


#### DEFENSIVE INSTRUCTIONS.

- (1) In the event of active enemy operations commencing against our Front, the two forward Sections of Company now bivouaced at 0.21.c.4.4. will take up position in AUBIGNY Trench System, immediately in rear of 0.21.c.4.4.
- (3) This part of trench system is to be reconneitred by Section Officers concerned.
- (3) Should it be necessary to occupy these trenches for defence, the Senior Subaltern will assume command of half Company, and will send a runner immediately to 9th. Field Coy. H.Q. advising same.
- (4) The two Sections at N.23.central will stand-to, and await instructions from C.R.E., who is to be advised immediately by runner of action taken. This man will remain as a runner to C.R.E.
- (5) All Sappers located (at the time operation commences) forward of VILLERS LINE, will report to the nearest Infantry Commander, Battalion, Company or Platoon as the case may be, with instructions that they ask to be allowed to return to their Section H.Q. as soon as the situation permits.
- (6) All Sappers located forward of 0.21.c.4.4. and in rear of VILLERS LINE, will report to Forward Sections in AUBIGNY SWITCH immediately in rear of 0.21.c.4.4.
- (7) All Sappers working in rear of 0.31.c.4.4. Will report to 9th. Field Coy. H.Q. at N.23.central.
- (8) Officer i/c Transport will reconnoitre route to, and position for Lines North of RIVER SOMME as an alternate position, to be occupied in the event of present Transport Lines being heavily shelled.







his utterdisregard for shell-fire he set a
magnificent example to his men, & bridges were
constructed rapidly in spite of continuous
shelling. A ferry, the only possible river
crossing had been destroyed by shell fire, &
the construction of these bridges therefore
became an urgent necessity.

Vaire-Bouzencourt - 4 to 8/4/18.- For conspicuous courage and devotion to duty shown by him during the construction of a barrel pier footbridgex across Somme near Bouzencourt. By his splendid example and total disregard of shell-fire, bridge was rapidly completed, so that ammunition a stores could be got forward to the front line earlier than appeared possible. He also showed courage & devotion to duty during construction of three other bridges across Somme under shell and machine gun fire.

L/Cpl.(now 2/Cpl.) A. F. YEWDALL,
Hamelet (Somme) 4 to 8/4/18.- For conspicuous
gallantry and devotion to duty. He took charge
of a party of Sappers who had become partly disorganised by shell-fire, got them together, &
thus completed the construction of a barrel pier
bridgea across the Somme, so that, if a withdrawal were necessary, reinforcements, stores
& ammunition could be quickly taken to outpost line.

Driver C. M. HUGHES,

Somme - 4 to 8/4/18. - This man showed considerable courage & devotion to duty when in charge of transport carting bridging materials along the Somme near Bouzencourt on two successive days. During daylight he had to pass through heavy shell-fire, and at night was compelled to go through M.G. fire. It was mainly due to his disregard for danger and personal effort that the bridge material wasgot on the site.

Somme - 4 to 8/4/18.- By his excellent example when in charge of a party of Sappers engaged in construction of barrel pier footbridge across Somme. Largely owing to the courage and determination of this N.C.O. the construction of bridge was rapidly carried out. At this time the ferry, was the only means of retreat, had been destroyed by shell-fire, & the bridge was a very urg ent matter.

Somme - 4 to 8/4/18. - Whilst in charge of a party
detailed to prepare demolition of a bridge, at a
critical period, this N.C.O. exhibited great courage

example to the men in his charge, getting the
demolitions prepared in quick order.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on M.M. the 34th. April 1918 on the Ancre, when a bridge which formed Part of an artillery emergency road was partly demolished by shell-fire, & which was urgently required for the transport of guns being withdrawn from gassed area; he led a party of men through an extremely heavy barrage of both gas and H.E. shells. He continued to repair the bridge under exceptionally heavy shell-fire, and also repaired more damage caused by the heavy bombardment that was in progress whilst he was at work. His absolute disregard of all danger was a magnificent example to the men under his command & resulted in the opening of an urgently required emergency road.


10033 L/Corpl. H. A. BROWNE,

thus securing the days water ration for the garrison.


