

It is interesting to note that the above figures, in respect of arrivals and departures, constitute a record for this Depot. The numbers dealt with are nearly double those of any previous month.

The increase in the departures is mainly accounted for by the number evacuated to Australia: 1238 on 21st; 1583 on 22nd; and 1103

The number of men sent to the Overseas Training Depot is very small compared with the months of June and May, but this is accounted for by the fact that all "Bla" Class men who would be fit for G.S. Within

three months were transferred to Nos. 1, 3 and 4 Command Depots.

#### HEADTH.

Apart from wounds and sickness acquired on active service, the health of the troops has been very good. The attendance at sick parade has been very small.

#### OBITUARY. Capt. DERAVIN, A.A.M.C.

I regret to report the sudden death from apoplexy of the above named Officer.

One of the most capable Officers who has been on the Medical Staff of this Depot, his loss will be keenly felt by all with whom he came in contact.

Four other ranks also died during the month, three from pulmonary tuberculosis, and one from pneumonia.

#### SANITATION.

The sanitary conditions of Monte Video Camp, Westham, and Verne Citadel Detachments have been satisfactory.

I have the honour to submit my report upon the health and sanitation of this Camp for the month of July.

HEALTH. The general health of the troops has been satisfactory.

SICK. The Daily average was 38.

DRESSINGS. The daily average was 90.

MASSAGE. The daily average was 40.

HOSPITAL. Total to Hospital for month 33.

VENEREAL. Urethritis 47.

EARLY TREAT- The number of men reporting at the early treatment depot was 752.

DIPHTHERIA.

One case of diphtheria occurred during the month. The patient (Lieut. Bunbury) was removed to the Borough Isolation Hospital, Weymouth. All contacts were effectively isolated under guard. New blankets were supplied and the old blankets removed for disinfection. Swabs from all contacts were taken and one positive contact was detected. This man was removed to the Nothe Laboratory. The remaining

contacts were freed and the hut disinfected as laid down in Routine Order No. 159 11/5/17 and declared fit for occupation after the expiration of 48 hours.

SANITATION. The sanitation of the camp is now satisfactory. A regular unnotified inspection is carried out.

VENTILATION. The necessary supervision with regard to proper ventilation is carried out at regular intervals.

GENERALLY. The health and sanitation of the camp is good.

- 7. DISCIPLINE. The general conduct of the camp has been very satisfactory. The most frequent crime is that of overstaying leave or furlough. Efforts are being made to rectify this.
- 8. TRAINING.
  Owing to the fact that during the past month, Australia cases have been centralised at this Detachment for evacuation to Australia, very little training has been done.
  An N.C.O's. class has been maintained, and such classification present in camp have received the course of training laid down for them.
- 9. POST OFFICE. The N.C.O. i/c Post Office renders a report as follows :During the past month, the working of the Camp Post Office
  has proceeded very satisfactorily, and I have no complaints
  to report.

  All mail for men who have left this camp has been readdressed to them at their various destinations.

  The present staff comprises 4 men.
- Sanitary matters and conditions have been closely watched throughout the month, and have been effectively carried out. Huts are kept thoroughly clean; bath houses and incinerators have received close attention.

  The special Sanitary Officer, Portland Garrisom, visits the camp weekly. The work of the Sanitary Contractor has been carried out satisfactorily. The camp is in a very satisfactory condition. The gardens are well repaying the attentiom which has been bestowed upon them.

- 7. DISCIPLINE. The Discipline of the Detachment during the month has been good.
- 8. TRAINING. Route marches are carried out every day when the weather permits, and particular attention is paid to the Saluting drill on both morning and afternoon parades with very noticeable and good results. Beyond the above mentioned marching and saluting drill, no other training is given, on account of the classification of the men, which precludes training of a strenuous hature.

  The usual fatigues are carried out daily.
- 9. POST OFFICE. The Pte. i/c Post Office renders a report attached.
- More attention is being paid to the conservation of Byproducts and the prevention of waste. A By-products plant
  has been erected by the men of the Detachment, which will
  enable to deal more thoroughly with kitchen waste. During
  the month the following have been disposed of:- 3668 lbs.
  Bones to value of £13.19.6, 2738 lbs Fat to value of
  £63.1.5 and swill to value of £14.

  From Revenue obtained by sale of By-products, the Detachment has purchased a Mechanical Potato peeler and an
  Electric Mincer. Up to to-day sufficient power for the
  latter has not been forthcoming but it is hoped that an
  arrangement may be made with D.O.R.E.

Pioneer & Sanitary Report. Monte Video Camp, Weymouth. July, 1917.

Roads General maintenance of Roads and Paths has been carried out as necessary. All Asphalt Foot Paths leading to and connect-Paths. ing Hospital Huts are now complete.

Sewerage. All Sewers, Gutters Etc., are disinfected at regular intervals.

A few minor repairs have been carried out as necessary and all drains are in good working order.

Surface All Surface drains have been thoroughly cleaned. Grass etc., Water cleaned out and all drains maintained in good order and new drains made where necessary.

Drainage.

Ablution A portable Ablution bench has been placed on North side of Houses

No. 7 Latrine, complete with drain water supply etc., for use of Contacts in Isolation Camp. All Taps are repaired Latrines. as necessary and washers replaced when required. All Urinals are treated with heavy Oil at intervals and all Latrine Pans are disinfected daily and all Galvanised Iron Etc., lime-washed.


Huts. Huts are in excellent habitable state, exterior of Huts, Store Rooms, etc., are being treated with Creosote.

Painter Breakages have been light during the month, and all broken Windows repaired as promptly as possible. Interior of Glazier. Ablution Room at rear of Officers Mess has been painted white.

Carpenter Barrack Room breakages have been repaired as necessary.

Joinery Work has been done for Hospital and Companies where necessary, and several chairs and forms repaired and returned to Store.

Bath Houses are in good working order. The new Bath House between Huts 27 and 28 is now complete and in use for Hospital Patients.



Cook Houses are in good order.

Incinerators. All incinerators are in good order. Minor repairs have been carried out during the month.

Gardener. Gardens are returning a good profit. Several kinds of Vegetables including potatoes have been handed to the Mess. All round between Hospital Huts has been dressed with gravel and flower beds laid in various designs in centre.
