



Routine Order 192 of 16.7.18. INSPECTION of the COMMAND.

The CORPS D.A.& Q.M.G., Brigadier-General R.A.CARRUTHERS, CB., CMG., inspected the Command today.

The following were brought to notice :The general organisation and billeting of men was

satisfactory.

The cooking arrangements were deemed capable of great improvement, except the 5th Aust.Divn.Rft.Wing. Aldershot Ovens are to be constructed forthwith to give greater variety in menu. Wasteful open fires are to be abolished, the cooking places are to be close to menss quarters to avoid long marches to and fro, especially in wet weather. Only two cooks had a copy of "Cooking in the Field" which should be studied and acted upon. Supplies of this book will be obtained and issued from this Office.

Provision of messing rooms was approved.

O,s C. Units should submit their recommendations for suitable buildings or convertable spaces with due regard to economy. Tables and Stools in small quantities may be requisitioned for, through this office.

It was definately laid down that the Reinforcement

Camp is not a Convalescent Depot or Rest Camp.

A pleasing feature during the inspection was the almost total absence of umemployed men.
