



No. 2 Camp Sutton Veny	1918 November		<p><u>GENERAL REPORT.</u></p> <p><u>PARADES & TRAINING.</u> The usual Parades were held during the month, the morning being devoted to Technical Training. After 16th. inst the afternoons were devoted to Recreational Training, as per Syllabi of Training attached. Five Route marches were carried out over distances varying from 5½ miles upward. Foot inspections were conducted by Company Officers, the state of the men's feet being satisfactory. Night operations were carried out during the month, instruction being given in various subjects.</p> <p><u>MEDICAL.</u> A Muster parade was held on 27th. inst for V.D. examination, five cases being found, but were attended by the early treatment and discharged cured. the M.O.'s together with the D.O.'s report is attached. The weekly summaries show weekly number of evacuations by M.O., while the number of men attending Sick parades and under Dental treatment is shown on Graphs attached. App 1 2 & 3 The health of the Troops is generally good.</p> <p><u>MOVEMENTS.</u> The number of Officers & O/Ranks marching in and out of Camp is shown in weekly summaries with reasons for their movement.</p> <p><u>WORKS.</u> The weekly reports of the Works Officer show in detail the work being done, in and around the Camp. The Detached Party at Weymouth engaged on the erection of Stables etc. were recalled on 27th. inst.</p> <p><u>SCHOOLS.</u> During the month 2 Officers and 9 O/Ranks marched out to various schools. 9 O/Ranks marched in from Schools- Results have been very satisfactory.</p> <p><u>CRIMES.</u> During the Month 34 cases mostly of a minor nature were dealt with by the Commanding Officer. Of these 9 were admonished and 2 were remanded for D.C.M. The discipline of the Battalion is exceptionally good.</p> <p><u>QUARTERMASTER'S REPORT.</u> A report from the Regimental Quartermaster is attached showing the work done in that branch during the month.</p>








Graph shewing Daily Sick Parade for Month of NOVEMBER 1918

QUARTERMASTER'S REPORT FOR NOVEMBER 1918.

ISSUES AND WITHDRAWALS.

The equipping of the total strength of the Depot for proceeding to France in the case of "A" Class personnel and of "C" Category men for return to Australia, has been practically completed. This work necessitating the employment of an increased Staff from the "A" Class trainees. Further preparations for the handing over of Barrack equipment including fumigation of Blankets is well in hand.

CAMP ACCOMMODATION.

Brigade Signal School have vacated this Camp, also the majority of the Strength of the Depot.

PERSONNEL.

As far as possible "C" Class personnel have been replaced by "A" Class.

TRAINING STORES.

Training Stores have been withdrawn and prepared for return to Ordnance.



MESSING REPORT NOVEMBER 1918

The period ended on Friday November 29th. 1918, and completed a 35 day period. The daily average Messing strength including Signal School was 559. The diet sheets for the period viz:- 31, 32, 33, 34, and 35 were strictly adhered to during this period and the messing on the whole was satisfactory, there being no complaints from the men during the month. The meat issues were particularly satisfactory as to quality. The Depot messing closed with the termination of this period and the balance of men in this depot have now marched out to 1st Training Battalion.
