ES SIR	April 1st (continued)	<p>As the rearguard was clearing the village the inhabitants commenced to open fire from houses, caves and rocks on either side of the defile. Wellington M.R. promptly replied and severely punished the circassians comprising the ambush. Auckland M.R. were ordered to take up a position about Sq.A.1.d. and Canterbury M.R. a position Sq.N.30.c.d. to cover the withdrawal of Wellington M.R. About 80 casualties were inflicted on the enemy forces. Our Machine Guns and then one Battery 181st Inf Bde. came into action and all firing was quickly silenced.</p> <p>Meanwhile a strong Turkish Force was reported to be approaching and the march was continued. The Brigade arrived at SHUNET NIMRIM at 2015.</p> <p>Our captured during the operations included 9 Turkish Officers, 188 O/Rs, 7 Germans O/Rs Five Machine Guns and share in the capture of three Mountain Guns.</p> <p>Our Casualties:- Killed 6 Officers, 32 Other Ranks, Wounded 6 Officers, 116 Other Ranks, Missing 13 Other Ranks.</p> <p>Estimated enemy casualties:- 110 Killed, 310 Wounded.</p>	<p>Reference Map 1/63.360 AMMAN.</p>

SHUNET NIMRIM April 2nd	The Brigade was bivouacked at SHUNET NIMRIM. Orders were received that the Brigade was to cross the JORDAN and bivouac in the JORDAN VALLEY in the vicinity of JERICHO. The Brigade left SHUNET NIMRIM at 0745, arriving in new bivouac at 1100.	
JERICHO " 3rd	Brigade remained in bivouac. At 0655 eight hostile aeroplanes flew over camp, dropping five bombs; 8 men (Auckland M.R. Regt) being wounded, 18 horses wounded & 5 killed. At 1630 orders were received that the Brigade was to establish posts at MANDESI, YEHUD AND HAJLA FORDS. Three troops Wellington M.R. were detailed and were in position by 1800.	
" 4th	Wellington M.R. stood to arms at 0400 and at 0700 all clear was received and Regiment was ordered to stand down. Auckland M.R. detailed three troops, to relieve posts from Wellington M.R. at Fords. Relief was effected by 1900.	
" 5th	Auckland M.R. stood to arms at 0400. At 0730 "all clear" was received and regt ordered to stand down. Three troops Canterbury M.R. were detailed to relieve posts of Auckland M.R. on the fords. Relief was effected by 1700.	
" 6th	Canterbury M.R. stood to arms at 0400. At 0730 "all clear" was received and regiment ordered to stand down. Three troops Wellington M.R. relieved troops from Canterbury M.R. on the Fords. Relief was effected by 1730.	
" 7th	Wellington M.R. stood to arms at 0400 and at 0630 all clear was received and Regiment ordered to stand down. Three troops A.M.R. relieved posts of Wellington M.R. on the Fords. Relief was completed at 1730.	
" 8th	Auckland M.R. stood to arms at 0400, at 0600 "all Clear" was received and Regiment ordered to stand down. A working party of 100 was detailed to construct inner bridge head at EL GHORANIYEH. Three troops C.M. Regt. relieved posts from A.M. Regt, at Fords. Relief was completed by 1730.

GHORANIYEH	1918 April	30th	<p>At 0400 W.M.R. Regt., and 1 Section M.G. Sqn. were ordered to move forward and protect the right flank of the 180th Brigade who were attacking on the line 127.P.23.c. MAKKAR ED DERBASI.</p> <p>At 0730 orders were received that 180th Inf. Bde., would assault on the line MAKKAR ED DERBASI exclusive to JOFET DERBASI-127.P.25.central, the final objective being Sq.U.26.b. NORTH of EL HALALI with a view to cutting off any of the enemy retiring up WADI JERIA.</p> <p>At 0800 Orders were received that the attack would be delayed one hour.</p> <p>At 0800 C.M.R. Regt., and 1 Section M.G. Sqn., moved forward to attack on the right of the 180th Inf Bde., Auckland M.R. Regt., and 1 Section M.G. Sqn., moving forward in support. Wellington M.R. Regt., and 1 Section M.G. Sqn., were ordered to rejoin Brigade and remain in Brigade Reserve.</p> <p>Canterbury M.R. Regt., moved forward and came under very heavy shell fire from the direction of SHUNET NIMRIM, at least four enemy batteries being in action.</p> <p>At 0930 a message was received that the attack by 180th Inf Bde., was delayed. Canterbury M.R. Regt., was also held up on the line 127.R.4.b.-R.10.d. estimated enemy strength on our immediate fronts being 1,000.</p> <p>At 1820 orders were received that the Brigade would withdraw as soon as it was dark and concentrate SOUTH of EL GHORANIYEH. Wellington M.R. Regt., and 1 Section M.G. Sqn., were ordered to remain in present position and come under the orders of 180th Inf Bde.,</p> <p>The Brigade commenced to withdraw at 1930 and at 2200 were concentrated at 127.Q.10.d.</p> <p>At 2240 orders were received that the Brigade less Wellington M.R. Regt., and 1 Section M.G. Sqn., would come into Corps reserve and be ready to move on one hours notice.</p>

(1) INFORMATION

Information as regards the enemy on our immediate front will be issued later.

(2) INSTRUCTIONS

In order to inflict losses on the enemy, and to convey the impression that we are about to advance again at AMMAN, operations will be carried out against SHUNET NIMRIM, which will take place as follows on April 18th and 19th.

(a) From 1500 on the afternoon of April 18th the B.G.C., 20th Inf. Bde., will take over charge of the bridgehead at EL GHORANIYEH from the B.G.C. 1st L.H. Bde., under arrangements to be made between the Brigadiers.

(B) During April 18th the enemy's position will be bombarded by the 10th Heavy Battery and 383 Siege Battery. This bombardment will begin as soon as possible after daylight.

(C) At 1500 on April 18th the 180th Inf Bde., will march to bivouac about one mile WEST of EL GHORANIYEH. This march is intended to look like a move against SHUNET NIMRIM, and therefore the B.G.C., 180th Inf Bde., will make his Brigade as conspicuous as possible, and arrange his march in such a way that it cannot escape the notice of the enemy.

(D) During the afternoon and evening 18th April the Anzac Mtd Divn., and 302 Field Artillery Bde., will move EAST of the river, the Artillery covered by the Anzac Mtd Divn. Positions will be occupied by which a bombardment of the enemy's position will be carried out.

The C.R.A. ANZAC Mtd Div., and 302 F.A. Bde., will reconnoitre positions at once under cover of our patrols from which the guns will open fire and routes leading to these positions from the bridgehead. They will report at once if these routes require any improvement for the passage of the Artillery by night.

(E) On April 19th the enemy's position at SHUNET NIMRIM will be bombarded by Heavy Siege, Field and Horse Artillery Batteries.

(f) During the day the ANZAC Mtd Div., will demonstrate against the enemy. The Demonstration will be made towards KABR MUJAHID on the SOUTH and in the direction of ES SALT in the NORTH, combined with keeping his attention by pushing forward direct on SHUNET NIMRIM. The Division will however not be committed to an attack. If the enemy retires he will be followed but no troops will enter ES SALT as it is important that no occasion ~~xxxxx~~ should be given to the Turks to ill-treat inhabitants on our subsequent withdrawal.

(3) During these operations the AUJAH front will be held by Imperial Camel Bde, the PATALIA I.S. Infantry, the 301st Field Infantry Bde., and one Sqn., Hyderabad I.S. Lancers.

1. INFORMATION

Orders for action on April 19th will be issued later.

2. INSTRUCTIONS

(A) The Brigade will cross the river tonight, April 18th, and bivouac in bridgehead ready to move out and take part in operations.

(B) The Brigade will pass the starting point-present Brigade Headquarters at 1800 in order of march as follows:-

Brigade Headquarters  
Signal Troop  
Canterbury M.R.Reg.  
Auckland M.R.Reg.  
Machine Gun Squadron.  
Wellington M.R.Reg.,

(C) All Units will carry two days supplies, i.e., Forage for horse and rations up to and including breakfast 20th inst., plus Iron ration.

(D) Ammunition limbers and water carts only will be taken. These will be Brigaded, and remain in a bivouac site WEST of the JORDAN.

(E) Bivvies will not be struck and usual camp guards will be detailed.

(F) Canterbury M.R.Reg., will detail one Subaltern as O.C.Details/Advance parties will report to Staff Captain at Brigade Headquarters at 1600 to day.

3. ESCORT

Each Regiment will detail four men under a Sergeant to be detailed by Canterbury M.R.Reg., to act as escort to ammunition limbers. This escort will pick up limbers at starting point at 1800.

JERICHO 29th April 1918

1. INFORMATION

- (a) Information about the enemy will be issued later.
- (b) The Corps commander intends to envelope the right of the enemy's main forces about SHUNET NIMRIM, capture ES SALT and advance to the line KUSR (142.T.9)-Pt 2900(142.O.35)
- (c) In consequence the following moves are taking place on April 30th.
  - (1) SHEA'S FORCE Detachment under Lt-Col, G.M.M. Onslow DSO, consisting of one Mtd. Regt., (7th L.H.) 1 Sqn. Hyderabad Lancers and 1 Bttn., Patalia Inf. seize enemy's advanced works near KABR SAID and KABR MUJAHID tracks (No 2 & 3 Roads) under special instructions issued to 60th Division. Occupy line MAKKAR ED DERBASI - TEL EL MUSTA - EL HAUD. 179th Bde., attacking EL HAUD and 180th Bde., MAKKAR ED DERBASI - TEL EL MUSTA. Hour of attack 0200 April 30th. The A.&N.Z. Mtd Div., (less 1st L.H. Bde & 1 Regt & 1 Sqn. 2nd M.H. Bde., and 1 Regt., N.Z.M.R. Bde) are held in readiness awaiting orders to occupy the line KUSR (142 T.9.) (-ES SALT.
  - (2) HODGSON'S FORCE Advance rapidly EAST of JORDAN not later than 0400, ~~detach~~ detaching one Mtd Bde., & 2 Batteries R.H.A. to face N.W. occupy position astride UMM ESH SHERT - JISR ED DAMIE and ES SALT - JISR ED DAMIE Tracks. The remainder of this force move on ES SALT from the WEST and NORTH WEST. When ES SALT is occupied 1 Bde., advance to Pt 2900(142.O.35) with object of capturing enemy retiring from before SHEA'S force. HODGSON'S FORCE are allotted GHORANIYEH Crossings, from 2200 April 29th to 0230 April 30th. No 6 Road is allotted to this force.
  - (3) SMITH'S FORCE By 0400 April 30th throws the right flank forward about ~~113.X.23.a.~~ 113.X.23.a. and establishes a post on the right Bank of the JORDAN near the bend in 113.X.17.d.
  - (4) BRIDGEHEAD GARRISON 20th Indian Infantry Bde., is remaining on the Bridgehead.
  - (5) CORPS RESERVE 6th Mounted Brigade including 1 R.H. Battery and Imperial Service Cavalry Bde., form Corps Reserve, 2 miles WEST of EL GHORANIYEH.
  - (6) MOVES The Anzac Mtd Divn., will be under the orders of Major General T.S.M. SHEA, CB, CMG, DSO, and will be held in readiness for the first part of the operations.
    - (a) The N.Z.M.R. BDE will leave present bivouac tonight, 29th April and move to a position in broken ground, S.E. of EL GHORANIYEH bridge alongside Road No 3 close to where the outer bridgehead wire crosses the road. The Brigade will pass the starting point - Road just EAST of Brigade Headquarters - at 2400 tonight 29th April. Order of march as follows:-

- (2) DETACHMENTS One Regt., 2nd L.H. Bde., will be detailed to operate with detachment
  - (a) mentioned in para. 1.(c). (1) against KABR MUJAHID.
  - (b) 1 Sqn., 2nd L.H. Bde to be on NORTHERN flank of 179th Bde., The Sqn will commence crossing the bridgehead EL GHORANIYEH at 1830 on April 29th and report to B.G.C. 179th Inf Bde., on arrival.

- (c) The Wellington M.R.Reg't.with 1 Section M.G.Sqdn.,attached will guard the SOUTHERN flank of the 180th Inf Bde.which is attacking line MAKKAR ED DERBASI-TEL EL MUSTA. The Regt.,to be in position by 0430.O/C Regt.will report to B.G.C.,180th Inf Brigade during the 29th April for instructions
- (4) AEROPLANE CO-OPERATION The following have been arranged.  
 (a) Aeroplane contact patrols of the area of operations from 0530 to 0700 1100 to 1230 and 1530 to 1700.  
 (b) Tactical reconnaissances at 1500 and 1600.  
 (c) Strategical Reconnaissances at 1200 and 1600.  
 (d) One Machine(Artillery co-operation)throughout the day.Messages from "A" and "B" will not be dropped on formations lower than Divisional Hqrs.
- (5) COMMUNICATION WITH ARTILLERY The Anzac Mtd Division will use RED and YELLOW flags.Remainder of Corps,RED flares to indicate position of advanced troops to Artillery.
- (6) AMMUNITION DUMPS are being formed WEST of EL GHORANIYEH bridge and at SHUNET NIMRIM.
- (7) MEDICAL Receiving Stations are ~~at the entrance to the bridgehead on No 5 Rd~~ being established at EAST bank of the JORDAN near the bridge.
- (8) PRISONERS Collecting Station at the entrance to the bridgehead on No 5 Road.
- (9) TRAFFIC CONTROL Instructions are being issued by A.P.M.Desert Mounted Corps
