

Registration was carried out on \$.0.S. 1/40,000 62 D. lines. Ammunitions in S.O.S. positions was overhauled and further supplies brought forward to the guns. Men in the line relieved by the 6th A.L.T.M.Battery, withdrawn and marched from BUIRE to billets at ALLONVILLE. B.O. 108 -9/5/18 STRENGTH - 4 Offs., 62 O. Ranks.	
to	10th 16th		Weather for period very fair. General Light Mortar training was the main instruction given during stay in this area. STRENGTH 4 Offs., 62 O. Ranks.	
	17th	1415	Inspected by the C. in C. Field Marshall Sir Douglas Haig on Allonville aerodrome ground. STRENGTH - 4 Offs., 63 O. Ranks. ditto	
to	18th 21st		During this time officers and N.C.Os. made reconnaisssance of defensive system round Querrieu. Battery was frequently entertained by Brigade Pierrot Troop in the Allonville aerodrome. During this time enemy ditto bombing planes were very active at night. On occasional days enemy shelled ALLONVILLE with high velocity shells. STRENGTH - 4 Offs., 63 O.Ranks. Sick, 6 O. Ranks evacuated. 1 minor crime.	
LANGY TRONVIL	22nd		Hot and close. Very hazy. Marched out of Allonville, proceeded via La Motte to Blangy Tronville for relief with Brigades of 4th Divn. (B.O. 109 - 20/5/18) Situation normal. Arrived at billets, Blangy Tronville, Strength - 4 Offs., 63 O.Rs.	
to	23rd 31st		The weather on these days mostly very hot. Poor visibility. During this thime time battery was in Divisional Reserve and supplied duty men each day to Area Commandant. Full advantage was taken of the opportunity of swimming in the Somme. Enemy bombing planes gave much trouble at night. On the 27th Gen. Sir. W. R. Birdwood presented medals and ribbons at a parade near La Motte and took the opportunity of saying farewell to the officers on his leaving the Australian Corps. Enemy shelled Blangy occasionally with high velocity shells but did little damage. Lt. Brydie, W. taken on strength.omonla/5/18. Lt. Fiddler G.A. taken on strength 16/5/18.
