No. 602 Sgt J. Miller, 44th Bn, A.I.F. awarded to Distinguished Conduct Medal at Ypres on 11th October 1917 for gallantry in carrying despatches through to Headquarters under very heavy shell fire, although badly wounded, and returning to his place in the line on three different occasions.

No. 809 Sgt J. H. HAMILTON, 39th Bn, awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal for conspicuous gallantry in action. He removed a wounded Officer to a place of safety, destroyed a dugout, and killed five of the enemy. He was severely wounded.

2036 Pte A. W. INCH, 12th (att 13th) F. AMB. A.A.M.C. awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal for conspicuous gallantry and devotion as a stretcher bearer. Though slightly wounded by shell splinters, he continued to carry wounded under shell fire and difficult conditions. When everybody had been obliged to take cover, hearing that a Major of Artillery had been buried in his dugout, he left the R.A.P. and dug him out, thus saving his life.

OBITUARY There were two deaths during the month, both of which took place at Monte Video Hospital, the cause of death being (1) Valvular Disease of the Heart (2) Pulmonary Tuberculosis.

SANITATION. The sanitation of the Camps at Monte Video, Westham and Littlemoor has been very satisfactory.

VENTILATION. Surprise visits were paid to sleeping quarters, cinemas and Institutes, and the regulations dealing with ventilation were found to be fully complied with.

ACCOMODATION. The hut accomodation has been sufficient; the use of tents has been discontinued.

GENERAL. Under the new Depot Organisation this Command has again been opened for the reception of troops "B1B" Category, the first draft having arrived on the 28th. August. Arrangements have been made at "D" Sub-Depot, Littlemoor for accomodation and treatment of all men of this category. The hospital at this Camp has been extended to 200 beds.

SICK PARADES. The total number on sick parades was 1308, a daily average of 42.

DRESSINGS. The total number of patients for dressings was 975, a daily average of 284.

MASSAGE. The total number of patients for Massage and Electricity was 605, a daily average of 336.

REMEDIAL GYMNASICS? The total number of patients for Remedial Gymnastics was 667, a daily average of 337.

REPORT RE MESSING ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST 1918.

During the past month, the system of feeding troops has been continued in Messing Huts set apart for the purpose. Men are fed in messes of 14, as this number has been found most suitable. It reduces the labour of serving up food and assures more equal distribution. Messing in dining huts minimises waste, requires less supervision, is more hygienic, eliminates complications caused by variations of numbers, and produces a better tone of satisfaction amongst the men.

The diet sheets used are prepared by collaboration of the Messing officers of this Command. With few exceptions, we are able to adhere strictly to them, and the results appear to be appreciated by the troops. No complaints have been lodged by Orderly officers regarding the food, of which there is always a sufficient quantity to satisfy requirements.

Supplies have been fair, however, we have had little cause for complaint after considering existing conditions. The meat Ration has consisted mainly of Mutton, which is not by any means equal to beef. Fewer dishes can be manufactured from it, the bones are less in value, and the dripping return is smaller. The bread is a little better in quality, but is considerably below the standard of that supplied to the civilian population.

The N.A.C.B. has attended satisfactorily to all our requirements with the exception of dried fruits, currants, and raisins, of which there is a general scarcity. On one occasion we were obliged to purchase potatoes and onions locally owing to delay on the part of the railways to deliver same to the Canteen Stores. Moderate supplies of green vegetables have been secured locally at reasonable prices; the variety, however, has been limited.

During the past week we have been caused inconvenience on account of troops marching in after dinner without sufficient notice of their arrival having been given. Small numbers are easily accommodated, but it is a totally different matter where providing an evening meal for over one hundred men is entailed. To cope with this increased strength we have had to open the top cookhouse, which has not been in use for the past few months. Another difficulty is the finding of men to perform the various duties connected with messing. Fifty per cent of the cooks should be men of "A" category, but as these and men of "B2a" class are not available, we are obliged to employ a large proportion of "C1" class, and there are barely sufficient of these even to do the required work and keep it up to the standard at which we aim.

Two new potato cleaning machines have been installed at a cost of £33.12.0, and they appear to be the result of money well spent, as the required labour for potato cleaning has been reduced, and there is a minimum of waste.

Tea towels used in the dining rooms are changed each week and the cost of washing them is defrayed from by-products. This system is proving satisfactory and warrants the necessary expense.

By-product returns are not as large as we would be pleased to see them. This is mainly due to the continued issue of mutton during the month. It must also be considered that large quantities of fat are required in the preparation of food for "Light Diet" patients for whom we draw no meat or bacon ration.

MONTHLY REPORT RE MESSING

Since furnishing my last report for the month of July, Beef has been frequently issued, the Sausage ration has been increased from 6oz. to 8 oz. since 30th August 1918. The Bread issue has ~~been~~ considerably improved in quality, but the full ration of 14 oz. is not being drawn.

For the month of August not more than 9 oz. of the 14 oz. has been consumed, consequently the ration has been underdrawn to the extent of 3023 rations. A total of 5740 lbs of Flour has been drawn in lieu of Bread also. (140 Lbs of Flour is equivalent to 224 rations of Bread) The 3 oz. slice of Bread ~~is~~ still being issued per meal, if any more is required the Mess Orderlies are instructed to return to the Ration Store for same. The remainder of the A.S.C. Ration has been fully drawn, and issued with one exception, this occurred on the closing of the A.S.C. monthly period, a double indent was submitted on the 28th August 1918 for the 30th August 1918, during the interval between the 28th and 30th the ration strength had increased by 100 rations, consequently shewing an under-drawal for the month of 100 rations.

The 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. Commuted allowance has been fully spent. The N.A.B.C. at present are unable to supply our requirements in preserved fruits., only currants being obtainable, consequently only the following Puddings can be served, Rice, Sago, Tapioca, Maccaroni, Ginger, Suet, Blanc Mange and Custard and Currant Puddings. Vegetables are more abundant; ~~and~~ Cabbage, Carrots, Swedes and Vegetable Marrows are being substituted for Beans and Peas, Potatoes are still being served twice daily.

Offal is still being purchased three times weekly.

For previous months May and July, £75-13-10 and £67-14-6. respectively was received from By Products. An endeavour is now being made to recover salable fats from kitchen grease traps. This is rather difficult matter owing to soot and other foreign substances being mixed with it.

Orders have been submitted for the following articles required for the improvement of Messing generally:-
Food Steamers, Fat pressers, Weighing Machine, (2 Cwt Avery's) Tea Strainers, Pototo Eye Extractors, 2 pieces of three ply timber, Wire Baskets, Cleaning Material etc.

The above articles will be utilised as follows:-

Food Steamers For steaming vegetables and puddings instead of boiling, food prepared in this way is more palatable and economises fuel.

Fat pressers These machines are used in the kitchens by placing the part rendered fat in them it is then squeezed out, and the liqued fat is separated from the cracklings. These cracklings are again rendered, by this means more fat is recovered and also a saving of coal takes place.

Report Re messing Continued:-

Weighing Machine The weighing machine is necessary for the weighing in of all purchases also the A.S.C. Ration.

Potato Eye Extractors. These are used for the purpose of extracting the discolorations from the potatoes.

Three Ply Timber This is to be made into two notice boards, one for each kitchen. On these boards the numbers of the Huts and numbers of men in messes will be shown, this will assist the cooks in the equal distribution of food. The figures being altered to compare with rations states furnished by Companies.

Wire Baskets (6) These have been purchased, and are to be used as follows. When stewed meats are served it very often occurs that an equal distribution of meat is not effected. The meat is first ladled out and put into the food dishes, the liquid remains in the boilers. An equal distribution of the meat is then arranged according to the number of men in messes. The liquid, vegetables etc., are then added to the meat.


Soup Ladels, Small These have been purchased and issued to each hut in lieu of spoons previously in use, these enable the mess orderlies to serve the food quicker, consequently it does not get so cold before the men get it.

Kitchens The smoke chimneys in No I Cook-House are being re arranged in order to increase the heating of stoves. In their present faulty condition the heat escapes and the full benefit of the fuel cannot be obtained.

Clothing Lockers One locker in each of the cooks sleeping quarters is under construction for their convenience,

Included in the cooking strength shewn above are two men employed in the recovery of By-products, and one cook employed in the Sergeants' Mess.

Entitlement of cooks is one per 50 men. The strength of these sub-depots is constantly changing, therefore it would be comparatively impossible to have the cooking staff strength rigidly coincide with the entitlement of strength. Large drafts march in at short notice, and the cooking staff must be there to prepare the food for them. The average monthly strength for the seven months ended July 1918, was, 1,352.

Extreme difficulty has recently been experienced by the fact that all "A" class trained cooks were marched out, including the Sergeant Cook, and their places had to be filled by men only partially trained.

For the training of cooks, it would be possible to run a Cookery School in the Command here, and by a system of interchange of Cooks now employed, none of the depots need feel the strain too severely of losing cooks temporarily to schools as is now the case. The course would be shorter, and obtain equally, if not more, satisfactory results.

The present schools cover an unnecessary range and keep men from their Units for a longer period than would be the case if a graded syllabus of Instructions were arranged, first to cover the theoretical and practical work. As far as Depot cooking was concerned a further course could be arranged for a finishing course, and to cover Field cooking.

4. Dealing with N. A. C. B.

As far as this sub-depot is concerned, dealings with the N.A.C.B. has been eminently satisfactory; only in minor matters have they failed to comply with orders.

5. Universal Diet Sheet.

The Messing Officers in the Command meet periodically and prepare a diet sheet to be used universally in the Command. This has proved satisfactory, but circumstances often occur which involve a minor deviation from the dishes as laid down.

6. Coal Supply.

The coal supply for this sub-depot is at present of very inferior quality. It was scarcely possible, a week back, for the cooks to keep the fires alight, much less cook with it. Some of the previous issue has recently been used to improve it, but as soon as that supply is exhausted it is doubtful what the result will be.

7. Local purchase.

In the expenditure of the Commuted allowance for the past period, vegetables have been bought from the camp gardens at cost of production plus 10%; also from local Market Gardeners at such a price that, when the 20% additional which has to be charged against the Commuted allowance, it still leaves the prices paid at under N.A.C.B. prices. This involves a saving in expenditure of this Fund, provides a greater variety, and supplies equally as good vegetables.

S U G G E S T I O N .

May I suggest the appointment of one of the Messing Officers in the Command as Senior Messing Officer whose duties would be general supervision of messing in the Command; the co-ordination of the efforts of the Messing officer to maintain uniformity in the feeding of the men; the combination of the best methods found in the Command, or elsewhere, to gain higher efficiency; to keep in touch with Headquarters of N.A.C.B. and obtain guarantee of certain essential supplies to prevent dislocation of Diet Sheet by shewing thereon articles unobtainable; to supervise expenditure of Commuted allowance and By-product funds in the Command; to organise a Cooking School for the training of Cooks in the Command; to ensure the best results from the cooking for the men and the general elimination of waste.

No. 2 COMMAND DEPOT - WEYMOUTH.PHYSICAL TRAINING REPORT FOR MONTH OF AUGUST 1918.

The training throughout the month has continued to improve and the system is now firmly established. The outstanding features are Bathing Parades, Route Marches, Gusto, and Cricket, thus giving variation and new interests. About 400 from each "B" and "D" Sub-Depots attended the Bathing Parades, and were marched two miles to the bathing places.

The weather throughout the month was very favourable, and the marching to and from Bathing has greatly improved the marching and general bearing of the men, more especially at "B" Sub-Depot where the Band was available.


Gusto and Cricket have both been very popular with the men, and the games generally have been entered into with enthusiasm.

Owing to a re-organization of the Command Depot towards the end of the month there is now no training at "D" Sub-Depot except Special Remedial Work which is under direct Medical Supervision.

Only two "Schools of Instruction in Games" were held during the month as there was a good supply of Instructors on hand for Transport Duty in addition to the Permanent Cadre of P.T. Instructors.

Fifty-one (51) N.C.Os. and men have qualified at these two Schools, and twenty-three (23) have embarked on Transports or Carriers for Australia as P.T. Instructors.

The average daily attendance for both the morning and afternoon parades was about 400.
