

1. INTENTION. The I.C.Bde is raiding SANA Redoubt at 2330 on 11th August 1917, and the N.Z.M.R. Bde is moving out to support I.C. Bde, & is sending 1 Sqdn C.M.R. to occupy KHIREET ERK, 1 Sqdn W.M.R. to occupy Pt: 520 410, and 1 Sqdn: (4th Sqdn: Major H. Munro) A.M.R. to occupy Pt: 520 IFTEIS by 2335.

The above Sqdns will be in position 500 yds South of their respective objectives at 2320, & will move to their respective objectives dismounted.

2. MOVES. The Regt: (less 1 troop 11th Sqdn) will march past starting Point 100 yds North of H.Q. lines at 1900 today. Order of march as follows:-

H.Q.

4th. Sqdn.

3rd. "

11th. " (less 1 troop).

The Regt: will join up with the N.Z.M.R. Bde on East bank of WADDI GHUZZE at FARA by 2000, and will march with it via IMARA Station to Pt. 330 as per para:1.

3. PROTECTION. When Regt: joins the Brigade at 2000, 11th Sqdn will detail 1 troop as right Flank Guard and 1 troop as Rear Guard to the Bde.

1. INFORMATION. From information received it has been found that there is  
 (1) A small trench redoubt garrisoned by 150 men on Pt. 650  
 (c5).  
 (2) A small trench lying due East of this redoubt across

 (3) Another small trench situated just N of ABU in EIR ABU  
 IRGEIG.  
 (4) A 5 arched viaduct and station buildings about half a  
 mile N.E. of Pt. 650.

2. INTENTION. A raid will be carried out on the enemy at IRGEIG on the  
 night Aug:13th/14th. with the object of:-  
 (a) Destroying the enemy post there.  
 (b) Damaging his railway.

The troops detailed for the enterprise are 2nd Light Horse Bde. & 2 troops Field Squadron. The Operation should be completed and the 2nd Light Horse Bde. be back West of the line 810-730 before daylight on the 14th August.

1. INTENTION. The Yeomanry Division is receiving the ANZAC Mtd Division tomorrow 18th inst.. The N.Z.M.R. Bde: is moving out of present camp area & the 4th.A.L.H. Bde: Area on the beach.
2. MOVES. The Regt: will march out with the Brigade and will form up H.Q. 3rd Sqdn mass facing North on ground North of H.Q. lines at 1045.. 4th, 11th Sqd.-All-sublets-wheels-canot-be-burned-must-be- Order of march as per margin.
3. CAMP LINES. Sqdns: will leave their camp lines in a clean and sanitary condition. Tents will be left standing with the flies rolled up. All rubbish which cannot be burned must be buried deep.
4. KITS. All kits and bivvies must be packed and stacked at the head of each Sqdn: lines by 0400 tomorrow. Sleeping blankets must be packed and stacked in separate bundles to bivvy blankets. Camels will be loaded up with sleeping blankets and G.S. wagons with bivvy blankets.
5. TRANSPORT & CAMELS. Each Sqdn: will be allowed 6 camels and 1 G.S. wagon; H.Q. 4 camels; O/Room & Sigs: 1 limber. The wagons & camels will park on ground between 4th & 11th. Sqdn: lines at 0515 & 0545 respectively, after being loaded. O.C. 11th Sqdn. will detail 1 N.C.O. and 1 man to report to R.Q.M. at 0345 to draw camels.
6. GAGAGE GUARD. Each Sqdn: will detail 1 N.C.O. & 4 men as escort to camels. This party will report to R.Q.M. at 0515. O.C. 3rd. Sqdn: will also detail an Officer to take charge of Brigade camels from present camp site to Beach, & from there to "L" C.T.Coy: KHAN YUNUS. Tour of duty 1 week. Horses of these men will be taken down to the Beach.
8. REAR PARTY. O.C. 3rd Sqdn: will detail 1 troop under an Officer to report to Regtl: h.Q. at 1030 tomorrow. As soon as the Bde: Sanitary Officer & an Officer from the 6th Mtd: Bde: have inspected Regtl: lines & passed them as clean, a receipt regarding same will be obtained, & the troop will then rejoin Regt: on the Beach.
9. DETACHES. O.C. 11th Sqdn: will detail 4 men to report to R.Q.M. at 0400 tomorrow for short fatigue. On arrival at Beach O.C. 3rd Sqdn: will detail 1 N.C.O. & 6 men to report to O/Room, as guard over fresh water tank there. Tour of Duty one week.

Sqdns: concerned, & bathing picquets with necessary life buoy & life line are always to be present whenever bathing is taking place. Life buoy & life line can be obtained from the R.Q.M.
12. WATERING. Horses will leave for watering at 0745 tomorrow.
13. BREAKFAST. Breakfast will be at 0530 tomorrow.
