



## CIVIL TRAINING.

### CIRCULAR No. 1.

Divisional Headquarters,  
1st December, 1918.

The Divisional Agricultural Class, with an attendance of 25, has been in progress during the past month at ALIERY, for the purpose of giving instruction in general Agricultural work suitable for small holdings. Lectures and Demonstrations have been given in Horse Management, General Agriculture, Fertilizers, Orchards, Wheelwright's repairs, Saddlery repairs, Horse shoeing and Farm Book-keeping.

2. Extensive Classes - The ALIERY Agricultural Class extends over a period of 25 working days, during which time members are detached from their units. As accommodation is at present limited, it has been decided to extend the classes to Brigade Groups by sending Lecturers to various centres. Table of dates and places is given in annexed Table. This syllabus will be extended to the use of Internal Combustion engines, in farm work, and special crops as Instructors become available.

Divisional units in the vicinity of these centres who have members desirous of attending will report the number to the Staff Captain of the Brigade concerned before 10-0 a.m. on 3rd instant.

In the case of a move, these, or any other lectures or classes will be discontinued, and re-commenced immediately on arrival in new area.



AUSTRALIAN CORPS.

### EDUCATION.

1. It is proposed to establish a Corps Central School in France at which advanced instruction in various subjects will be given.

2. One department of this School will be devoted entirely to instruction of a University standard.

3. It is intended to provide to the fullest extent instruction in the subjects of the Arts, Law, and Education Departments to the standard required by the 1st. and 2nd. year Examinations at Australian Universities, and in the subjects required by the Science, Engineering and Agricultural Departments for the first year Examinations.

In addition instruction will be afforded to selected Third Year Students in Arts, Law, and Education who require only one subject to qualify for the first degree in these departments.

4. As this course will take at least four months it will be necessary for all intending students to forego for that period all rights of priority of demobilization.

iso

5. To final<sup>ise</sup> the organization a complete census of all Under-graduate and Post graduate University Students in the Corps is necessary. As this return will be the basis, not only of the organization of this School but of further extensions to University Education in English Universities and Scientific Institutes, it is hoped that ~~it~~ will be made with the greatest regard to completeness and accuracy.

6. A return shewing all such University Students, classified as follows, with records as per attached pro-forma, will be forwarded to reach Corps Headquarters by December 9th.

- (a) Matriculated University Students who wish to complete 1st year Arts, Law, Medicine, Education, Science, Engineering, Veterinary Science, and Agriculture.



TO ALL UNITS.

To ... re. PEACE DESPATCH.

The instructions regarding the Supplementary New Year's Despatch, 1919, issued on the 19th November, 1918, (No. "WQ" 74/343) is cancelled.

Instructions have now been received for the preparation of a final Honours Despatch, which will be known as the "Peace Despatch".

The period to be covered will be from September 17th, inclusive, to December 31st, inclusive. Recommendations in connection with this Despatch should include:-

(a). Services rendered between midnight 16/17th September and cessation of hostilities - November 11th.

(b). Services rendered between the cessation of hostilities (Nov. 11th) and the closing date of the Peace Despatch, (midnight 31st December 1918/1st. Jany. 1919). Although the allotment has been based on the composition of the Forces previous to this period, recommendations must come out of the allotment of the officer making the recommendation. Recommendations will necessarily be exceptional and should only be submitted in special cases. No extra allotment can be given to meet such cases.

(c). Services which do not fall under (a) or (b) above in the case of officers, soldiers or others under your command, whose names may have possibly been held over for future consideration, or whose services - rendered during the period covered by the New Year's Despatch 1919 (Feby. 25th.-Sept. 16th) - were brought to notice subsequent to the closing of that Despatch.

2. Recommendations for the peace Despatch will not be submitted until AFTER the New Year's Gazette 1919, has been published.

YOUR RECOMMENDATIONS must reach these Headquarters not later than 6th. January 1919.

3. (a). Headquarters of Formations will be responsible for the submission of recommendations concerning all those who were under their command, or administered by them at 11 a.m. on Novbr. 11th. 1918. If there is any doubt in the case of a unit on the move at that hour, it will count as part of the formation it has just left.

(b). At the same time any reward recommended for an officer or men who may have left a formation in which he is considered to have earned reward, must form part of those of the officer making the recommendation.

(c). No recommendation will be sent to the formation to which the officer or man may have been transferred. An exception may be made in the case of a recommendation for the Commander of a Formation or unit which has been transferred complete.

(d). Recommendations for commanders will come out of the allotment to the unit which they command.

4. The proportion of honours to mentions for officers will be 2 to 3. A separate allotment of Honours and Mentions will be given for "other ranks", the proportion being 3 medals to 1 mention. The number of recommendations submitted for the D.C.M. will in no case be larger than those for the M.S.M.

5. (a). Except in special circumstances, or for particularly gallant services, no officer should be recommended who has received two rewards in any of the following Gazettes, or Supplements, bearing the same date:-

3rd June 1918. 1st Jany. 1919.  
1st Jany. 1918.

Two rewards are to be regarded as either two promotions, brevet or substantive, or one promotion and one decoration, or two decorations.

(b). If an officer or man received an honour in the Gazette bearing date Jany. 1st. 1919, a recommendation for no honour in this Peace Despatch should be most exceptional. (See para 59 (a) of S.S. 477).

(c). Excessive rewards or duplication of rewards should be carefully guarded against, and it must be impressed on all concerned that when framing recommendations the rewards already conferred on the individual during the war must not be lost sight of.

6. Special attention is drawn to the amendments to para 64(a) of S.S. 477 which were issued with G.R.O. 5667, regarding recommendations for the award of the M.S.M.

7. Recommendations for the Peace Despatch will be prepared and assembled in exactly the same manner as previously and in accordance with the instructions contained in Section III of S.S. 477 dated September 1918.

8. For instructions regarding the conditions governing the award of the B.E.O., D.S.O., and M.C., see attachment marked "A".

9. (a). Particulars of all officers must be verified by the latest available official list and a certificate forwarded to that effect.

(b). Recommendations for different honours should NOT be on the same form.

(c). Recommendations for officers and other ranks belonging to different arms of the Service must not be submitted on the same Army Form.

(d). Description and class of all Chaplains must be given.

(e). An alternative should (where possible) be stated with all recommendations for brevet or substantive promotion.

(f). Attention is directed to War Office letter No. 0137/5252 (M.S.Z) (issued in connection with the last Despatch) regarding qualifications for the award of the D.S.O., M.C., and D.C.M.

APPENDIX "A".

The following rules will be observed in recommending for the British Empire Order, the Distinguished Service Order, and the Military Cross in the Honours Despatch.

(a). The award of the D.S.O. and the M.C. will be recommended for "services in action" only.

(b). "Services in action" will be held to mean:-

- (i). Services under fire.
- (ii). Distinguished individual services in connection with air raids, bombardments, or other enemy action which at the time produces conditions equivalent to services in actual combat, and demands the same personal elements of command, initiative or control on the part of the individuals and, in a lesser degree only possibly, entails the same risks.

(c). The wish of the Army Council is that the B.E.O. shall be considered to bear the same relation to the D.S.O. and M.C. in the case of officers, as the N.S.M. bears to the D.G.M. and M.M. in the case of other ranks.

(d). The appointment held by the individual (whether Staff, Departmental or Regimental) has no bearing on the case; the services performed by him are the criterion.

(e). In submitting recommendations for the D.S.O. and M.C., A.F.W. 3121 must show clearly that the action for which the recommendation is made comply with the above rules; unless this is done the D.S.O. and M.C. will not be awarded.

(f). The following examples are given by M.S. to G. in C. as typical cases in which one or other of these rewards should be recommended:-

A Transport Officer is recommended for wholehearted devotion to his especial duty. He has lavished time and labour on his animals and vehicles, with the result that the unit has frequently been complimented on their state by superior authority, and has won the first prize at an Army show. The B.E.O. is a suitable reward.

Another Transport Officer has never failed to deliver ammunition and rations to his unit, night after night he has been exposed to shell and machine gun fire, but he has always succeeded in his task. The D.S.O. or M.C. would be the reward.

CIRCULAR MEMORANDUM No. "Q" 42/34.

12th. December, 1918.

The following instructions are issued with a view to assist in the compilation of the Demobilization Form recently issued:-

1. One officer per Company/equivalent unit or will be selected to fill in a form for each Officer and Other Rank of the Company etc., commencing on the 17th. inst.

2. The form is to be explained to the Companies before the 17th. inst., and a copy posted on each Company and Battalion Notice Board.

No answers are to be recorded unless the question and its bearing has been explained in the hearing of the soldier concerned. No addition or alteration is to be made after the soldier has signed, but the form may be cancelled upon dispute, and a fresh one made out.

Care is to be taken to ensure that the form is carefully and neatly made out in ink by the officer or clerk concerned.

3. The forms will be completed alphabetically.

4. Where more than one occupation has been followed for any length of time, such occupations should be mentioned in paras 8 and (d) of the form. If there is not sufficient space to give full details opposite those paras, they should be entered in the column for General Remarks and cross referenced.

5. Under General Remarks, soldiers should be recommended to record:-

- (a).- Total service in the field.
- (b).- Whether wounded (and action) number of times, severity of wounds, M.I.D.
- (c).- Nature of employment and promotion in A.I.F.
- (j).- Whether desirous to live in Country or City.
- (k).- Whether willing to work at other trades.
- (l).- Land and cash desired.

6. It is in the Soldier's interest to record all dependants, i.e. if married, and with or without children, the dependence (partly or wholly) of parents, sisters, etc.

7. Headquarters of Units will file one sheet of the attached pro forma for each Demobilization form sent in.

In many instances Forfeitures are still calculated incorrectly.
