

They returned at 1400 and reported four trucks derail- 1:63:360 ed. At 1530 the egiment moved out as advance guard to the Brigade and marched to KISSAR Station. 142. J. 13. a. At 1800 the 11th Sqdn, were sent out and formed an outpost line surrounding the Station to the SOUTH. The remainder of the Regt bivouaced just SOUTH of the Station.

1 INTENTION

The G?O.C.N.Z.M.R.Brigade will take over command of the Left Sector during the night 5/6/September with Head-quarters about Y.29.a.

Moves will take place as follows during night 5/6th Sept:-

- (a) Canterbury M.R. will move to bivouac site about J.6.b.
- (b) Wellington M.R. will move to bivouac site about Y.27.d.

2. MOVES

3. TRANSPORT

Ground Sheets and Blankets will be carried on the horse. Bivvy Sheets, technical equipment etc. will be stacked at EAST end of Squadron Lines by 1700.

1st Line Transport is alloted as usual.

Os. C. Squadrons will ensure that their lines are left in a clean and sanitary condition.

5. MARCHING OUT STATES To be rendered to O/Room by 1500

6. WORKING PARTY

O.C.4th Squadron will detail 6 men to report to O/Room dismounted at 1630-Short fatigue.

1 INFORMATION

The objective of the forthcoming operations will be to inflict a decisive defeat on the enemy, and drive him from the line NABLUS-SAMARIA-TUL KERAM-CAESAREA. The Army is to pivot on its Right in the JORDAN VALLEY and to attack wi with the 20th Corps astride the NABLUS ROAD and the 21st Corps against the enemy's right.

Desert Mounted Corps(less ANZAC Mounted Division) are being held in rear of 21st Corps, ready to move on AFULE and BEISAN under special orders. The FORCE in the JORDANE VALLEY will be known as CHAYTOR'S FORCE.

2.INTENTION

- (a) This force, will in the first place, be responsible for the defence of the front NORTH end of the DEAD SEX.

 GHORANIYEH BRIDGEHEAD-AUJAH BRIDGEHEAD-MUSALLABEH-ENMEJMEH exclusive.
- (b) It will use every means to prevent the enemy withdrawing troops to reinforce other parts of the line, or concentrating against the 20th Corps.
- (c) When the advance of the 20th Corps begins, every endeavour will be made to protect the RIGHT flank of that force (d) If the enemy reduces his strength in the JORDAN VALLEY the FORCE may be called on to advance NORTHWARDS to JISR ED DAMIE.
- (e) The Force may be required to sent a detachment to join with an Arab Force from the SOUTH.

3.MOVES

The Regiment will concentrate tomorrow in WADI AUJAH in Square Y.30.b. Moves will take place as follows:(a) The Regiment in full marching order will pass the Starting Point-Road 400 yds ESST of Regtl Headquarters in column of route at 0400 tomowwow, 19th instant, Order of march as follows:- Headquarters

3rdvSquadron 4th Squadron 11th Squadron.

(b) All dismounted men will parade at Headquarters at 0800 tomorrow and will march under the senior N.C.O.present, to the Brigade Dump.Sq.H.18. These men will come forward as reinforcements as required. Os.C.3rd and 11th Sqdns will each detail a full Corporal to remain with the men.

4. SUPPLIES

Supplies will be carried as follows:
(a) On the man-unexpended portion of days ration, and Iron ration one full days ration and one special emergency ration On the horse unexpended portion of days forage, one days full ration, and one days special emergency ration.

(b) On first line transport-One days full ration for man and horse, plus one days special emergency ration.

5.CAPTURED MATERIAL All enemy captured enemy material will be handed to

Headquarters at once. In the case of articles of Military

Value i.e. Guns, Machine Guns. etc. A small guard will be

detailed to remain on until articles have been stencilled

with the name of the Regiment.

6. MOSQUITO NETS

All Mosquito nets will be carried.

7. SANITATION

The present bivouac site will be left in as clean a condition as possible. Whenever the Regt comes into a new bivouac Os.C Sqdns.will ensure that trench latrines are at once prepared and that men do not defascate indiscrimately.

REPORT ON OPERATIONS AT JISR ED DAMIEH 21st & 22nd SEPTEMBER 1918

REFERENCE MAP-----DAMIEH 1.40,000

Leaving KH FUSAIL at 2400 as advance guard, we proceeded vis the JERICHO BIESAN Road. The advance guard cleared the country covering the bridge at MAFID JOZELEH. Thence to the main road DAMIEH NABLUS. On reaching this road I found a large number of enemy Infantrt hadjust passed on that way to JISR ED DAMIEH. I at once sent one Sqdn. after them. one Sqdn astride the Mai Main road facing WEST to intercept prisoners, one Sqdn.from the Road tothe river facing NORTH and ESST with listening Posts facing EAST. The Sqdn sent towards the Bridge at DAMIEH overtook enemy Infantry and captured a number of prisoners. This enemy force had a Cavalry outpostline, which brought a haevy fire to bear, but my Sqdn. scon drove them in and down to the River flat. The Sqdn.held high ground overlooking the Bridge until daylight when the enemy delivered a strong counter-attack forcing the right of this Sqdn. to retire and took up a strong position supported by Artillery. Realising that the enemy were strengthing their post by digging and by the arrival of reinforcements, I recommended that they should be attacked at once, and .as I did not consider I was strong enough to do so I asked for assistance. 1 Sqdn C.M.R. and 1 Company B.W.1 were sent up in support. Meanwhile our artillery did some excellent shooting. I personally reconnoitered the whole line which was nearly half a mile long, in the shape of a crescent with a flat top. The enemy on the inside looking over while we held the outer line looking at them about 500 yards. Being unable to find a weak spot in the enemy line I decided to madvance all along the line, closing in on the Bridge. I put 1 Sqdn plus two troops with one Sub-section M.G. on the left overlooking the Bridge and road. These troops were not to take part in the advance, but were to inflict punishment on the enemy when the advancing line drove them from kka their position. From the left line ran: -A.M.R. (less 2 Troops) Company B.W.L. with one Troop A.M.R.; one Sqdn C.M.R..l Troop A.M.R.I held in reserve. Punctually to time the whole line moved off with bayonets fixed, and with a few stops advanced to the edge of the high ground overlooking the Bridge, The Turk could not stand against this onslaught; some surrendered others kind fled only to be overtaken and dealt with by the troops on the right. The advance ower the intervening ground was carried out in splendid style. The long range overhead M.G.fire was most effective. The advance of the B.W.1 was particularly keen and workmanlike. They dashed down the hill in great style. The C?M.R?advanced rapidly closing in on the right.l Troop mounted advanced in fine style, but were stopped suddenly by a steep cliff. They at once wheeled Sections right, moving round and down to the river. and did a lot towards rounding up the prisoners. The enemy was now in great disprder and was being severly punished and the Bridge had been secured intact. Seeing what looked like Artillery EAST of the JORDAN, I ordered all ranks back to b the high groundWEST of the river covering the Bridge, which is suitable for all arms except Heavy Artillery. All ranks carried out their duties in a business like manner, sone particularly prominent cases have been brought to your notice. I understant that this is the first battle for the B.W. Is, their baptism augers well for the future. Out casualties were light. A. M. R. 3 O/Rs Killed, 1 0/R died of wounds, 1 0/R wounded .- B.W.L. 1 0/R/wounded .C.M.R. &. M.G. nil. The total captures in these operations were approximately 350 P of W 7 M.Gs.l Ant Rifle, also a large quantity of transport and other material.

REPORT ON TOPERATIONS AT AMMAN --- 25/9/1918

REF MAP-----AMMAN--1-63360

At 1030 the Regiment was ordered to go into action at a point held by the 6th Wellington M.R. Squadron. The Regt. with one Sect. Indian Mountain Battery and 1 Sect.M.G.attached, moved to Sq.142.W.36.c.2.o. The Guns were here kraux brought into action against redoubts held by the enemy to the EAST. The 4th Sqdn was sent forward to Y.6.b.3.8. to engage one of the enemy's redoubts. Seeing that there was a large portion of the line between this point and the AMMAN-ES SALT Road undefended and that this was a weak spot in the enemy's defence, I moved to Y.6.c.3.5. sending one Squn into action to the East. This Sqdn very soon came under very heavy M.G. Fire. These Machine Guns were engaged by the Artillery, and the Sqdn was able to move forward in

short rushes, a few men at a time.

I still held L Sqdn in hand, awaiting an opportunity to go in mounted. The question of cover for howses, however, proved a great difficulty. At 1530 I sentbthis Sqdn in mounted, they got into action without casualties, but as they halted to dismount, the enemy opened a heavy enfilade machine gun fire, which made it necessary for the led horses to retire.

The Regt. now held a line from X.31.d.3.5. to Y.6.d.3.8. with two strong enemy redoubts on the left and one facing the Right all of which were wired The troops on my right flank were now pushing forward vigouously, and the whole Regiment and a small party of W?M.R. who were with my Regt. moved forwa ward in conjunction. The 4th Sqdm advanced steadily towards the double xexts redoubt on the left. covered by Artillery and M.G.Fire. Both Redoubts put up a white flag and over 60 of the enemy surrendered, to the 4th Sqdn, while a considerable number fled into the WADI AMMAN. The advance continued and all enemy were driven into the main WADI, which ran at right angles to our lines of advance. C.M.R. were now advancing NORTH up the WADI, thus pinning the enemy force in a pocket.

As soon as we reached the WADI AMMAN, I sent one Sqdn.across and established a strong Post at Z.3.a.1.8. and another through the station to the East. there they joined up with thelst L.H.Brogade and the main action was over. All ranks shewed great keenness in their work, I have brought home specially to your notice, 17 Officers and 175 O/Rs.P of W were handed over to C.M.R. and W.M.R. but a considerable number of prisoners captured in the WADI were from our drive in the hills. During the Action we captured 1 4.2"Howitzer(unnumbered), 2.7.5.cm Hows(Nos 1509 & 1510 mk CKL/15) 2-7.5. cm Field Guns (Nos 25 & 26 mkd RHMF) 5 machine guns (Nos 21127, 19791, 21580 19296, 23929) mkd DWM Berlin). There were more machine guns captured but on going over the ground the morning after wevwere unable to find them. A large amount of War material was also secured.
