

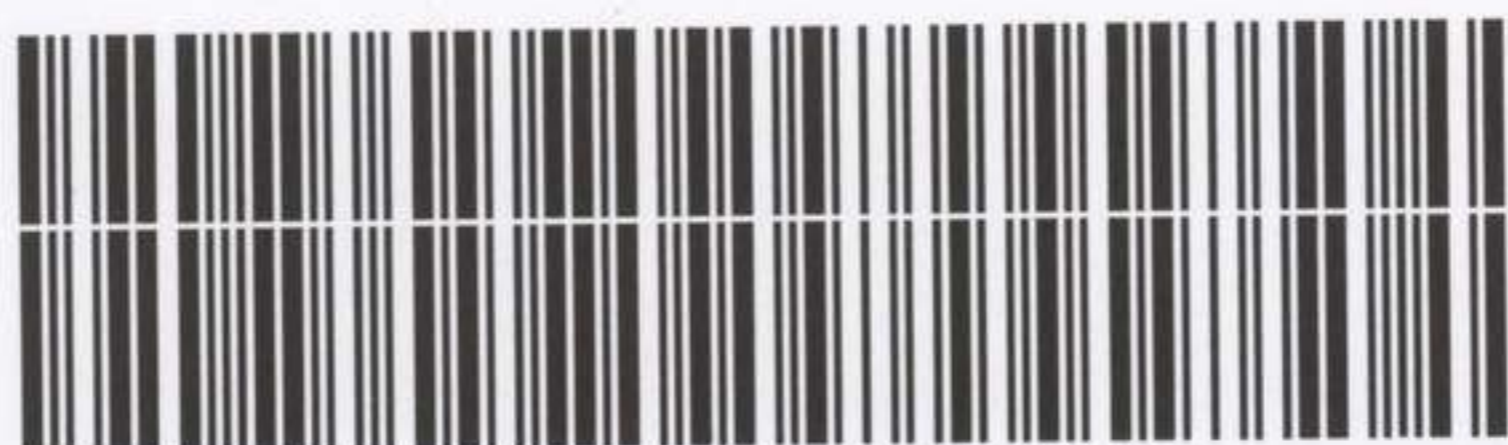

CHATELET	May	1st 3rd 6th 8th 9th 20th	<p>Group Headquarters CHATELET. Sheet NAMUR 1.100.000 <i>4th Div Lgt Co Chatelet</i> One lorry load Technical gear returned to DADOS. 13 Motor Cycles returned to 4th M.T. Company. 5 motor Cycles returned to 4th M.T. Company. Clearance obtained for all stores returned to DADOS. 2 Motor Cycles returned to 4th M.T. Company. 1 Thornicroft lorry returned to 4th M.T. Coy Last of Detached personnel rejoined Company. At 8 A.M. Unit ceased to exist. All personnel stores, horses, Funds Imprest A/C. Transport being satisfactorily accounted for. The remainder of the Company comprising 4 Officers 5 NCOs and 48 O/Rs including Cadre B. proceeded to B Division Reinforcement Camp Charleroi to join Quota No 52 for return to Australia. The Unit has been attached to 4th Aus Division since its Inception on 16th March 1916. It had been represented in the following battles in France and Flanders. Somme September October 1916. Advance on Hindenburg line February. March 1917. Bullecourt April 1917. Messines June 1917. Ypres 1917. Paschendael September October. November 1917. Dernancourt 27th March 1918. and 5th April 1918. Hebuterne April 1918. Retaking Villers Brettoneux May 1918. Villers Brettoneux onwards. August 8th 1918 and subsequent advance to the SOMME. Hindenburg Outpost line September 1918. Hindenburg line September and October 1918. Joncourt Montrebrehan Premont Busigny. Crossing of Selle River Bazuel. Pommeroy. and the crossing of the Canal De La Sombre 'a Oise. The last Units of the Company withdrew from the line on 4th November 1918.</p>
