



In continuation of this office memo. S/671 of 15th instant and 1st.Anzac Order No.29 of 17th instant, the following points . are placed before you for consideration:-

1. Operation A.

- (i). It is too early yet to determine the actual causes of failure but there is no doubt that a contributing cause was indefiniteness as to our exact position and our objective on the right, i.e. front of 3rd Bn.
- (ii) The 0.C. 51st Bn. asserts that he built the two pieces of work in 28.c. which show on recent photographs and this seems very probable. Apparently the more easterly of these is in your possession. It is essential that our whole position on this flank should be cleared up beyond doubt; patrols should be pushed forward tonight towards the other piece of trench which should be occupied if possible.
- (iii) Points Ol and 91 are said by the lst.Brigade to be strongly held and wired. Aeroplane photographs do not confirm this. The latest photographs show them as practically obliterated. Is it probable that your troops got further than they thought last night and that the centres of resistance were points 03 and 73.?
- (iv) There appears to be a "loop" trench running from point 91 to about point 55.

The Corps Commander considers that having regard to your reduced strength and the nature of the operations contemplated by the II Corps your next advance might be limited to the occupation of a line running from your present right throught points 22, 01, 91, to point 55. You should be prepared to effect this on the 20th or 21st instant; the choice of date and time being left to you.

If you have an alternative to this proposal the Corps

Commander will be glad to discuss it with you.

The disadvantages of occupying the named line are the amount of digging necessary and its close proximity to the enemy. You may however be able to make further advance and this should be prepared for. In this connection I am to say, however, that the occupation of the line 95 to 36 would need for its retention the capture at least of 03, 73, 42 and 59.

The situation on this flank should be cleared up tonight.

A special reconnaissance should be made as soon as it is dark to determine our present position and the location of the missing company of the 7th Bn. If the 6th and 7th Bns. remain firmly in their present position it should be possible to gain the whole of the enemy's works between R.35.d.35 and the head of


MUNSTER ALLEY. Special arrangements should be made to this end tonight and a carefully organised bombing party should be given to the 7th Bn. for the purpose.

The G.O.C; R.A. will see you tomorrow regarding the necessary plans for artillery co-operation. In your hext of walker.

My dear General,

I hope that our letter about your next operation is satisfactory to you. I confess that I do not altogether like it, because it is rather a half-hearted measure. There is no doubt in my mind that the step that we should take next is the capture of 95. 36. 03. 73. 42. 59. 48. 27. 77. 54. This is out of the question for you by reason of your numerical weakness. There are however a number of alternatives available. The guiding principle in the selection of any of them is the retention of the high ground. We cannot very well retain the high ground without pushing out a salient, and that is why I think the big salient is the safer plan. One thing is clear, and that is that we cannot take say 95. 36. 03. 91., because that does put out a little salient to which there will be two avenues of approach still open to the enemy. The question for consideration then is whether one can take on from 63. to 73. to 59. to 48., thence to 55. and 81. That is a useful alternative, for we can safely discard the 27. 77. 54. piece of trench which is dipping down into the hollow, - and to my mind now that the/Corps is pressing on down below, the intermediate piece of the hollow between say 27. and 32.d.23. is not of first rate importance. Even then this reduced objective, although it is safer from the salient point of view, is probably beyond the power of your forces while they are of diminshed strength. By a process of deduction therefore, there does not seem to be any operation open to you and within your power except the minor one which our official letter has suggested. The great advantage of it is that it would

form a very nice jumping-off place for the troops who are to do the main job, although it has disadvantages in the way of taking and by reason of close proximity to the enemy.

I will try to come and see you in the morning, and we will then talk it over.

282. VETERINARY.

A.D.V.S of Divisions will always report by wire to Army Corps Headquarters any cases of infectious disease, stating the place where the animal affected is quartered. Steps should at once be taken to disinfect the watering troughs used by any horses under suspicion. Should the unit be on the move recent halting places should also be reported in order that measures may at once be taken to prevent the spread of disease through trough contamination.

### 283. AREA COMMANDANT.

An area officer with Headquarters in W.27 a 38 has been appointed to supervise camping grounds in T area between SENLIS and the BRICKFIELDS (both inclusive). When any unit is ordered into the area the Area Commandant will be warned, and the strength of the unit and time of arrival intimated. When possible an officer should go forward to consult him and make arrangements. Units will occupy the Camp or site allotted to them by the Commandant.

284. TECHNICAL ARTILLERY STORES.

A supply of spare gun parts and technical artillery stores is carried by Divisional Ammunition Columns.

Batteries should not indent direct on Bases for such stores but should obtain them through the Ammunition Columns, who should put forward indents through Ordnance Officers with formations to replace any articles issued to or required to complete equipments of Batteries.
