FRONT LINE.

POSTS.

These consist of three groups, BELGIAN WOOD, POTSDAM WOOD and HESSIAN WOOD.

At each group the platoon H. Qrs. exists in Pill Box. The posts consists of small trench works with a low revetment about 3' high with a trench 6' to 8' long and 3' wide. In each group a Lewis Gun post exists. In most posts the trenches are dry but shallow. The ground will not permit of deepening these posts as the positions border on bery marshy country.
