

- 1. The following moves of Units of the 6th A.I. Bde Group will take place on the 11th and 12th February 1919.
- 2. 11th Faby. 5th, 6th, 7th Field Coys. A.E. from THY LE CHATEAU to MARCINELLE under orders of the C.R.E.
- 3. 12th Feby. (a) The 24th BATTALION. from NALINNES to MARCINELLE. NALINNES to be cleared by 1000 hours.
  - (b) 22nd BATTALION. from GOURDINNE to MARCINELLE. NALINNES not to be entered before 1000 hours.
  - (c) 6th Aust. Field Ambulance. from NALINNES to MARCINELLE.
  - (d) 16th Coy. A.A.S.C. from BERZEE to MARCINELLE.
- 4. Billeting parties have already proceeded.
- 5. BILLETS. A certificate to the effect that all billets, and transport lines have been left in a clean, and sanitary condition will be rendered to reach Brigade Headquarters by NOON on 13th inst.
- 6. CLAIMS. G.R.O. 1146 is repeated for action:-"In conformity with French practice in the case of troops "quitting cantonmonts, arrangements will, whenever possible "be made for an officer to remain behind for at least 3 hours "in each commune to receive and deal with claims for damage, "which it was not possible for the inhabitants concerned to "submit to the commanding Officers prior to the departure of "the troops."
- 7. SUPPLIES. Supply arrangements will be notified later.
- 8. Brigade Headquarters will close at NALINNES at 1100 hours on 12th inst., and reopen at MARCINELLE at the same hour.

Q.M.S. Department (a) Rations - The usual standard was maintained throughout the month of January.

(b) Ordnance - The following Stores were drawn from D.A.D.O.S. during the month Puttees .. prs. 18 Pantaloons prs. .. 25

alse, during the month a third blanket per man was drawn and issued.

(c) Repairs - Boots, clothing and harness were kept only in fair state of repair during the month - this being due to the unit being not in possession of specialists in the different repairing lines. Materials for these repairs were procured through Army Ordnance.

Transport - During the month the health and condition of all animals on charge to the unit, has been excellent. There were 4 evacuations during the month - due to injuries received during the War. Very little transport work was carried out during the month: on an average three pairs mules and 2 horses were used daily. Classification by the Divisional Veterinary Officer of all animals on charge, (for demobilisation purposes) took place on the 16th inst. Thirty sets of shoes were used during the month and it was found necessary to use frost cogs during the last week, owing to the state of the roads - due to the heavy falls of snow ans subsequent hard frosts. The housing accommodation has been good and the fodder ration normal.

Bathing - The bathing facilities carried out under
Brigade arrangements could not very well be taken
advantage of owing to the baths being situated
some 4-5 kilos from Company Headquarters. The
personnel in lieu, bathed under arrangements
with the local inhabitants.

Medical - Water - During the month all well and other water has been chlorinated by the A.M.C. detail as required before use.

Sickness - The evacuations for the month were above the average - this being due to the prevalence of Influenza in the area.

The senior A.M.C. detail - (due to the prevalence of venereal disease) conducted a separate department for prophylactic treatment within the Company.

Orderly Room - Communication - was established per runner with Headquarters, Divisional Engineers, the D.R.L.S. being employed from H.Q.D.E. to Brigade and Divisional Headquarters. The telephones was not connected during any period of the month.

Despatches and messages received and despatched

during the month amounted to 597.

Mail . - The mail was collected, censored and despatched daily. The inwards mail was collected from the Brigade Post Office and issued to the individuals concerned.
