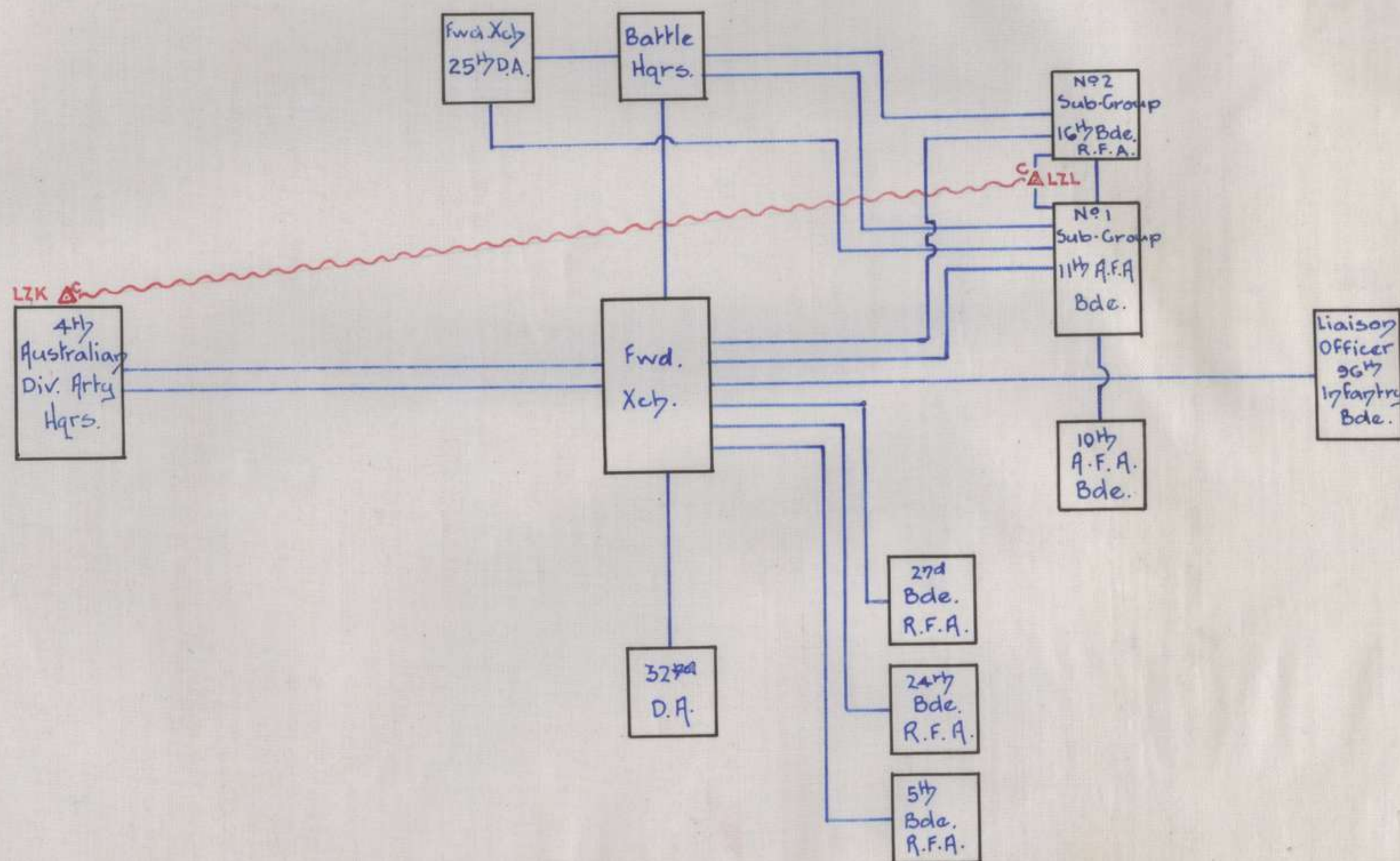


# COMMUNICATIONS
