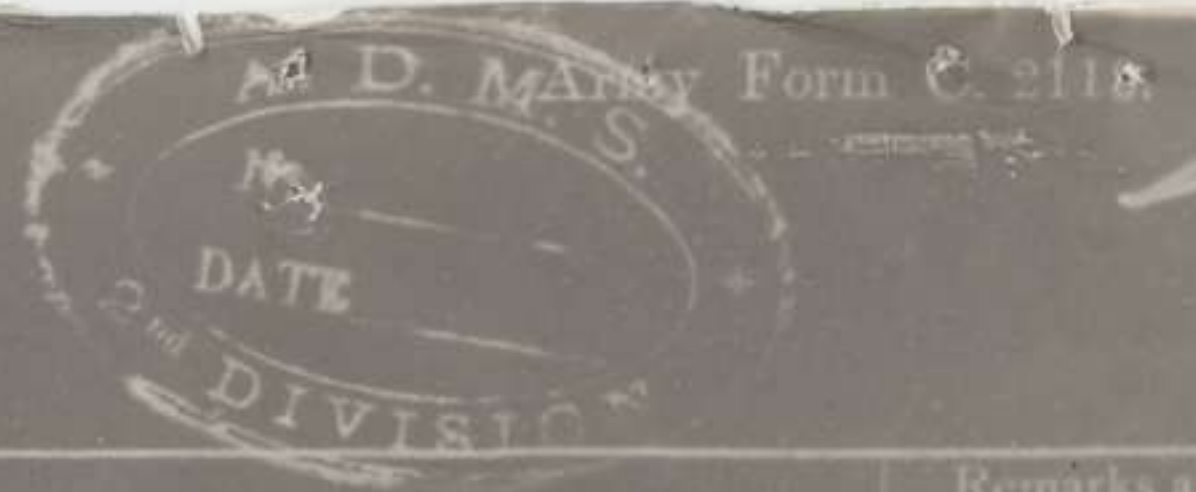

			<p>Owing to the entire lack of trucks & cover the proportion of killed was high, and also that of the severely wounded unable to walking wounded - the numbers of the two being about the same.</p> <p>The two heavy parties were under Capt. MARRACK M.O. No. 24. Who unfortunately fell sick and had to be evacuated. Capt. BOURNE Price took his place. It was soon found that the beams of no. 2. were insufficient to cope with the casualties and those of no. 100 F.A. were brought in and arrived about 1 P.M. owing to the mist it was possible to evacuate 1/2 day across the open. Touch was gained early with the M.O. M. K. in the position Gunman line, and with the M.O. 25. R. F. in our old front line and they were cleared at regular intervals. Evacuation of the R. sector under Capt. CHATFIELD was steady also. There was no hitch and although the beams of no. 5. F.A. and an infantry party came up in the late afternoon they were not all required. No. 6. beams were relieved at night & returned to OUVLERS for rest.</p>

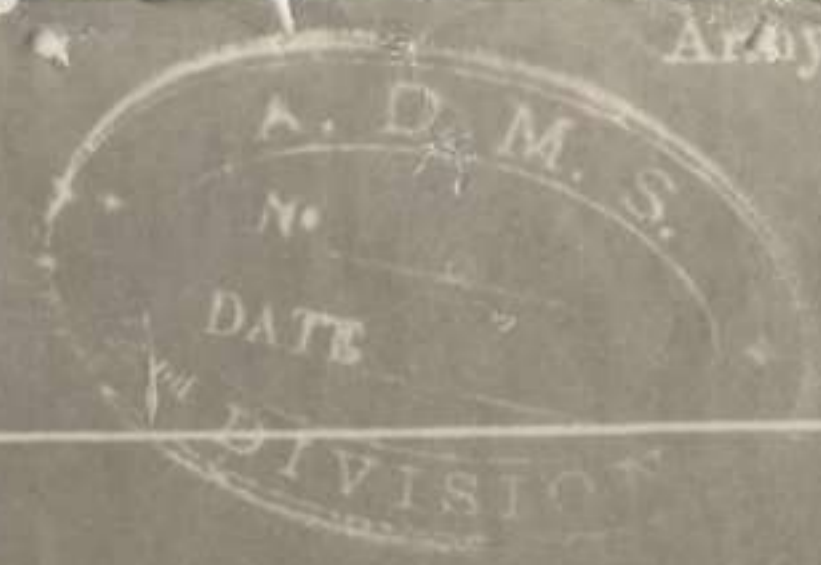

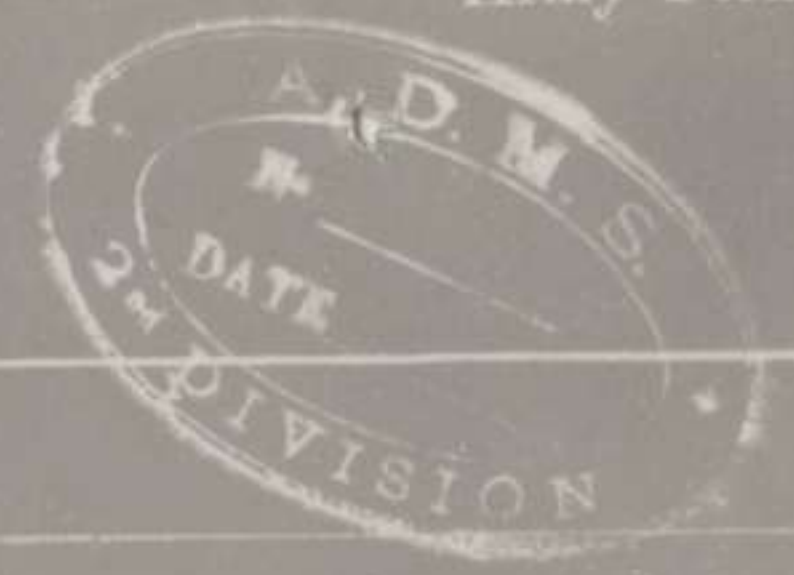

3. The boundary between the Divisions will be a line drawn from approximately point R.11.a.8.0. to point R.11.a.75.60., the west Miraumont Road inclusive to 2nd Division.
4. O.C. No. 8 Field Ambulance will be responsible for the evacuation of the wounded in the front area.
5. The Bearer Division of No. 8 Field Ambulance will remain working the line - The Bearer Division of No. 100 Field Ambulance will move up to OVILLERS HUTS at 7 p.m. on "Y" day ready to move at short notice under orders of A.D.M.S.
6. All available motor and horse ambulances from Nos. 5 & 100 Field Ambulances will report for duty with O.C. No. 8 Field Ambulance at OVILLERS HUTS by 7 p.m. "Y" day.
