



SIVRY.	1st March Saturday.	Sky clouded over a very cold day. The Brigade Staff was employed throughout the day making arrangements for the establishment of a camp at the SIVRY Rifle Range for competitors in the forthcoming Divisional Rifle Meeting. The G.S.O. 1. Division (Lieut.Colonel. J. B. McCOLL O.B.E., M.C.) was relieved to-day by Lieut.Colonel S. L. MILLIGAN C.M.G., D.S.O., of Corps General Staff.	
SIVRY	2nd March Sunday.	Owing to the restrictions on assemblies due to the prevalence of influenza, the Divisional Boxing Tournament which was to have been held today has been postponed until the 6th instant. All competitors for the Divisional Rifle Meeting have now assembled in SIVRY Musketry Camp. Notification received that dances could now be held, and dances were held by the 56th Battalion at SIVRY and the 55th Battalion at RANCE at night. There was heavy rain throughout the night.	
SIVRY.	3rd March Monday.	Raining hard. Owing to inclement weather Rifle Meeting is postponed until 5th and 6th instant. Division advised later that Meeting would be postponed indefinitely. Owing to moves within the Division, these can not now be held until after 16th instant. The training, educational and recreational, programmes received from units indicates that everything possible is being done by the Commanding Officers to make the men's long wait for repatriation interesting and instructive. Indeed, some men are so happy with their units that they are refusing leave to England, It is difficult to get batmen, cooks, etc., for Brigade and Divisional Headquarters because men will not leave their "Homes".

A number of "Y" class horses were despatched to the Base. The A.R.A. platoons from 53/55th and 56th Battalions are now training hard for the forthcoming Divisional Rifle Meeting.

			During the period all Lewis Guns, with the exception of five which will be required for Musketry Competitions, and all ammunition, less that which is required for training purposes, were returned to D.A.D.O.S. and Corps Ammunition Dump respectively. 37 "X" and "Y" horses were returned to Base. No. 14 Quota consisting of 4 officers and 172 other ranks marched out on the 5th instant. Advice was received from Division that drafts would in future proceed under the group system. The G.O.C., 14th Australian Infantry Brigade is detailed to demobilise "C" Group which consists of:- 14th Infantry Brigade. 5th Pioneer Battalion 5th Mobile Vet. Section Divisional Train Headquarters and 4th A.A.S.C.Coms. Divisional Salvage Company 14th A.F.A. Brigade. For Division Headquarters. It is not anticipated that the first thousand will leave until about the middle of next month. A number of guards and working parties have been found for duty at Railheads and dumps etc., and it is becoming daily more difficult to find men for the various duties that are allotted to us. Rations have improved lately, vegetables which were very short for some time are now plentiful. We were able to give a good deal of assistance to units staging through the area.

SIVRY	16th March Sunday.	Church parades were held by all units to-day, although it was threatening rain. The Y.M.C.A. cinema which has been shewing in SIVRY for some time left the area to-day to go to another Brigade. Some of the details who are to compete for the rifle matches commencing on Tuesday have arrived at the SIVRY rifle range for practice. There are also a number of officers and men practising for the tests prior to the selection of the team which will represent the Division at BISLEY.

In spite of adverse conditions the shooting on the whole was good, the men of this Brigade showing to advantage. Information received from Division that a Quota would be sent from this Brigade group about the first week in April, The "Sank on Sanks" (55th Battalion Concert Party) gave a performance to a crowded house in SIVRY in the evening. The G.O.C. who attended with Lieut. Colonel MARSHALL D.S.O., M.C., (Commanding Officer 56th Battalion) congratulated the party on their performance, and drew cheers from the crowd when he announced that a Quota of 1000 men would be going on demobilisation shortly.
