



GENERAL STAFF CIRCULAR No. 63.

Reduction of Strength of Signal Companies.

- 1. Owing to the reduction in strength of personnel of the Corps and Divisional Signal Companies, increasing difficulty has been experienced in carrying out the work entailed in the care and maintenance of horses and equipment.
- 2. Corps has authorised therefore that as a temporary measure of relief, the equipment and horses of one cable section of the 2nd Aust. Div. Signal Company shall be returned to Ordnance and Remounts respectively.
- 3. Personnel rendered surplus by this reduction will be distributed amongst the remaining sections of the Signal Company.
- 4. Instructions regarding the disposal of surplus equipment, stores, and horses will be issued by the Administrative Branch of the Division.
