(K.3.90.22).</p> <p>The month of March has seen a big speeding up of demobilisation and repatriation.</p> <p><u>OFFICERS.</u> Major. R. B. CARR, D.S.O., C.R.E., proceeded on leave to PARIS & LYONS on 6/3/19 and thence to England for non-military employment. He was struck off strength on 9/3/19.</p> <p>Major S. B. COX, O.C. 4/12th Field Coy. assumed duties of C.R.E. on 9/3/19.</p> <p>Lieut. G.F.S. DONALDSON relinquished appointment as Adjutant, 4th Divisional Engineers on 27/2/19 to assume command of 13th Field Coy. on 2/3/19. On amalgamation of 4/12th and 13th Field Coy's, the command of the combined Unit devolved on him. He was appointed temporary Captain on 11/3/19. Engineer Headquarters and the Field Companies being together, he continued to carry out the duties of Adjutant despite the fact that he had relinquished the appointment.</p> <p>Lieut. E. MORRISON, 13th Field Coy. proceeded on leave to U.K. on 12/3/19 and having received instructions for non-military employment was struck off strength from that date.</p> <p>Lieut. A. J. BUCKLER and D. 			<p>Major R. B. CARR, D.S.O., and Lieut. R. A. HUNT, D.S.O., attended investiture by the King in London on 22/3/19.</p> <p>Appendix No. 1 shows progress of demobilisation during the month.</p> <p>The transport and equipment of 13th Field Coy. was handed into store on 4/3/19 whilst that of Engineer Headquarters was disposed of on 31/3/19.</p> <p>The following animals have been demobilised -</p> <p>On 28/2/19, 13 horses from 13th Field Coy. were sold at GIVET at prices ranging from £28, at an average price of £34-6-3- total proceeds of sale being £446-5-0.</p> <p>On 16/3/19, 7 horses from all Div. Engineers were sold at DINANT and on the same date 16 horses were despatched to Base.</p> <p>On 18/3/19, 21 horses made up from all the Div. Engineers were despatched to Base, leaving on hand amongst the Div. Engineers, 2 horses and 41 mules - of these 40 mules were sold at FLORENNES on 26/3/19 at prices ranging from 650 to 1,200 francs. Two horses were stolen on 26/3/19, so actually there is only one mule on hand.</p> <p>On 7/3/19, the 13th Field Coy. moved to FURNAUX and staged there until their billets at FIGOTTERIE were available.</p> <p>On 12/3/19 the 4/12th Field Coy. moved from CHAMONT to VILLERS POTERIE (2.G.60.24)</p> <p>On 13/3/19 the 13th Field Coy. moved from FURNAUX to FIGOTTERIE (2.G.63.32). which is practically part of VILLERS POTERIE.</p> <p>On 17/3/19, Engineer Headquarters moved to VILLERS POTERIE. Appendix No.2.</p> <p>On 24/3/19 the amalgamation of the 3 Field Companies took place and temporary Capt. G.F.S.DONALDSON took command. 

Dispersal of Headquarters and amalgamation of formations and Units.

1. (a) On the amalgamation of 1st. and 4th. Divisions, at a date to be notified, 1st. Australian Divisional Headquarters ceases to function as such and will be reduced to Cadre strength. 1/4 Australian Divisional Headquarters will be formed from the combined staff of the two Divisions.

(b) The Divisional Signal Cos and Train Headquarters will be amalgamated at the same time as Divisional Headquarters.

2. (a) Immediately after the departure of the next quota, No. 19., from "A" Group, 4th. and 12th Aust. Inf. Bdes., will be grouped under the command of the G.O.C. 4th Aust. Inf. Bde. The 12th Aust. Inf. Bde. Staff will cease to function and will be reduced to Cadre strength, the Brigadier Major or the Staff Captain remaining attached to the 4th. Aust. Inf. Bde. Staff.

(b) The 4th Aust. Inf. Bde. will be reduced to two battalions at once.

(c) The G.O.C. 12th. Aust. Inf. Bde. will prepare a scheme for the reduction of the Brigade to one battalion after the departure of Quota No. 19.

3. (a) Immediately after the departure of the next Quota after No. 19., the Divisional Artillery and 13th. Aust. Inf. Bde., will be grouped under the Command of the C.R.A. The 13th. Aust. Inf. Bde. Staff will cease to function, and will be reduced to Cadre strength. Such members of the 13th. Bde. Staff over cadre strength as may be required will be attached to Headquarters Divisional Artillery by arrangement between the C.R.A., and G.O.C. 13th Aust. Inf. Bde.

(b) The Divisional Artillery will be reduced to one Brigade after the departure of Quota No. 19., and will then consist of the following units :-

10/11 Australian Field Artillery Brigade, 12th Army Brigade, Australian Field Artillery, and 4th Australian D.A.C.

(c) The 13th. AUST. Inf. Bdo. will be reduced to two battalions at once, and a scheme for its reduction to one battalion after the departure of the quota after quota No. 19., will be prepared by the G.O.C.

4. The Divisional Engineers

will be reduced to a single Company immediately after the departure of the Quota after No. 19. and the C. & E's Headquarters will thereupon cease to function as such.


5. The 4th. Australian Machine Gun Battalion and 4th. Australian Pioneer Battalion will be grouped under the command of the C.O. 4th. 8. As soon as possible the three Infantry Brigades of the Division will be concentrated forward and grouped under one Infantry Brigade Commander.

Units will also be notified and will record the promotion in their next A.F.S. B213.

R.M.O's Report.

During the month of January, the 4th Divisional Engineers were still separated, each Company being with its respective Brigade. The billets were excellent, the 4th Field Coy. being in the little village of CHANMONT near FLORENNES, the 12th Field Coy. at HASTIERE and the 13th Field Coy. at DINANT. The first-named Company was particularly fortunate in that everyone was able to get a bed and clean bed clothing. The other 2 Coy's were not so lucky and were billeted in two large buildings each capable of taking the whole Company.

Sanitation was easy and consequently good; most of the latrines being civilian and water flushed.

There was not a great deal of sickness, the majority of the complaints being bronchial in nature with the usual coughs and colds. The remainder of complaints consisted of boils, rheumatic symptoms and slight injuries. In fact, the greater percentage of men on sick parade were those needing dental treatment. The number of evacuations was very low. There was only one case of V.D. contracted whilst on leave; no diarrhoea. The total number on sick parade was about 280.

The rations were quite good and adequate, there being no complaints at all from this quarter. The facilities for getting hot baths and clean changes were excellent.

W A R D I A R Y.4th AUSTRALIAN DIVISIONAL ENGINEERS.FEBRUARY 1919.R.M.O's Report.

The month of February has easily been the worst since the Armistice as regards the number on sick parade and evacuations. This condition was entirely due to an outbreak of influenza in the 13th Field Company. For a time this epidemic threatened to become serious, but by vigorous gargling and speedy evacuation of those badly affected, along with isolation when possible, the disease was entirely removed in the course of six days. During this time there were about 23 - 25 cases in the 13th Field Company alone, of whom one died later with pneumonia. The other 2 Companies, 4th and 12th, were not affected to anything like the same extent, there being only about 4 or 5 cases all told. It is practically certain that the disease was introduced by 21 reinforcements who arrived early in the month. Very soon after arrival, several of these were affected and soon afterwards the older hands began to suffer. It was very noticeable at the time that practically every man on returning from leave to England was suffering from, or quickly developing influenza.

The other most prevalent diseases were bronchitis, laryngitis, tonsillitis, one case of which was later reported as diphtheria, rheumatism, scabies and boils. Those desiring dental treatment were numerous. There were 2 cases of V.D. contracted on leave, and none of diarrhoea. The total number of evacuations was about 30.

The 21 reinforcements were of good physique, many being middle-aged.

The billets and sanitation are still excellent, being the same as before. Rations also are good and adequate.

MARCH, 1919.R.M.O's. Report.

For the first fortnight of this month, the three Companies of the 4th Aust. Div. Engineers were still in the same place as during the preceding few months. During this period there was very little sickness at all. On the 12th of the month, the three Companies moving independently, came together at the village of VILLERS POTERIE not far from CHARLEROI and soon afterwards joined to form a single Unit, the 4th Divisional Engineers - this was made possible by drafts leaving under the repatriation scheme. This village, VILLERS POTERIE, is quite small and, as usual, very dirty and unclean, no provision having been made for sanitation at all. At first, a large number of the mens billets were very poor and crowded, but now, since the departure of one or two drafts, have greatly improved and on the whole are fairly good.

The total number on sick parade was about 75, including eleven for dental treatment, and the evacuations numbered six. Most of the sickness consisted of minor complaints such as laryngitis, tonsillitis and slight rheumatism and small injuries. There were 3 cases of diarrhoea, 3 of scabies and 37 gonorrhoea - of the latter, two were unsuitable for treatment here and subsequently were evacuated.

The cases for evacuation consisted of V.D., chronic synovitis and rheumatism.

The quantity of rations has fluctuated somewhat lately, some days being very poor, especially as regards meat and jam - green vegetables have been entirely absent.

Towards the end of the month, instructions were issued that all R.M.O's were to examine all men before leaving on draft for evidence of V.D., scabies or lice.
