This resulted in a great saving of time.</p>

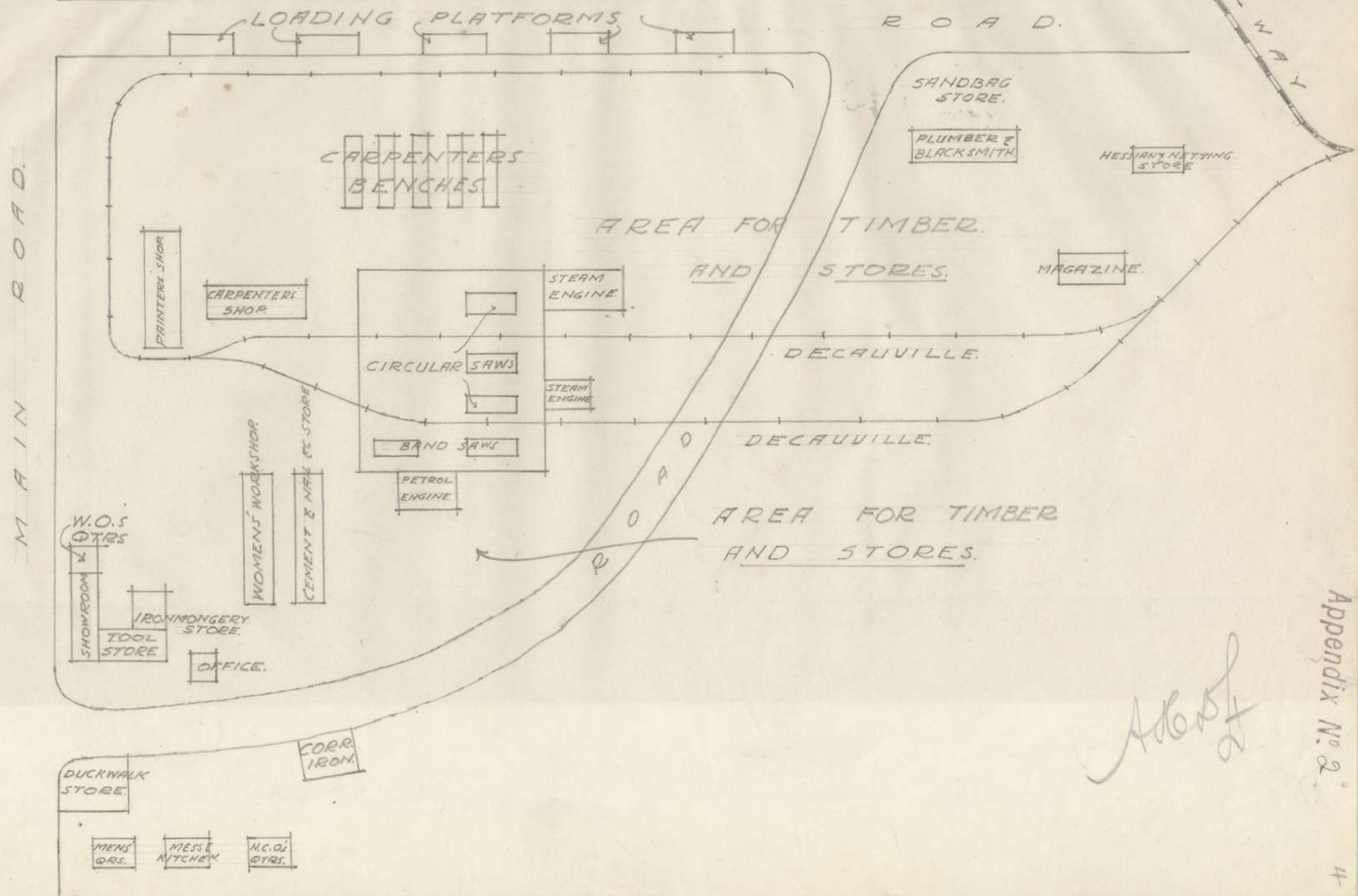
