



following advantages are claimed for it :-

(1) Being completely collapsible et can be easily carried with other stores on a G.S. Wagon, occupying but little more space than a field stretcher. It weighs approximately 20 lbs.

(2) It is capable of accommodating 8 men comfortably, and 10 men at

a pinch.

(3) Being built solely from timber, iron and canvas, all of which stores are easily procurable, its construction entails no undue expenditure nor lengthy labour. Estimated cost 10/-.




