

At \$6700 orders were received that the Brigade was to be prepared to move at short notice. At 1830 Orders were received that the Brigade would concentrate in the vicinity of KASR HAJLA as soon as possible. The Brigade left TALET ED DUMM at 1920 and at 2400 were concentrated at HASR H					
N APRADE	24th	At 0130 the Brigade was ordered to cross the River JORDAN by the Pontoon Bridg at HAJLA and join the Auckland M.R.who were on the EAST bank of the JORDAN operating with the 60th Division. The role of the Brigade was in accordance with N.Z.M.R.Brigade Order No 40 marked "B" attached. At 0920 orders were recefrom the 181st Infantry Brigade that the attack on the line TEL EL MUSTA-EL HAWOULD begin at once and asking thet the N.Z.M.R.Brigade would co-operate on the right. Orders were issued at onde to attack on the line JOFET DERBASI-MAKRET DEFBASI-Pt 730. Canterbury M.R. with four machine guns attacked to attack on the lineDERBASI INCLUSIVE. Wellington M.R.with four Machine guns attacked to attack on the line JOFET DERBASI-MAKRED DERBASI Inclusive. Pt 730 inclusive. Hong Kong Battery was ordered to move forward and support the attack. Auckland M.R. and Maching Gun Sqdn. (less twb Sections) remaining in reserve. Both Regiments pushed forward and at 1125 were in possesion of the above line, the enemy retiring in the direction ES SALT, three Turkish prisoners being captured. Wellington M.W.also assisted one Battalion 181st Inf.Bde., in the capture of three mountain guns. At 1500 the Brigade mover forward by Road No 4 in the direction of AMMAN. March	At 0830 the march was continued without poposition and the Brigade was concentrated at crossroads one mile EAST of ES SIR at 1330. Twb Turkish Officers and 88 O/Rs were captured at AIN ES SIR, our casualties Nil. Patrols were immediately sent forward in the direction of ES SALT, AMMAN & RUJM EL MADOWERA but no enemy troops were encountered. An outpost line was established for the night on the line Pt 3255 DH HAMAR-DEIR ABDUN KUSE BKT UMM AMUD. At 2100 a patrol of six Germans approached out line and was captured. At 2200 one German scout approached out lines and was captured, these being the only enemy troops seen.	
26th	The Brigade was joined by the remainder of the Anzac Mtd Division at 0800 At 1130 an enemy patrol of three Cavalry approached our lines, two being killed and one wounded and captured; their horses being killed. mFurther patrols were sent out during the day but only small parties in the vicinity of AMMAN were seen. At 1700 orders were received that a small party under an Officer was to be sent forward during the night to thr Railway SOUTH of AMMAN to destroy safficient rails to cause a temporary isolation of the place. The party left bivouac at 210 returning at 0300 on the 27th four lengths of rails were destroyed.	
27th	Orders were received that AMMAN was to be attacked with a view to destroying the Railway, The N.Z.M.R. Bde, was ordered to move by road.from AIN ES SIR through KU and get into a position to attack AMMAN from the SOUTH on the fwontage of AMMA mRAILWAY STATION-AMMAN. The I.C.C.Brigade was ordered to follow the N.Z.M.R.Bde. position to attack AMMAN from the WEST. The 2nd L.H.Brigade to march via EL FUHEIS road and attack AMMAN from the NORTH. The Brigade left bivouac at 0800, Autkland M.R. and 1 Section M.G. Squadron forming advance Guard. The advance was continued and at 1100 the Brigade was in position as follows:— ANM.R. 	28	8th	The advance was continued on the 28th at 0630 and at 0920 the enemy having been heavily reinforced, the Brigade was again held up. Artillery assistance was asked for and one Section Hong Kong Battery was ordered to come under orders of G.O.C.Brigade but did not arrive until 1415. The 4th Battalion I.C.C.Brigade, who were covering demolition party from the SOUTH, were also ordered to come under orders of G.O.C.Brigade. At 1100 the enemy heavily counter attacked 4th Battn.I.C.C.Brigade and reached bombing distance but were driven off. At 1130 orders were received that Infantry and Artillery reinforcements had arrived and that a general advance would be made beginning at 1300. 3039 was strongly held by enemy and Machine Guns covered all approaches. At 1410 artillery assistance was againasked for to destroy enemy Machine Guns but was not available. At 1415 One Section Hong Kong Battery arrived and was immediately ordered into action to shell enemy on hill 3039. At 1600 Auckland M.R. and 4th Battn I.C.C.Brigade had advanced their line 500 yards where they were again held up by Machine Gun fire. At 1830 orders were received that a strong defensive line was to be taken up on the line already held with a view to renewing the attack on the 29th.

Approaching A on either flank were sub-sidiary positions, b & C, covering the advance

shamrock, the stem representing the ridge leading to the main and strongest position.

along the ridge. See sketch marked "E" attached.

A consultation was held by the B.G.C. with O S C Units and the necessity was formed of concemtrating the attack swiftly and silently on the main, or A position, passing through B and C positions, merely detaching two small parties to keep them occupied, in order, first, to gain all possible advantage of surprise, and second, relying on the capture of the main, or A position, cutting off B.a.C.Parties and compelling their subsequent surrender. This worked out according to plan.

After the capture of A the Turks in B 1 Off. 28 O/Rs and 4 Machine Guns were captured

After the capture of A the Turks in B,1 Off.28 O/Rs and 4 Machine Guns, were captured without a shot, and in C,12 O/Rs with 1 Machine Gun, surrendered.

30th The advance commenced at 0200 and at 0415 the final objective, Hill 3039, had heem captured, Captures include 3 Officers, 50 O/Rs, 5 Machine Guns.

At 0755 one Troop was withdrawn from Canterbury M.R. and one Troop from Wellington M.R. to come into Brigade Reserve. At 0920 the enemy was seenmassing on the N.E. slopes of 3039 ready to deliver a counter attack. Artillery assistance was asked for but was not available. Only four rounds were available for Section of Hong Kong Battery attached to Brigade.

March 30th (continued)

At 0930 the enemy delivered a very strong counter attack against hill 3039 reaching within ten yards of our line. The N.Z.M.R.Bde. and 4th Battn.I.C.C.Bde.brilliantly counter attacked and with rifle and Machine Gun fire(no Artillery support being available) drove the enemy back over the crest willine inflicting very heavy casualties. At 1200 informationwas received that the right of the 181st Inf Bde. had gained their objective-CITADEL HILL. The enemy commenced to vigourously shell our position on 3039 with three batteries and at 1600 a very determined counter attack was again delivered on our right. One troop from Brigade Reserve was immediately thrown in against enemy's left and the attack was beaten off with rifle and machine gun fire. the enemy reaching to within about fifty yards of our line.

At 1740 orders were received that the Bde.would withdraw as soon as it was dark and move to a bivouac site about cross roads, one mile EAST of ES SIR. At 1845 orders were issued that the Bde.would move as soon as the wounded had been evacuated. There were no facilities for evacuating wounded, all wounded having to be carried on blankets for a distance of one mile and then off horseback, a further ten miles, and it was not until 2330 that all wounded had been evacuated. At 2400 the withdrawal was commenced, Canterbury M.R. forming the rearguard. The withdrawal was varried out without opposition, the Bde, arriving in bivouac at 0400 on 31st.

ES SIR

- ABDUN KUSR Sq.R.29.a.inclusive. Canterbury M.R. were detailed and were in position on the above line at 0500. At 1500 patrols reported enemy advancing on the left flank from the vicinity of ES SALT road. Auckland M.R. and one Sect. M.G. Dqdn. were immediately ordered to move forward and support Canterbury M.R. The enemy advanced to within 1500 yards of our line but did not press the attack. An outpost line was established for the night 31st/1st on the line DH. HAMAR. Pt 3255-DIER GU- ABDUN KUSR-BKT UMM AMUD, connecting with the 181st Infantru Brigade on the left.
- April 1st At 0030 orders were received that as soon as the camels had cleared the Pass the 181st Inf.

 Bds.would withdraw and march as far as Sq.X.5.central, where a position would be taken up covering Road 4.

 The N.Z.M.R.Bde.was ordered to follow the 181st Inf Bde, and act as rearguard. At 0300 Wellington M.R.were ordered to move out and take up a position to cover the withdrawal of Auckland M.R.and Canterbury M.R.and act as rearguard to the Force. There was considerable difficulty in getting the camels through ES SIR and it was not until 0700 that the Brigade entered the village.

(b) When the Brigade moves from TALET ED DUMM it will take three days supplies for man and horse which will be carried as follows:-

Unconsumed portion, plus iron ration, on man and horse. Two days mobile rations on camel echlon.

(4) WATER

No troops are to water at BETHANY. Drinking water will be drawn at TALET ED DUMM from tanks on JERICHO road, Square G.10.b. Horses will water at the mill G.4.2. under instructions to be issued later.

(5) TRANSPORT

G.S. Wagons will report to Units as follows, and must be loaded and returned to Brigade Trahsport Lines not later than 1600.

(1) INFORMATION

- (a) Information as regards the enemy will be issued kxxxxseparately.

 n As the general goodwill and assistance of the inhabitants EAST of
 the JORDAN is of first importance, all ranks must be warned to treat them
 with the greatest consideration. All payments are to be made in cash
 and all friction is to strictly avoided. It must be remembered that these
 natives are of a very different class to those hitherto met with.
- (b) a force consisting of the 60th Division A. &. N. Z. Mtd Divn. and Imperbal Camel Force will cross the JORDAN, and advance on ES SALT and AMMAN with a view to destroying the railway.
- (c) The operations of the 60th Divn are as follows:
 1.To force crossings of the JORDAN and form bridgeheads at MAKHADET

 Hajla and EL GHORANI MEH as soon after dusk as possible on March 19th/

 20th.
- II.To sieze the foothills on the line TEL EL MUSTA-EL HAUD.

 III.To follow the Mounted troops to ES SALT, or, if the mounted troops cannot get through, to fight its way to ES SALT and secure the place.
- (d) Under cover of the bridgeheads, the building of bridges at MAKHADET HAGLA & EL GHORANIYEH is being carried out.
- (2) INSTRUCTIONS
 (a) From 1800 on the noght 19/20th onwards the A.&.N.Z.Mtd Divn.and Imperial Camel Brigade will be ready to move at one hours notice to the JORDAN by the EKTEIF road. The N.Z.M.R.Bde.will be leading.
 Order of March:- Advanced Guard. Wellington M.R. & 1 Sect.M.G.Sqdn.

As soon as the first bridge is completed the N.Z.M.R.Bde.will cross the the river JORDAN and move rapidly to the foothills about SHUNET NIMRIM. On arrival at SHUNET NIMRIM the Auckland M.R.plus 1 Sect M.G.Sqdn., will be detached and will move as quickly as possible by road 5 main road to ES SALT) with the object of preventing the road being blown up, and to seize ES SALT by a coup-de-main. This advance must be made with the utmost vigour and determination, and the objective gained as soon as possible.

As soon as the Auckland M.R. have been relieved by the Infantry they wir will withdraw without firther orders and rejoin the Brigade in the vicinity of AMMAN, moving via EL FUHEIS-BKT UMM AMUD.

- (c) The remainder of the Brigade will move by road 4 and gain the plateau as quickly as possible.
- (d) The 2nd L.H.Bde.will crossthe JORDAN and march by Road No 2.
- (e) Divisional Headquarters, 1st L.H.Bde.and Imperial Camel Corps Bde. & 18th Brigade R.H.A.will cross and march by road no 3.

(f) All columns will gain the plateau as soon as possible.

- (g) Forty men with twenty picks and shovels will be detailed by Canterbury M.R. and Wellington M.R. to report to O.C. Advanced Guards to take in hand at once any road repairing required so as not to delay the march of the column (h) Immediately the plateau is gained the object will be:
 - i. To get into communication at once with the troops marching up to the plateau on the right and left.
 - ii- If any body of troops on the right or left in encountering oppositio to assist in taking the enemy in flank.

- (j) ADVANCE ON AMMAN As soon as the plateau is gained by all threecolumns the advance on AMMAN will begim.

 The N.Z.M.R. (less Auckland M.R.& 1 Sect.M.G.Sqdn) and two Sqdns.Canterbury M.R. will move by the shortest route directing its march NORTH of AMMAN. Canterbury M.R. will detach 1 Sqdn. to move (with a party carrying explosives) with all speed to a point on the railway about five miles NORTH of AMMAN and will at once cut the Railway by destroying some lengths of rail at this point.
- (k) The centre column will move direct on AMMAN by road No 3
- (1) The 2nd L.H.Bde will direct its march on EL YADUDE.
- (m) As soon as AMMAN is occupied the C.R.E., A.&.N.Z.Mtd Divn.assisted by the C.R.E., Imperial Camel Bde.will take in hand the destruction of the railway undervspecial instructions.
- (3) (DETACHMENTS Canterbury M.R. will detail one Sqdn. which will be employed n at TEL ES SULTAN at 0800 on March 20th.

 O.C.Sqdn.detailed will report to B.G.C., 179 th Inf Bde.in the WADI NUEIMEH at Sq.L.3.d.at 0800 on March 20th. This Sqdn will subsequently be attached to 181 to Brigade Group on the arrival of that Bde, on the line WADI ABU TARRA and remain with it.
- (4) CONCEALMENT OF TROOPS No fires will be lit or bivouse or tent erected by my day by Units on arrival in the JERICHO Plain and it is of the utmost importance to conceal the concentration of troops there, and prevent leakage of information.
- (5) GRAZING No grazing of animals will take place in the JORDAN Valley owing to the danger of Surra and of Poinonous grass.
- (6) LINE OF SUPPLY Line of supply will Road No 3.
- (7) HOSTILE AEROPLANES. In the event of a hostile aeroplane approaching troops concentrated on the JERICHO Plaineveryone will remain still and not look up. There is to be no rifle fire.

 Machine and Hotchkiss Guns will be detailed to open fire on any hostile aeroplanes which fly low over troops.
- (8) Ackno wledge.
