Moves. On Dec 1st the Brigade Group was still stationed at Brisches. During the month the following moves took place.

On 17th to Avesnelles Area via Cartigny-

Godin - southern portion of Avesnes

on 18th to Sivry via Telleries-Clairfayt

on 19th to Bassenuon Area.

On 20th to Walcourt Area its final destination

via Boussu- Silenrieux.

Locations. Locations for the various units comprising the Brigade Group for the month are shown as follows:

on 17th the 2nd AM G Bn, 6 AM G Bn & 7 Ham Coy were stationed at Flumont.

Bde Headquarters, 17th, 18th, 19th & 20th Battalions, 5th ALTM Bty, 5th Field Ambulance 15th Coy AAC & 1/3rd SAA sect were stationed at Avesnelles.

on 18th the whole of the Bde Group were stationed at Sivry.

on 19th Bde Headquarters & 20th Bn were at Soire & Gery, and 17th Bn were billeted at Renlies.

Places occupied by other units are not recorded in Bde Headquarters diary.

On 20th Bde Headquarters, 5th ALTM Bty, 6th Field Ambulance, 18th Battalion were stationed at Walcourt.

The 17th Battalion 1/3 SAA sect ~~1/3 SAA sect~~ were at Silenrieux.

15th AAC were at Mertonnes while the 2nd AM G Bn was billeted at Yves-Gomezee.

On the 23rd the 20th Bn found it necessary to move to more comfortable billets at Bry & Chastres because those at Drussois where they had been billeted were found in a very dirty condition.

Training. Training little attention was paid to actual training until the middle of the month when a syllabus was made out, the troops having settled down pending orders for a further move. On 30th a memo was received. The following training consisted in Ceremonial drill Educational classes, Route marches recreational training & lectures.

General on Dec 1st while the Bde was at Prisches the Bde Group was inspected by His Majesty the King, The Prince of Wales & Prince Albert. For this inspection the Bde Group was formed up in a field off the main Maroilles - Ruesnes Rd. On the 24th the Prince of Wales, while the Bde was at Walcourt, presented medals as under.

Educational returns were made during the month, and arrangements were made for the despatch of the men to the various centres to take up studies &

work under the Education scheme. On 30th nominations were forwarded for intensive French courses at University of Bruxelles, Charleroi.

Sports were held on the 8th, and later

while at Walcourt arrangements were for an elaborate sports programme, ^{& football competition} for the following month.

The weather generally was wet, except for a few fine days although cold.

Leave was granted to places outside the billethung area, for the day only.

On the 23rd The Green Diamond Concert party opened at Walcourt. On the 26th two war films were shown at the Green Diamond Cinema, where large numbers of ~~the~~ civilians were present.

On the 31st a memo was received from Div stating that no Australian troops were to be used for Garrison Duty in Germany & that the probable period in the Walcourt area would be 2½ months. On 24th word was received that Lt T Maxwell M.C. DCM was awarded the V.C.

Strength of Bde on 31st was off. 143. ORS 1888.

Departures for month. 11 off. 124 opns.

17th Battalion

The moves of the battalion and its location, during the month, are shown under the heading of Bde Headquarters.

Training. Training was in accordance with syllabus laid down by Brigade.

Subjects. The Education syllabus comprised the following subjects Arithmetic, Algebra, French, Shorthand, English, Geography, Book Keeping, Commercial Correspondence, and Essay writing.

Departures. Lieut L Layton-Smith MC proceeded

to England for Demobilisation Duties.

Battalion Officers' Mess celebrated the winning of the Victoria Cross by Lieut T Maxwell M.C. D.C.M. of the 18th Battalion.

Lieut A.F. Gilbert was appointed Adjutant on 26th.

General. Christmas Day was happily spent the Battalion doing justice to a sumptuous spread.

While on the march special attention ^{should} ~~laid on the importance~~ was paid to a clean & neat appearance of all transport & personnel.

When at rest, either in or out of billets all ranks were ordered to pay particular attention to their appearance.

Rations were continuously short, and while at Silencieux meat, vegetables & fuel were obtained by purchase.

Transport animals were well housed & plenty of fodder was obtainable.

Strength of Battalion on 27th 444 470 ORs.

18th Battalion.

Moves. Moves & locations are dealt with under Bde Headquarters heading.

Officers. Departures. Lieut Robson M.C (Captain) left for Oxford for the continuation of his studies, being N.S.W. Rhodes Scholar for 1916.

Lt C.J. Brossois to Div HQ for duties as adjoint ^{to Walcourt} major. These duties were taken of by Lt D.R. O'Sullivan MM on 22nd.

Lt Belcher relieved Lt O'Sullivan on 24th.

Rejoined. Capt Ch. Kaeppele M.C. from seconded list took over duties as Adjutant.

Major S.A. Middleton reported from hospital & was attached to Div HQ.

Sports & Training. Training was carried out according to Brigade Syllabus.

Inter company competitions were arranged & committees for Rugby, Soccer & Hockey were elected. £55.6.6 for the purchase of sporting material was obtained from the Regimental Funds.

Under the Education scheme a Battalion Parliament was formed to Walcourt on 10th General. While on the march, the Battalion was

inspected by GOC 2nd Aus Div (Major Gen Rosenthal).

On 23rd, the Corps Commander (Lieut General Sir J.J. Talbot Hobbs K.C.B. V.D) visited the Battalion. 1450 francs were donated

by this unit towards the erection of a memorial of the 2nd Aus Div at Mont St Quentin.

Throughout the month rations were light - particularly vegetables. During the march to Walcourt rations were drawn from Avesnelles.

Supply. Assistance was given to the transport section by the supply of 6 men & 12 mules & ~~vehicles~~ from Divisional S.A.A. section. Horses were comfortably stabled & fodder was plentiful.

General

but great difficulty was experienced in getting it (as also rations) to the Battalion owing to the railway being disorganized by the destructive work of delayed action mines set by the Germans.

At Walcourt eating accommodation was scanty, a vast quantity having been removed by the Germans. From a much load of timber which, had ^{the Germans} failed to remove, many form stables were made, by the Battalion pioneers.

The country through which the Battalion marched showed little sign of the German occupation, except for the exploded dump & munition train at Avesnelles siding.

Shell holes were rare & the land was ^{but} undevastated, a few houses in each village were gutted. These were burnt by the Germans in the 1914 advance. The country was most picturesque, being undulating, dotted with farms & crossed with hedges. The ^{pleasant} lined roads presented a pretty aspect in spite of the inclement weather.

Award. Lt. J. Maxwell M.C. DCM was awarded the V.C., for personal bravery, excellent judgment & aggressive decision, & for fine leadership in a most involved situation, during operations on the Beauvois - Fonsomme line, on Oct 8. 1918.
Strength. Strength of Battalion on 31st 450 off & 715 ORs.

comforts fund. Other gifts were received from Aust. Comfort Fund & Overseas Club.

London. Yester day was spent quietly at Puy. The Battalion Band rendered several programmes ~~which were~~ ^{of which there was} greatly appreciated by the civilian population ^{on both sides}. On arrival at billets at Daussois, accommoda-

tion was found to be most unsatisfactory


as the village was in an insanitary condition.

On the 25th the Battalion moved 10 miles away, B Coy only being billeted in chalets.

Despite the wet weather horses & mules stood the 4 days journey well. Good stabling was secured at each village for the stay overnight.

Owing to congestion of traffic rations were delivered irregularly particularly during the latter end of the month. There were serious shortages of vegetables, margarine & oatmeal, & during the latter half of the month there was no daily issue of fuel.



In connection with the operations of the 2nd Aust. Division from 8th August 1918 at VILLERS BRETONNEUX, to 4th September at MONT ST. QUENTIN, I feel some effort should be made to ensure the erection of a lasting memorial at MONT ST. QUENTIN worthy of the exploits referred to and of the troops that took part.

While recently in England I conferred with the leading Australian Sculptor and obtained sketch model and estimate for such a memorial. The cost will run into a £1,000. Today I have met the Generals of the Division and discussed the matter fully with them. They agree with my suggestions and a Committee has been formed consisting of the Infantry Brigadiers, C.R.A., C.R.E., A.D.M.S., O.C. M.G. Battalion, O.C. Pioneers, O.C. Train, with myself to arrange the necessary details.

A site 100 feet square on MONT ST. QUENTIN has been given to us by the Mayor and Council of MONT ST. QUENTIN. It is desired that every member of the 2nd Aust. Division shall contribute in defraying the necessary expenses and I am sure all ranks will deem it not only a pleasure but a privilege to be intimately associated with the erection of a memorial which in addition to commemorating the battles referred to will also be a lasting recognition of the valor of those who laid down their lives in this fighting. It is proposed that the minimum subscriptions be as follows :--





DIVISIONAL SPORTS MEETING

12.12.18.



Under instructions from the Acting Brigadier, Lieut.-Col. F.W.D. FORBES, D.S.O., and by selection of the Brigade Sports Committee, I attended the above meeting at Div. H.Q.

The Chairman, Major, S.A. MIDDLETON, 2nd. Div. Rep. on Corps, explained the reasons for the meeting which briefly were as follows:-

GENERAL - The Australian Corps, through the recently appointed Officer i/c Recreational Training - Lt.-Col. MASSIE - intended in the near future to launch a Sports Programme, complete in every detail, consideration being given to Companies as well as to the intermediary formations to Divisions.

Corps had confirmed a fixture - FRANCE v. AUSTRALIA - to be held in PARIS on 19th January, 1919. The Div. Rep. had received several instructions in regard to this fixture, the last of which was that Corps required by 13th instant the names of the best 15 players in each Division. It is of course impossible to do this, but it was agreed that each Brigade Rep. forward by wire tomorrow to Div. Rep. ... the names of first class players, giving rank, name, unit and position on the field and approximate weight. Though not altogether a satisfactory procedure it is the best offering, as it is the intention of Corps to put 15 players from each Division into immediate training, a Corps team being selected therefrom, to proceed to PARIS on 15th January, 1919.

1. SUPPLIES - Railhead LANDREICES commencing 13th inst. During the move all supplies will be drawn from Railhead by M.T. Refilling points for this Brigade Group will be as under :-

After 22nd instant Refilling point will be at Church FONTENELLE whilst Group is in WALCOURT Area, and supplies will be drawn by 1st line transport.

2. TRANSPORT - Two motor lorries are at the disposal of the Brigade for the move to the new area. At 0700 on 17th instant one lorry will report to 20th Bn. and one to 2nd M.G. Bn. These lorries will be loaded with such stores as are not required on the march and will be despatched by 0900. They will make the through trip to the final destination, and return on the same day reporting to 17th Bn. H.Q. and 18th Bn. H.Q. respectively at PRISCHES.

On the 18th instant they will be loaded and despatched by 17th and 18th Bns. by 0900, go through to final destination and report back to Brigade H.Q. at SIVRY on the same day. Each Bn. will detail 1 N.C.O. and 2 men to act as guard and loading party to lorry.

8. VETERINARY - Units will carry a sufficient quantity of cresol to disinfect dirty and doubtful stables and horse standings prior to occupation to prevent any contagious diseases such as Foot and Mouth disease.

9. CANTEEN - The Divisional Canteen is establishing a wholesale branch in WALCOURT. Date of opening will be notified later.
