

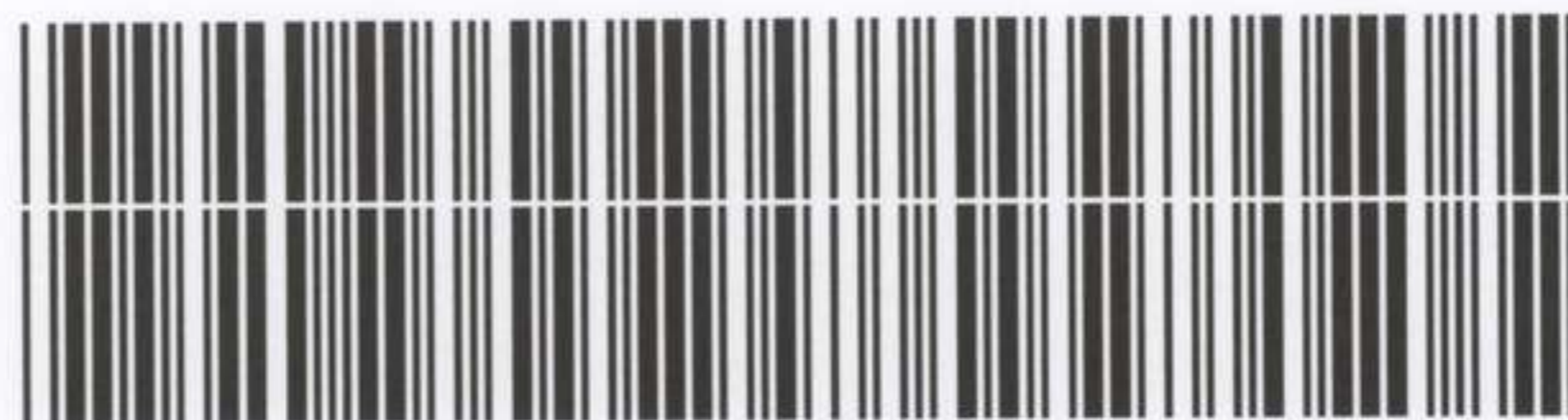

	1918; October	2nd.	The Division was withdrawn to the PERONNE Area. - Administrative Instruction No. 60 issued. - (See Appendix 1).	1.
"		4th.	Arrangements completed for the move of the Division to HALLENCOURT Area. Six 'personnel' and 3 'Omnibus' Trains were available for this work. Transport not accommodated on these trains moved by road. - Owing to the impossibility of obtaining sufficient lorries, for the removal of stores etc., to the train, a Light Railway Service was established to PERONNE. - Administrative Instruction No. 61 - giving detailed arrangements, time tables of trains, and billeting distribution in the HALLENCOURT area. - (See Appendix 2). The information about the new Area was obtained by sending a despatch rider with Advanced party, thus Brigades were enabled to know exactly where they were going before leaving the PERONNE Area. The troops did not actually collect in the PERONNE Area, as per Administrative Instruction No. 60 owing to the move coming early, and the PERONNE Area being occupied by American troops; they bivouaced on the Eastern portion of the Area, within easy marching distance of Railhead. -	2.
"		5th.	All surplus equipment was put into a Divisional Store, PERONNE. All entrainments were carried out satisfactorily, with the exception that the Transport trains did not carry the whole of the transport arranged for. - This surplus transport was sent forward by road. - Detrainments were carried out satisfactorily. - Slight difficulties occurred owing to one train being sent to the wrong destination; it was got to its proper destination. - The Area, as sub-divided by the Area Commandants, did not prove adequate to hold the whole of the division; owing to barns being full; the Artillery Area at AIRAINES was made use of for Divisional troops. - Billeting on the whole was good, and facilities for bathing existed in the area. -

"A.Q., Notes for Week Ending 5th October, 1918, issued. - These Notes include a statement of the casualties in the operations for period 29-9-18 to 2-10-18, showing the comparatively light toll of Casualties during that time.- The Fighting Strength of the Division is now roughly 6,000. - (See Appendix 4).	4.
"	12th.		The 37th Battalion ceased to exist, and amalgamated with 38th and 39th Battalions. -	5.
"	15th.		Leave arrangements to ABBEVILLE issued - Administrative Instruction No. 63. (Appendix 5). When the authorities were interviewed with regard to leave, it was found that their system of dealing with Australian troops showed greater knowledge of the best methods of handling visiting troops that the Division has come across. - Knowing the his attitude of the Australian troops towards the British Military Police, the Commandant had arranged for Australian Picquets and instructed his police that they were not to handle Australians, but to call upon the picquets to do so. - He showed great interest in the arrangements for the prevention of Venereal Disease, and it is anticipated that there should be no trouble experienced from the large number of troops visiting.ABBEVILLE.

During this week a number of cases, which had been held in safe custody while the Division was in active operations and moving to the back area, were dealt with. - The Sick Wastage decreased slightly. - Circular Memorandum issued to all Units outlining Scheme for Civil Training, the object of which was to make the best use of what facilities could be obtained in the Division for fitting men for Civil Life. -	6. 6A.
"	22nd.		"A.Q" Notes for Week ending 19th October, 1918, issued. - This shows a slight decrease in number of cases "Absent without Leave" during the week. Minor cases have been dealt with summarily by Commanding Officers. - Influenza has begun to make itself its appearance. - The 42nd Battalion withdrawn from the Field, and amalgamated with the 41st Battalion. -	7.

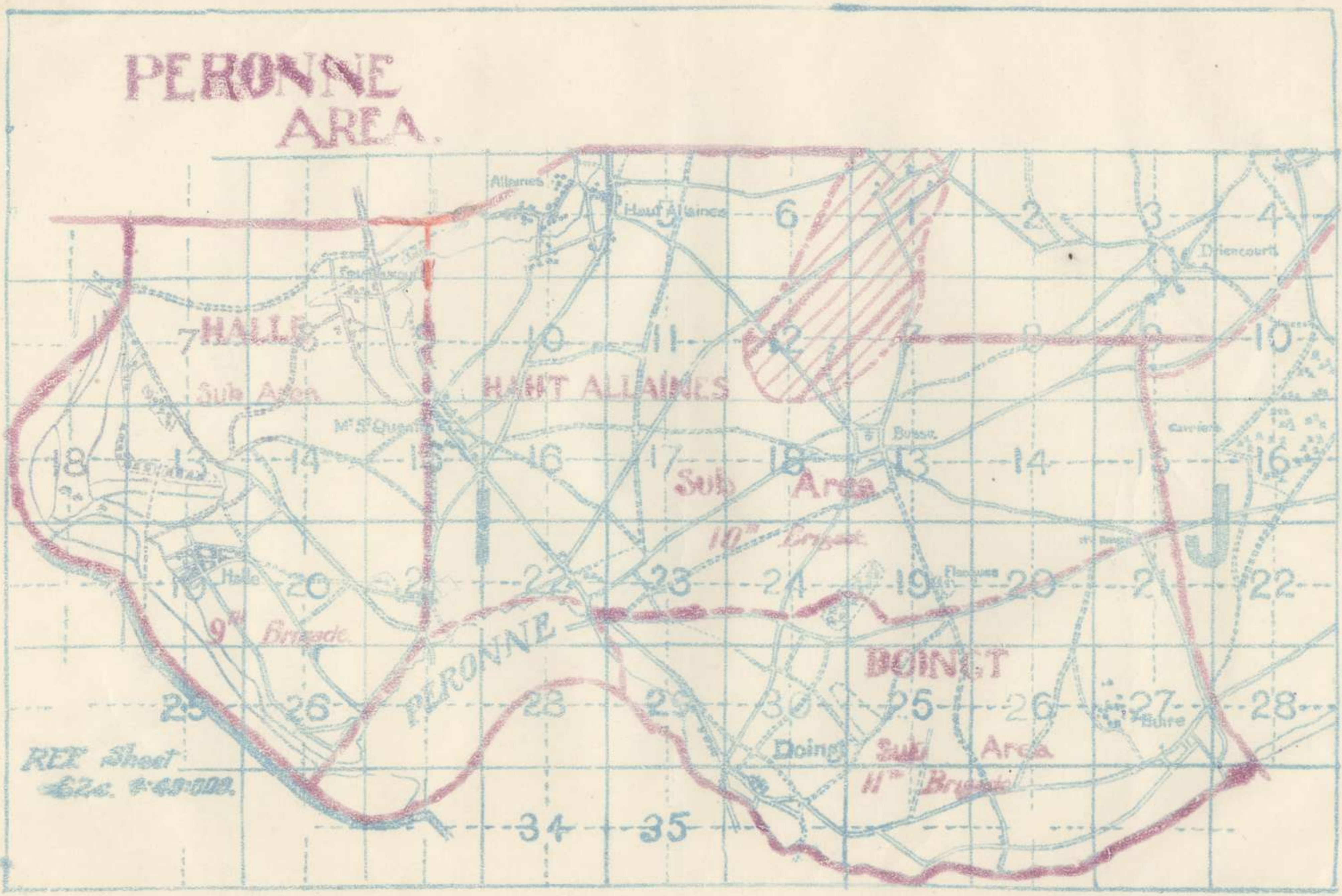

ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION No. 62.

9th October, 1918. -

1. BOUNDS.

The Brigade bounds, as set out in Administrative Instruction No. 61, of 4-10-1918, will be strictly adhered to, and Brigade Commanders will sub-divide their areas as may be deemed expedient, placing a senior officer in charge of each sub-area, who will be responsible to them for the discipline of all units in such sub-areas. -

Map showing sub-divisions, together with name of Officer in charge will be forwarded to Divisional Headquarters by 6-0 p.m. 11th instant. -

2. REGIMENTAL POLICE:

The usual provision for Regimental Police will be made. -

3. PICQUETS: Where necessary, villages will be picqueted from 6-0 p.m. to 10-0 p.m. daily. - The strength of the picquet will be at discretion of Brigade Commander.

4. L. E. A. V. M.: Arrangements are being made for leave to be granted daily to ABBEVILLE, and allotment, together with transport arrangements will be notified later. -

Any man proceeding outside the Divisional Area must be in possession of a pass signed by a Staff Officer of Brigade Headquarters and bearing Brigade Headquarters stamp. -

5. SANITATION: 3rd. Aust. Sanitary Section is located at AIRAINES for sanitary work in HALLENCOURT Area. -

6. AREA STORES: Units will apply to Area Commandants for such stores as may be required in this area. -

7. R. E. MATERIAL: Aust. Corps R. E. Dump is being established at VILLE-LE-MARQUET near FLIXICOURT. Indents for material required will be submitted to C.R.E. of this Division, who will obtain the necessary authority to draw. -

8. ORDNANCE: Railhead - LONGPRE.
D.A.D.O.S. Stores: ALLERY.

9. SUPPLIES: Railhead - LONGPRE.
Refilling Points - Divisional Train Coy. Lines. -
Supplies will be drawn from Railhead to Refilling points by supply wagons of Divisional Train, and thence to Q.M. Stores by first line transport.

10. WATER: Water is available from wells in the various villages in the area, and will be chlorinated at source of supply.

11. HORSE WATERING: Horses will not be watered in streams or water holes, but by bucket, pending erection of horse-troughs. -

12. GRAZING: Grazing in this area must be arranged for through Senior Supply Officer. -

13. SALVAGE: Salvage will be collected at Q. M. Stores, and returned to Refilling Points, and thence to Railhead by supply wagons of Train. Salvage personnel have been placed at Railhead and Refilling Points.
