

FIRST AUSTRALIAN DIVISIONAL ORDER, No. 92.

Divisional Headquarters
31st May, 1918.

Reference Map.- Sheet 27. SE. 1/20,000

1. (a) The 3rd Aust. Inf. Brigade will carry out an operation against MONT de MERRIS on the morning of 3rd June 1918 at a time to be notified.
(b) Simultaneously, the following action is being taken by other divisions of the Corps -
29th Division. - Attack LUG FARM - Houbos E.23.a.6.8. - ANKLE FARM - Hodgos in E.17.c. west of the BECQUE.
9th Division. - Simulate an attack on METEREN.
2. The objective to be captured and consolidated is the line E.6.c.7.7. - E.6.d.0.7. - E.6.b.7.7. which encloses the area known as MONT de MERRIS.
3. The C.R.A. will arrange with the G.O.C. 3rd Aust. Inf. Bde. for artillery (including Heavy) and M.T.M. assistance during the operation.
Artillery and other activity during the night 2nd/3rd June will be normal up to Zero hour.
4. The G.O.C. 1st Aust. Inf. Brigade will place the 1st A.L.T.M. Bty. at the disposal of G.O.C. 3rd Aust. Inf. Brigade. On completion of allotted tasks this battery will return to its own formation.
5. The C.R.E. will allot one section of Field Engineers to assist the Infantry in laying out and constructing C.T's. and posts.
6. The O.C. 1st Aust. M.G. Battn., will arrange M.G. co-operation direct with G.O.C. 3rd Aust. Inf. Brigade.
7. A Divisional Staff Officer will synchronise watches at the H.Q. 3rd Aust. Inf. Brigade at 6.30.p.m. and at the Div. Artillery H.Q. at 7-p.m. on 2nd June.
8. No reference to this operation is to be made on the telephone

SECRET.FIRST AUSTRALIAN DIVISIONAL ORDER. 93.

1. (a) On the 3rd Inst, the 2nd.Aust.Inf.Bde. will relieve the 1st.Aust.Inf.Bde in the Divisional Support Area and will take over the plans of the Support Brigade for counter-attacks.
 - (b) Camps in the reserve area will be cleared by 9.a.m.
 - (c) One Battalion of the 2nd.Aust.Inf.Bde will be detailed as close support to Line Brigade and will take over the accommodation and plans of "A" Battalion 1st.Aust.Inf.Bde.
 - (d) On relief the 1st.Aust.Inf.Bde will move by march route to the Reserve Brigade Area, and will take over the function of the Reserve Brigade, and the work on buried cable vide 1st.Aust.Div. letter S/8310 dated May 17th.
2. (a) The 2nd.A.I.Bde will march via the LES CINQ RUES.
 - (b) The 1st.A.I.Bde will march via U.22. or U.23. avoiding the road via LES CINQ RUES.
 - (c) The road via LA HAUTE LOGE will not be used.
3. On the 4th inst and night of the 4/5th, the 2nd. Aust.Inf.Bde. will relieve the 3rd.Aust.Inf.Bde in the line.
4. Command will pass on completion of the Infantry relief which will be notified to Divisional Headquarters by priority wire by the relieving Brigade.
5. Advance parties of all units of 2nd.Aust.Inf.Bde taking over will be sent in to all posts twentyfour hours in advance.
6. All maps, plans of work, defence schemes and information of value to the incoming units will be handed over.
7. The original company commanders sketches and dispositions will be forwarded to Divisional H.Q. as soon as possible after relief.
8. In order to ensure continuity of policy the existing dispositions of Brigade will be taken over, and will not be altered except in minor details without reference to Divisional Headquarters, before they are undertaken.
9. (a) On relief the 3rd.Aust.Inf.Bde. will move into Divisional Support and will take over the plans of the Support Brigade for Counter Attack, and will take over the preparation of the 2nd Zone Defences.
 - (b) One battalion of the 3rd.Aust.Inf.Bde. will be detailed to remain in close Support of the 2nd.Aust.Inf.Bde and will take over the accommodation and plans of "A" Battalion 2nd. Aust.Inf.Bde.
10. (a) The Nucleus Battalion of the 2nd.Aust.Inf.Bde. will be reformed and will relieve the Nucleus Battalion of the 3rd.Aust. Inf.Bde in the BORRE and PRADELLES Defences.
 - (b) On relief the personnel of Nucleus Battalion of the 3rd. Aust.inf.Bde. will rejoin their Units.
11. Machine Gun and Engineer relief will be arranged by the O.C. M.Gun Battalion and the C.R.E. respectively. These reliefs will not take place simultaneously with the Infantry relief.



APPENDIX V

CONTACT AEROPLANE DEMONSTRATION.

Reference Sheet. 36A.

1. A contact acroplane demonstration will take place on 1st June.
2. The objects of the demonstration are :-
- (a) To demonstrate the various methods of indicating our positions to acroplanes.
 - (b) To enable troops to judge the various heights at which acroplanes are flying.
 - (c) To practice transmitting messages by means of acroplanes.
3. For the purpose of the demonstration trenches will be manned as under :-
- 5th Battalion - Trench running from C.16.B.2.0. - C.10.D.4.0. - C.10.D.8.2.
 - 7th Battalion - Trench running from C.10.D.8.2. (exclusive) - C.11.C.2.0.
 - 6th Battalion - Trench running from C.16.B.7.3. - C.17.A.1.6.
 - 8th Battalion. - Trench running from C.17.A.1.6. (exclusive) - C.17.A.55.05.
4. The following troops (not less than 400 per Battalion) will attend the demonstration :-
- (a) All Lewis Gunners.
 - (b) All Signallers.
 - (c) All Officers and men who are not thoroughly familiar with contact acroplane work.
5. All Troops will be in position by 1-50 P.M.
6. The following methods of indicating positions to the contact acroplane will be employed :-
- (a) Groups of four rifles each rifle at an interval of one foot from the next will be laid on the parapet about every 60 yds. with muzzles facing towards the front. 20
 - (b) On the acroplane calling for same by means of its claxon horn ground flares will be lit in the bottom of the trench.

- It should be explained to troops that in actual practice only the most advanced troops must light flares.
7. To indicate the height at which the acroplane is flying the following lights will be fired :-
- | | |
|-----------|------------------------------|
| 500 feet | White |
| 1000 feet | Red |
| 2000 feet | Red and White in succession. |
| 3000 feet | Red and Green in succession. |
- Lewis Gunners will take particular notice of these lights and it should be impressed on them that Lewis gun fire is practically useless against acroplanes when flying above 3,000 feet. Lewis guns will be mounted in the trenches and A.A. sights employed. No loaded magazine must be in the possession of any Lewis gunner.
8. Acroplane signalling stations will be established at or on the vicinity of Brigade Headquarters, C.9.D.7.4.; 5th Battalion Hqrs., C.16.L.2.4.; and 7th Battalion Hqrs., C.11.C.5.7. Ground sheets and POPHAM panels will be used and short messages signalled from each Battalion Headquarters to the acroplane which will then drop them at the Brigade Headquarters station.




9. C.O.'s will arrange for short lectures to be delivered to the men prior to the demonstration, explaining to them what it is intended to carry out, and also the importance of contact flying.
10. In conjunction with the aeroplane demonstration message rockets will be used. Each Battalion will fire between the hours of 2 P.M. and 3 P.M. two rockets bearing messages to Brigade Headquarters. C.C. No. 4 Signal Section will arrange to post sentries in the vicinity of Brigade Headquarters to warn all passers by and to collect the rockets.

3rd. June. 1918.DEFENCE ORGANISATION SERIES "B" No. 21.Reorganisation of the Divisional Area
on a 2 Brigade front basis.

1. The enemy has practically completed his offensive preparations on the LYS battle front and may become active any day. The Army Commander attaches great importance to the STRAZELLE Spur and to ensure more effective control of our defensive Organisation wishes the front to be reorganised on a 2 - brigade basis.
2. The Divisional Commander proposes to carry out the reorganisation on the lines indicated on the attached map with effect from the night 7th/8th June, the 2nd Aust. Inf. Brigade holding the Right Section and the 1st. Aust. Inf. Brigade holding the left section.
3. The tactical responsibility of Brigadiers will extend to the Reserve line (inclusive) but the work responsibility will extend to the D Line (inclusive).
4. (a) Under Divisional arrangements the Nucleus Battalion of the line brigades will provide (In case of attack) nucleus garrisons for B and C lines.
 (b) The 1st. Aust. Pioneer Battalion will retain the present living accommodation and will provide nucleus garrisons on existing lines for -
 I. COURTE CROIX Switch and KLINE HILL - One Company
 II. ROUGE CROIX - One Company.
 III. PRADELLES - One Company.
 IV. BORRE. - One Company.
 (v) Nucleus garrisons for the 'D' Line will be provided under Divisional arrangements (probably the Field and Special Engineer Companies.)
5. The C.R.E. will arrange direct with Brigades or the allotment of tasks to the Pioneer Battalion.
6. "Q" Branch is making arrangements to meet requirements in trench shelters.
7. Reconnaissances for additional Headquarters should be made at once so that communications can be organised.
8. The Reserve Brigade will continue to spend 8 days in the SERCUS Area.

1. (a) On the 7th June the 1st.Aust.Inf.Brigade will relieve the 3rd.Aust.Inf.Brigade in the Divisional Support Area and will take over the plans of the Support Brigade for counter-attacks.
 - (b) The Reserve Area will be cleared by 9.a.m.
 - (c) One Battalion of the 1st.Aust.Inf.Brigade will be detailed as close Support to the Line Brigade and will take over the accommodation and plans of "A" Battalion 3rd.Aust.Inf.Brigade.
 - (d) On relief the 3rd.Aust.Inf.Brigade will move by march route to the Reserve Brigade area, and will take over the function of the Reserve Brigade, and the work on buried cable vide 1st.Aust.Div. letter S/3310 dated May 17th.
2. (a) The 1st.Aust.Inf.Brigade will march via the LES CINQ RUES.
 - (b) The 3rd.Aust.Inf.Brigade will march via U.22. or U.23. avoiding the road via LES CINQ RUES.
 - (c) The road via LA HAUTE LOGE will not be used.
3. On the 8th June and night of the 8th/9th June the Divisional Sector will be re-organised on a 2-Brigade front as indicated in 1st.Aust.Div. Defence Organisation Series "B" No. 21. and Map attached thereto, as under:-
 - (a) The 1st.Aust.Inf.Brigade will relieve all troops of the 2nd.Aust.Inf.Brigade NORTH of the inter-brigade boundary given.
 - (b) The exact inter-brigade boundary will be determined by Brigade Commanders in consultation and combined posts will be established on both flanks of Brigades in each line held.
 - (c) The G.O.C. 2nd.Aust.Inf.Brigade will dispose the troops relieved by the 1st.Aust.Inf.Brigade in his own Brigade Sector.
 - (d) Vickers Guns in the FORWARD ZONE will come under the tactical direction of the Brigade Commander in whose section they are situated.
 - (e) The C.R.A. will arrange for liaison officers at the Headquarters of both Brigades.
 - (f) The 1st.Aust.Pioneer Battalion will retain its present living quarters.
 - (g) The C.R.E. will allot a Field Company for duty in each Brigade sector.
 - (h) The O.C. 1st.Aust.M.G.Battalion will arrange the necessary M.G. reliefs but not on the same night as the Infantry relief.
4. Command will pass on the completion of the Infantry relief which will be notified to Divisional Headquarters by priority wire by both Brigades.
5. Advance parties of all units of the 1st.Aust.Inf.Brigade taking over will be sent into all posts 24 hours in advance.
6. All maps, plans of work, defence schemes and information of value to the incoming units will be handed over.
7. The nucleus battalions of the 2nd. and 1st.Aust.Inf.Brigades will be located respectively at the present 'D' and 'C' Battalion Support Brigade locations.

The nucleus left out by each Battalion is not to exceed the correct proportion of the number laid down for a full Battalion.

SECTION VI.WORKS POLICY.1. RESPONSIBILITY.

(i) The Division is responsible for the organisation and for the preparation of the

- {a} FORWARD ZONE.
- {b} SECOND ZONE.

(ii) (a) The Brigades in the line are responsible for the construction and maintenance of the defences within their respective sections in both the FORWARD and SECOND Zones.

(b) The C.R.E. will arrange for an engineer field company to be available for technical assistance and supervision in each Brigade Section.

(c) The C.R.E. after consultation with Brigadiers will allot tasks to the Pioneer Battalion.

(d) The Pioneer nucleus garrisons will develop the defences of the localities which they are detailed to defend. If considered necessary the C.R.E. will arrange for the extra working parties.

2. WORKING PARTIES.

(i) Working parties as a general rule will be detailed by platoons or companies whose officers will invariably accompany them. To avoid waste of personnel and work time it is essential that tasks are laid out on the ground before the parties arrive.

All work will be allotted as piece work.

Rendezvous must be clearly indicated to every party and arrangements made to ensure that when parties arrive they are promptly distributed to their tasks.

(ii) PROGRAMMES OF WORK. In order to ensure continuity of policy programmes of work will invariably be handed over to relieving troops. Details of hours, routes, hostile shelling should also be handed over.

(iii) Before relief Infantry Commanders are responsible for showing relieving officers over the works for which they are providing working parties.

3. ORDER OF WORK.

The order of importance of work on all systems is as follows;

(i) Selection and constructions of sites for M.G. emplacements. Many houses can be converted into strong M.G. positions.

(ii) Wiring. Tactical wiring, sited with reference to Machine Gun positions, is the most urgent and the FORWARD ZONE is to have preference.

(iii) Provision of splinter proof cover for garrisons and M.G. detachments.

(iv) Connecting the various posts and strong points in defensive systems and defended localities.

(v) Construction of communication trenches from

- (a) Reserve to Support Systems.
- (b) Support to Firing Line Systems.

4. NOTICE BOARDS.

(i) All strong points, M.G. positions, Works, trenches and Headquarters must be clearly marked.

(ii) Direction and name boards are to be placed at the intersection of the routes and trenches and at the junction of trench lines.

APPENDIX. ||

APPENDIX 5.A.DEFENDED LOCALITY OF STRAZEELE.

1. Object. The defended locality of STRAZEELE forms the Southern eminence of the STRAZEELE - ROUGE CROIX ridge. This ridge screens a large portion of the Divisional area from enemy ground observation. The defended locality forms a strong point which supports the SUPPORT SYSTEM. In addition it flanks a hostile advance along the railway and directly opposes any general attack against the Divisional front.
2. Works. have been constructed to provide for all round defence.
3. The garrison allotted to STRAZEELE consists of One Company of Infantry from 'C' Battalion of the right Brigade in line. No Vickers Machine Guns are located inside the defences but the guns allotted to the defence of the FORWARD ZONE give adequate support.
4. The defence of STRAZEELE falls within the tactical responsibility of the G.O.C. the right Brigade in line who will issue the necessary detailed instructions.
5. Preliminary arrangements.
 - (a) The garrison of STRAZEELE will be quartered in the close vicinity of the defences.
 - (b) 300 rounds S.A.A. per rifle, 10 No. 23 Grenades per man, 15 No. 36 Rifle Grenades per Gun discharger, and 5.000 rounds per Lewis gun will be maintained in the defences.
 - (c) 24 hours reserve ration of food and water will be maintained.
6. Action. When attack is clearly indicated the garrison will occupy the defences. In the event of a gas bombardment the direction of the wind should be noted and the garrison moved accordingly.
7. Medical and Communication requirements will be provided for in the general defensive Scheme of the Brigade.

APPENDIX. II

APPENDIX. 5. B.DEFENCE OF PRADELLES (W.21.)

1. Object. A strong point has been established at PRADELLES, whose object is to deny a hostile advance, or to form a pivot for our troops if required.
2. The village, sited on the reverse slope of the STRAZEELE - ROUGE CROIX ridge, is distant some 2,000 yards from both those points and is overlooked by practically the whole of that ridge. It is virtually in the Reserve Line, Forward Zone.
3. Works have been constructed to meet attack from
 - (a) STRAZEELE village, along the STRAZEELE-PRADELLES Road.
 - (b) The S.E. if an enemy advance breaks our line in the vicinity of the MONT de MERRIS, and an advance takes place astride the railway.
 - (c) The N.E. from the STRAZEELE-ROUGE CROIX ridge. These works are shewn on attached plan.
4. The Garrison allotted to PRADELLES Strong point consists of one company of the Divisional Pioneer Battalion. A skeleton garrison of 1 platoon will be maintained at all times in this strong point. Improvements and repairs will be carried out by this skeleton garrison, supplemented by working parties when necessary. The skeleton garrison will be relieved periodically by other platoons of the company, thus ensuring that all are conversant with the locality and its work.
5. Command of this strong point is vested in the G.O.C. right line Brigade. Local command will be exercised by the officer commanding the Pioneer Company. His command post will be at W.21.M.1.1.
6. Preliminary arrangements. (a) All officers and N.C.O.s of the company detailed to PRADELLES S.P. will reconnoitre the routes from bivouac to trenches and will make themselves acquainted with the trenches they are to occupy when ordered.
 - (b) 300 rounds S.A.A. per rifle, 10 No.23 bombs per man and 15 No. 36 Rifle Bombs per Cup Discharger will be maintained in the trenches, in addition to 5,000 rounds per Lewis Gun.
 - (c) Sufficient S.A.A. to fill each man up to 200 rounds and No. 23 bombs to issue two per man will be maintained under Pioneer Battalion arrangements.
 - (d) A.D.M.S. will allot a Medical Officer, who will in consultation with O.C. PRADELLES Defences arrange a R.A.P. and stretcher bearers.
7. (a) On receipt of the order "Adopt Precautionary Stage" the garrison will complete up to 200 rounds S.A.A. and 2 Mills. Bombs from stocks at Battalion Headquarters. In addition, 1 days iron rations will be carried. 200 gallons of water and 200 M & V biscuits rations will be drawn and stored where most likely to escape hostile shelling. This garrison will proceed to man the trenches in the PRADELLES Defences.
 - (b) Signal communication will be opened with Brigade Headquarters.
 - (c) A regimental Aid Post will be established and stretcher bearers allotted. M.O. in S (a) will take charge of this.
 - (d) When all troops are in position, inform G.O.C. right line brigade to that effect.
 - (e) Straggler Posts will be established.

8. Action. When the direction of attack is clearly indicated dispositions will be amended suitably. Until this is the case the company should occupy the trenches on both sides of the road with patrols towards the col between STRAZEELE and ROUGE CROIX, towards STRAZEELE and towards the railway about E.S.D. Liaison patrols should link the Reserve Line to PRADELLES Defences. Without written orders from the G.O.C. right line Brigade no withdrawal from PRADELLES Defences is to take place. It may be anticipated that the garrison will be augmented by stragglers, and, if our front and support lines are bent back, by units from those lines.

APPENDIX 5 C.DEFENCE OF BORRE. (W.19.)

1. Object. A strong point has been established at BORRE, whose object is to deny a hostile advance, and to form a pivot and delaying point.
2. The village covers the approach to HAZEBROUCK, by the STRAZEELE, PRADELLES Road. It is sited on a slight eminence which falls away to the S. and S.E., and overlooks a large area, as far as the Railway. On the N. the ground is flat and covered with crops. The Forward Zone and "B" line of the Second Zone cover the village.
3. Works have been constructed to deny approach from any direction. They are especially strong to meet an attack from the S. and S.E. The System STRAZEELE PRADELLES, BORRE should delay any attack in order to permit a Counter-attack to be organised and carried out. Earth works and wire are shown in attached plan.
4. The fighting garrison for BORRE defences will be one company of the Divisional Pioneer Battalion. A skeleton garrison of 1 Platoon will be maintained at all times in this strong point. Improvements and repairs will be carried out by this skeleton garrison, supplemented by working parties from the Pioneer Battalion when necessary.
5. Command. The Commander of the garrison company will command the BORRE defences directly under the orders of Divisional H.Q. until such time as BORRE is included in the area of tactical responsibility of the G.O.C. right line brigade. Command post will be at BRASSTRIE (W.19.C.8.S.)
6. Preliminary arrangements - (a) All Officers and N.C.O.s of the company detailed to BORRE defences will reconnoitre the routes from bivouac to trenches and will make themselves acquainted with the trenches and surroundings.
 (b) 500 rounds S.A.A. per man, 15 No. 38 Rifle Bombs per Gun Discharger, 10 No. 23 Bombs per man and 3,000 rounds S.A.A. per Lewis Gun will be maintained in the trenches.
 (c) Sufficient S.A.A. to fill each man up to 200 rounds and No. 23. Bombs to issue 2 per man will be maintained under Pioneer Battalion arrangements.
 (d) A.D.M.S. will allot a Medical Officer, who in consultation with O.C. BORRE Defences, will arrange a R.A.P. and Stretcher Bearers.
7. (a) On receipt of the order "Adopt Precautionary Stage" the garrison will complete up to 200 rounds S.A.A. and 2 Mills Bombs from stocks. In addition 1 days Iron Rations will be carried. This garrison will proceed to man the BORRE Defences.
 (b) Signal Communication will be opened with Headquarters right line Brigade.
 (c) A Regimental Aid Post will be established and stretcher bearers allotted. M.O. in 6 (d) will take charge of this.
 (d) When all troops are in position, inform Headquarters right line Brigade.
 (e) Straggler Posts will be established.
8. Action. When the direction of attack is clearly indicated dispositions will be amended suitably. Until the direction of attack is clear the garrison will occupy the trenches N and S. of the PRADELLES-HAZEBROUCK Road. Liaison patrols will maintain touch with PRADELLES garrison and the troops occupying the "B" Line, second zone defences. Without orders from Divisional or Brigade Headquarters, no withdrawal from BORRE Defences is to take place.

APPENDIX 5 (d)

DEFENCE OF ROUGE CROIX. {W.10.} {W.16.}

1. Object. The defended locality of ROUGE CROIX forms the northern eminence of the STRAZEELE - ROUGE CROIX ridge. This ridge screens a large portion of the Divisional area from enemy observation and permits unobserved movement by our Reserve Troops.
The defended locality forms a strong point, which with FLETRE, supports the Reserve Line.
In addition it flanks a hostile advance by the METEREN BECQUE and directly opposes an advance from STRAZEELE.
2. Works. have been constructed to provide for all round defence.
3. The Garrison allotted to ROUGE CROIX consists of a skeleton force of Pioneers (platoon) up to the Precautionary Stage (after which it is increased to 1 Company) and 2 machine guns of the 1st. M.G. Battalion.
4. Command of ROUGE CROIX defences will pass to Commander of the Company detailed by the Divisional Pioneer Battalion when the Precautionary Stage is adopted. His command post will be W.10.C.95.35.
5. Preliminary arrangements (a) All Officers and N.C.O.s of the company detailed in para 3. will reconnoitre the routes from assembly position to trenches, and will make themselves acquainted with the trenches they are to occupy when ordered.
(b) 300 rounds S.A.A. per rifle, 10 No. 23 Bombs per man, and 15 No.36 Rifle Bombs, per Cup Discharger, will be maintained in the trenches in addition to 5.000 rounds per Lewis Gun (30.000 rounds). O.C. 1st.Pioneer Battalion will arrange this for the complete garrison.
(c) Sufficient S.A.A. to fill each man up to 200 rounds and No. 23 Bombs to issue 2 per man will be maintained under Pioneer Battalion arrangements.
6. (a) On receipt of the order "Adopt Precautionary Stage" the company detailed will complete up to scale in para 5 (c) above and will carry 1 days Iron Rations. They will then proceed to man their trenches in the ROUGE CROIX defences.
Command will pass to O.C. Company.
(b) Communication will be opened with Support Battalion Headquarters, left Brigade.
(c) Straggler Posts will be established.
(d) When all troops are in position, inform left line Brigade H.Q. who will pass the information to D.H.Q.
7. Action. When the direction of attack is clearly indicated dispositions will be amended suitably. Until this is the case, the garrison should occupy the trenches to the N.E. and E. of ROUGE CROIX.
Liaison patrols should work to FLETRE and to the col between ROUGE CROIX and STRAZEELE.

Without written orders from the G.O.C. left line Brigade no withdrawal from the ROUGE CROIX defences is to take place.

APPENDIX 5 E.APPENDIX IIALLOTMENT OF NUCLEUS GARRISONS.1. GENERAL PRINCIPLES.

(a) The Brigades in the line will provide the fighting garrisons for the Firing line and Support Systems of the FORWARD ZONE for the defended locality of STRAZEELE and nucleus garrisons for the Reserve System when necessary.

(b) Nucleus garrisons will be found from sources outside of the Brigades in the line for such of the defences as are considered likely to become involved in the fighting at an early stage of the enemy's attack.

(c) Nucleus garrisons will on no account advance from their allotted positions for the purpose of counter-attack. Commanders of nucleus garrisons will take under their command any stragglers or troops driven out of positions further forward, and will defend their own positions on the lines laid down for the garrison of a front line trench.

2. DETAILS OF NUCLEUS GARRISONS.

(a) Defences for which nucleus garrisons are detailed and the units furnishing them, are as follows:-

3. In the case of VII the nucleus garrisons will not be ordered to their positions until the "Precautionary Stage" is ordered and in the case of VIII units will not take up their positions until in receipt of an order from C.R.E.

4. Commanders of nucleus garrisons will allot their Commands by platoons or Sections (Engineers only) to points of greatest tactical advantage in the defences for which they are responsible. They must bear in mind that for brief period, during which reinforcing or broken troops are being organised, the Nucleus garrisons may have to bear the whole pressure of the hostile attack and their plans should provide for action accordingly.

5. Units supplying Nucleus garrisons are responsible for procuring and placing in the defences the authorised reserves of S.A.A. grenades, and 24 hours rations of food and water.

6. The names of Commanders of Nucleus garrisons, or of the Company sectors allotted, will be notified to D.H.Q. by the H.Q. of the formation or unit concerned. This applies also to subsequent changes.

APPENDIX 7.ACTION DURING "PRECAUTIONARY STAGE"

1. Should indications point to the enemy making a general attack within 48 hours a "Precautionary Stage" will be ordered. The message from D.H.Q. to formations and units concerned will be "ADOPT PRECAUTIONARY STAGE".
2. On receipt of the message from D.H.Q. the following action will be taken forthwith.

BRIGADES in the line-

will

- (i) Assume command over all the defences in advance of the "B" Line and any nucleus garrisons posted thereto.
- (ii) Issue instructions to the nucleus battalions to move to and man the B and C Lines.

RESERVE BRIGADE.

The G.O.C. will

- (i) Move the Brigade group to the bivouac positions detailed in Appendix 2.
- (ii) Issue instructions to reform the nucleus battalion.

1st. AUST. M.G. BATTALION. - The O.B. will despatch 2 Vickers Guns (from "O" Company) to occupy positions in the ROUGE CROIX defences.

1st. AUST. PIONEER BATTALION.

The companies will occupy the trenches and posts to which they have been detailed as garrisons.

3. Iron rations to be issued to the troops if not already done.
4. Completion of any part of the action ordered under para. 2 will be reported by wire to Divisional Headquarters.

1. No. 2. Special Coy R.E. is no longer available as Nucleus garrison for a section of the 'D' Line.
2. The Engineer Field Company in the Reserve Area will supply the nucleus garrison for the section V.23.D.6.3. to V.17.D.3.0. vice No. 2. Special Coy. R.E.
3. When nucleus garrisons are ordered to occupy the 'D' Line, Company Commanders are responsible for providing the necessary reserves of S.A.A. grenades, and water. The A.A. Lewis Guns will be taken to the trench and not with the transport.
4. In the right section, the trench will be held very thinly, the majority of the men will be moved forward to the canal and dug in on the eastern bank. Shovels must be taken for this purpose.
A post of this section must be established immediately South of the railway to deny the enemy possession of the railway embankment from which the Canal could be enfiladed.

PROVISIONAL DEFENCE SCHEME.CENTRE DIVISION - XV CORPS.

The following amendments and additions to the above Scheme will come into force forthwith.

I. Section II. para 2.

Add fresh sub-para (vi)

"The line of the COURTE CROIX Switch, STRAZEELE STRAZEELE Avenue, and the Reservoir System as far as the right boundary has been laid down by the Corps as the Divisional portion of the Main Line of Resistance of the FORWARD ZONE."

2. Section II. para 4 (ii) (a)

Cancel from "Two" to "System" and substitute - "Two Brigades, plus 3 Companies of Pioneers, hold the FORWARD ZONE. Each Brigade has two battalions in the line, one in Support, and one in Reserve.

The garrison of the Main Line of resistance will consist of

COURTE CROIX SWITCH -	One Company, Left Brigade. One Company, Pioneers (less 1 Platoon.)
STRAZEELE	- One Company, Right Brigade.
STRAZEELE AVENUE	- One Company, Right Brigade.
RESERVE SYSTEM	- One Company, Right Brigade.

This garrison will not be used for purposes of Counter-Attack but will ensure the integrity of the Main Line of resistance while freeing the remainder of the troops for purposes of Counter-Attack forward of this line.

1. Owing to the increase in the number of troops forward, the Divisional Commander desires to draw attention to the added necessity for care in avoiding hostile observation. The increase in the number of troops is greatest in the FORWARD AREA of the left Brigade and it is there that the greatest danger exists. In exposed places this must be explained to the men.
2. Living quarters are given away by undue movement (particularly when aeroplanes and balloons are up), by building over head cover across the trench, and by tracks leading directly to the area. Much of the fire can be avoided if the trench is maintained throughout in an unobstructed condition.
3. East of the line W.8.Central - W.26.Central traffic is to be restricted as much as possible during the hours of daylight and vehicular traffic is to be confined to Ambulances and cycles. Brigades will arrange to establish traffic control posts on the main roads in W.8 & W.20. (B and D) to ensure this instruction being observed. Boards notifying the restriction should be erected at these points by the Engineers.
4. The question of tracks in relation to living areas under wet weather conditions should receive early consideration.

DEFENCE ORGANISATION SERIES "B" No. 22.

WORKING PARTIES AND RESPONSIBILITY FOR WORK.

The Divisional Commander desires to re-affirm the Divisional policy in regard to working parties and responsibility for work generally. The following points are published for the guidance of all concerned.

1. The Divisional Commander decides the general policy to be adopted. The general task and type of proposed work are submitted for his approval before the work is ordered.
2. Brigade Commanders within the areas allotted to them from time to time are responsible for the development of approved defences for the initiation of work and for maintenance.
Proposals for alterations or additions should be submitted for approval before such work is commenced.
All available men are to be employed on the defences daily, at hours suitable to the prevailing visibility conditions.
3. Working parties are to be detailed by platoons or companies, which are to be accompanied by their officers. An officer must accompany all parties of over 10 men and the Company Commander (or Second in Command) must be present when the company furnishes two platoons.
4. Engineer Field Companies are available to assist Brigade Commanders with advice and assistance regarding -
 - (a) the most economical method of organising the work and distributing the working parties.
 - (b) the relative local urgency of work,
 - (c) the engineer material required and available, and
 - (d) the lay-out of the work to be undertaken.

Engineer Officers, with Sapper Assistants, will be detailed for technical supervision on lines or areas (which may consist of 2 or 3 lines) of defence and will be on duty whenever working parties are employed. They will invariably report to the Brigade H.Q. (through O.C. Field Coy) any failure or neglect on the part of the working parties.
5. The task is to be explained to the officer in charge of the working party before the working period commences and he is responsible that the task is performed according to plan.
Under no circumstances will the Engineer personnel be permitted to assume control of the Infantry or the task but they will bring to the notice of the Officer in charge of the party of any faults in the execution of the work.
6. As a general rule troops will construct the defences from which they are to fight and their employment elsewhere must be regarded as exceptional.
Men of Machine Gun Companies will construct their own emplacements and shelters except where concrete is used.
7. The Pioneer Battalion works directly under the C.R.E. who will arrange with Brigade Commanders for its employment on tasks requiring skilled or more highly organised labour.
8. Copies of "Instructions for Commanders of Working Parties" are forwarded herewith. Every Commander of a working party is to carry a copy of those Instructions.

ORDERS FOR OFFICERS OR N.C.Os IN CHARGE OF
INFANTRY WORKING PARTIES.

1. The Officer or N.C.O. in charge of a working party is responsible that -
 - (a) He ascertains the exact nature of the task his party is to perform.
 - (b) That he allots each man of his party a sufficient task to keep him reasonably occupied for the number of working hours allotted.
2. He will supervise the work of his men closely and see that it is executed in accordance with plan.
3. If there is danger of aerial observation he will distribute the men in small parties to avoid this.
4. He will allow men who have completed their tasks to return to their quarters but will not allow any man to leave until he has completed his task satisfactorily.
5. He is responsible for the class of work done by his party.
