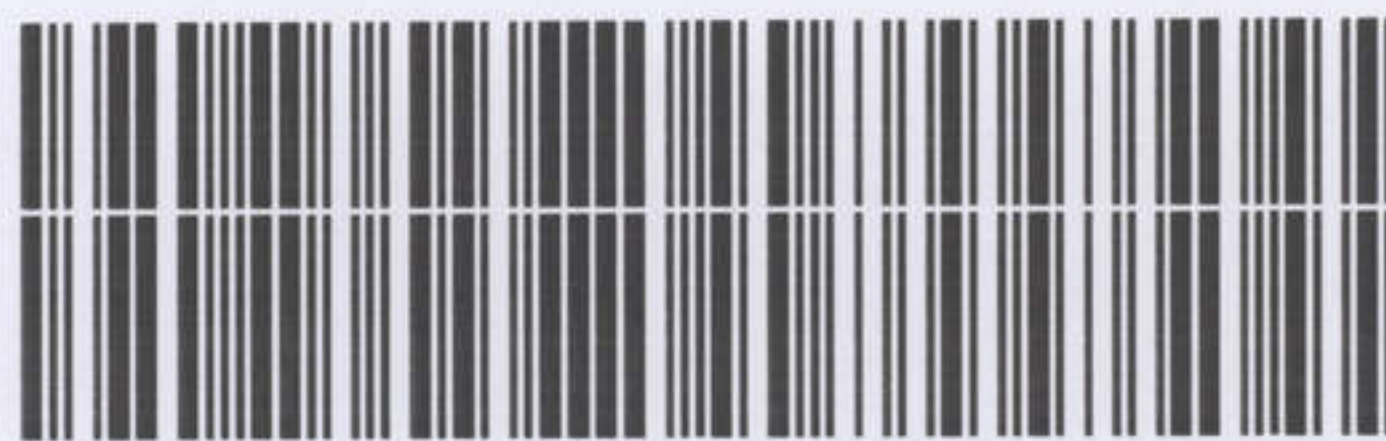

1. The N.Z.M.R. Brigade will move out of present Bivouac area on the night of 13/14 June (time notified later), and march to TALAT ED DUMM.
2. The Brigade will relieve the 3rd L.R. Brigade as Garrison of No 4 Sub. Sector, and as left group of Divisional Reserve the following day 15/16 June.
3. The Relief will be carried out as under:-
 - (i) On the night 14/15 the Brigade will move at 1930 from TALAT ED DUMM to Bivouac site at 113.K. 4
 - (ii) Wellington M.R. Regt. and One Sub. Section Machine Gun Squadron will march from K.4 to AIN ED DUK (113.H.25) on the night of 14/15. Men and horses by Roman Road and Route 27 (on map attached) replacing 1 Regiment and 1 Section Machine Gun, and about dawn on the 16th will relieve One Regiment and One Machine Gun Section of 3rd L.H. Brigade as Garrison of No. 4 Sub-Sector
 - (iii) Auckland M.R. Regt. and 2 Sections Machine Gun Squadron will leave K.4 on the night of 15/16 June at 1900 and proceed to Y.28, taking Route 27 - 33, relieving One Regiment and 2 Sections Machine Gun of 3rd L.H. Brigade.
 - (iv) At 1700 on 16th the remainder of the Brigade will march from K.4 and relieve remainder of 3rd L.H. Brigade at AIN ED DUK, proceeding by Route 27 - 31.
4. COMMAND All troops NORTH of Bivouac area at K.4 will come under the command of G.O.C. 3rd L.H. Brigade until 1700 on the 16th when the command of No. 4 Sub-Sector and Left group of Divisional Reserve will pass from G.O.C. 3rd L.H. Brigade to G.O.C., N.Z.M.R. Brigade.
5. Supplies for consumption on the 15th inst. will be delivered by Camels on the morning of the 15th. The Brigade Train will deliver on the afternoon of the 15th, supplies for consumption on the 16th inst.
6. AREA STORES. The 3rd L.H. Brigade will hand over all area stores. Special attention will be paid to correct checking of trench rations and water receptacles to be taken over. Copies of all receipts will be forwarded to Brigade Headquarters.
7. Units will send in advance on the 14th, a representative to be shown the allotted Bivouac sites, reporting to Staff Captain at place to be notified later. O.C. Field Troop will report to Australian Mounted Divisional Headquarters on the 14th inst. to be shown the watering arrangements.

12th June, 1918

1. The Brigade will leave present Bivouac tomorrow, the 13th inst. and march to site in vicinity of TALAT ED DUMM.
2. Brigade will pass Starting Point - Arch Junction of EL XURD - BETHLEHEM Roads at 1730, in order of march as follows:-

Brigade Headquarters
Signal Troop
N.Z. Field Troop
N.Z. Mounted Field Ambulance
Auckland M.R. Regt
Machine Gun Squadron
Canterbury M.R. Regt.
Wellington M.R. Regt.
No. 2 Mobile Vet. Section
1st Line Transport.

Regiments will march at 5 minutes interval. The Brigade will halt at ten minutes to each hour, commencing at 1850.

3. Brigade Transport is allotted to Units as follows:-

Wellington M. R. Regt.	5 G.S. Wagons
Auckland M. R. Regt.	4 G.S. Wagons
Canterbury M. R. Regt.	4 G.S. Wagons
Brigade Headquarters	2 G.S. Wagons, 1 Limber
Signal Troop and Pay Office	1 Limber
Ordnance & Post Office	1 G.S. Wagon.

The above wagons will report to W.M.R., C.M.R., Brigade Head Quarters, Ordnance and Post Office at 1400, and must be loaded and parked at Junction of Road EL KURD - BETHLEHEM, not later than 1700.

Brigade Transport and all 1st Line Wagons will be brigaded and move off under Brigade Transport Officer.

Wellington M.R. Regt. will detail one Troop as Escort to Baggage Wagons, to report to, and be under orders of, the Brigade Transport Officer.

4. Every care must be taken by Units to ensure that the camp is left in a clean and sanitary condition. All rubbish must be burnt and not buried. Camp will be inspected by Divisional Sanitary Officer.
5. Rations will be drawn at new Bivouac at TALAT ED DUMM on 14th and at JERICHO on the 15th.
6. The Brigade will pass the 4th L.H. Brigade at Mile. 13, JERUSALEM - JERICHO Road at 2330, who will be halted clear of road.

DEFENCES OF THE JORDAN VALLEY

AUJAH DEFENCES - LEFT SECTOR - NO 4 SUB-SECTOR.

RIGHT BOUNDARY. WADI ABU EL HAIYAT from TEL EL MUSERAH to track crossing at Y.14.d.4.6.,- WADI AUJAH at Y.21.c.9.3.- H.4.b.2.2.- H.10.d.7.9.- H. 16.d.9.1.- along watershed to H.28 central

LEFT BOUNDARY. KURN SURT ABAH 112.M.17. - Pt.830.R.11.d.- EL KUSR - 113.b.1.- RAS EL TAWIL 113.C.14.- 100. J.20. a.9.9. - EL AZIRIYEH inclusive to DESERT MOUNTED CORPS thence to mouth of Wadi EN NAR 114. Y.10.

TROOPS AVAILABLE. Troops at disposal of G.O.C.N.Z.M.R. Brigade for defence of No 4 Sub-Sector - N.Z.M.R. Brigade (less A.M.R. C.M.R., and 8 machine guns) which are not to be used without reference to Divisional Headquarters.

Artillery of Left Artillery Group on reference to Artillery Group Commander.

The outpost line of No 4 Sub-sector consists of four posts on the line Y.27.central - H.7.a. An additional work for counter attack purposes has also been constructed.

THE MISSION OF THE FOUR POSTS is to form pivots of manoeuvre for a counter attack against an enemy advancing WEST OF OSH EL GHURAB, H.29.c.- EL MADHBEH - ABU TELLUL ridge.

GARRISON of No 4 SUB-sector One Regiment with one Section Machine Gun Sqdrn attached.

By day. - The line is held by a nucleus garrison of one Squadron and Sub-section Machine Gun Squadron

By night.- By two Squadrons and one Sub-section Machine Gun Sqdrn with Regiment (less two Sqdrns) and one Sub-section Machine Gun Sqdrn in reserve at AIN ED DUK.

COMMAND The garrison of the Sub-sector is temporarily placed under the command of G.O.C., N.Z.M.R. Brigade who has arrangements ready to hand over the Command of the Sub-sector to Divisional Headquarters at a moments notice.

RESERVE. Regiment (less two Squadrons) and one Sub-section Machine Gun Sqdrn.

S.O.S. SIGNALS The S.O.S. Signals employed on the Corps front is one Green followed by two Red lights fired in rapid succession.

The S.O.S. is not to be sent up by any officer holding a lower command than that of a Squadron.

As soon as the S.O.S. goes up Batteries whose S.O.S. lines cover the threatened area will open fire and remaining Batteries stand-to.

Signals. (continued)

2. If after five minutes barrage fire support is still required and telephone communication is not possible the S.O.S. must be repeated.

If after ten minutes the S.O.S. does not go up on other parts of the front, Batteries to right and left of the threatened area who can do so will switch to thicken the barrage,

Plan for rapid action to meet various possible eventualities which the Brigade may be called upon to undertake as Divisional Reserve.

1. Hostile attack SOUTHWARDS between JORDAN and MELLAHAH:-

The garrison of No 4 Sub-sector would stand to arms and remain in present area.

The Regiment and Machine Gun Sqdrn (less Section attached to No 4 Sub-sector) at Eq.Y.28. would be ordered to move at once to SHEIKH IBRAHIM Sq.Y.24.d. via Roads Nos 33 and 29.

The Brigade (less garrison of No 4 Sub-sector and Regt. and Machine Gun Sqdrn bivouacked at Y.28.) would march from AIN ED DUK via roads 27.33. and 29. to the same place. When the Brigade had concentrated at SHEIKH IBRAHIM it would proceed EASTWARDS to the neighbourhood of Sq.Z.11.

Brigade Headquarters would accompany the Brigade.

The necessary telephonic communications would be maintained by means of an extension from No 2. Sub-sector Headquarters.

On arrival at Sq.X.11. the counter attack would be developed in accordance with the tactical situation.

Transport. Waggon carrying reserve ammunition as detailed below and the wheels of Mounted Field Ambulance would move with the Brigade to a covered position in the neighbourhood of SHEIKH IBRAHIM.

Further movements would be determined by the tactical situation. The whole of the Brigade Transport (less wheels of the Mounted Field Ambulance and waggon carrying reserve ammunition as detailed) would concentrate at AIN ED DUK and await further orders.

2. Hostile attack SOUTHWARDS through the gap TOOL POST and EL MASKERQH.

The Brigade would concentrate at SHEIKH IBRAHIM as in para 1. hereof. It would then depend as to the exact location of the enemy whether the Brigade would move NORTH along Road No 29 to Sq.Y.5., or whether it would be required to make a detour via ABU TELLUL to reach that objective.

The counter attack would be launched in accordance with the tactical situation.

The country to the WEST of Road 29 consists of stone covered ridges unsuitable for wheels.

Communications. Brigade Headquarters would be established about ABU TELLUL and the necessary telephonic communication maintained by means of an extension from No 3 Sub-sector to that place.

Transport. Ammunition waggon and wheels of the Mounted Field Ambulance would accompany the Brigade and occupy a covered position on the right bank of the wadi AUJAH in the neighbourhood of crossing of No 29 Road about Sq.Y.30 central., where it would await further orders.

3. Hostile attack between MUSALLABEH and ABU TELLUL.

The Brigade would move under orders of and by such routes as detailed by G.O.C. No 3 Sub-sector. Only reserve ammunition waggon and wheels of the Mounted Field Ambulance as detailed below would accompany the Brigade.

4. Hostile attack against the line Y.21.b.10.-

Troops available.- One Regt. and one Section Machine Gun Sqdrn holding works, plus remainder of Brigade after reference to Divisional Headquarters.

4. Hostile attack against line Y.21.b.10. (continued)

Defences. Works consist of four posts built for all round defence and known as "WOOD", "WANE", "WILD" and "WAX", their mission being to form pivots of manoeuvre for counter attack.

An additional work for counter attack purposes known as "WILD" has also been constructed.

Garrison of No 4 Sub-Sector. One Regt., one Section Machine Gun Sqdrn.

By day. - The line is held by a nucleus garrison of one Squadron and one sub-section Machine Gun Squadron.

By night. - By two Squadrons and Sub-section Machine Gun Sqdrn, with Regt., (less two Sqdrns) and one Sub-section Machine Gun Squadron in reserve.

Action in case of attack. Garrison of works would stand to and Regimental Headquarters, plus one Sqdrn, and sub-section Machine Gun Squadron would move to 113.H.14.a., where Regimental Headquarters would be established ready to support any threatened point or deliver a counter attack on any part of the line.

Regiment at Sq.113.H.33.c. would move to 113.H.13.b.

Regiment and Machine Gun Sqdrn (less one Section) now at 113.H.3 would stand to and remain in present position.

Brigade Headquarters, after reference to Divisional Headquarters would move to Sq.H. 14.b.

Any further action taken would depend entirely upon the tactical situation. Should opportunity offer a counter attack would be delivered against enemy's right flank by Regiment at 113.H.13.b. or attack WESTWARDS delivered by Regiment at 113.H.3.b. from this point.

Communication. Telephonic and visual communication would be maintained.

Transport. All transport would remain in present position until further orders.

Ambulance. Cacolet Camels would move forward to vicinity of Sq. 113. H.14.b. and a Field Dressing Station would be established by O/C., Mounted Field Ambulance in vicinity of present Brigade Headquarters.

If ordered to move out in accordance with paras 1,2,3,& 4 the following supplies and ammunition would be carried:-

Unexpired portion of day's ration.
Two day's emergency ration, and
One iron ration for the man.

Ammunition.

230 rounds S.A.A. would be carried on man and horse.
2,100 " " per Hotchkiss Gun on Pack Horses,
3,000 " " per Machine Gun on Pack Horses.

Each Regiment moving out would take one limber carrying 12,000 rounds of S.A.A. and 48 Mill's Grenades.

Machine Gun Squadron would take ten limbers each carrying 12,000 rounds S.A.A.

Water carts filled would accompany ammunition waggons.

All other transport would concentrate at AIN ED DUK and await further orders.

1. A.M.R. and one Section M.G. Sqdrn. will relieve W. M.R. and one Section M. G. Sqdrn as garrison No 4 Sub-sector on night of June 30th July 1st.
Relief will be carried out as follows.
 - a. One Squadron A.M.R. and one sub-section M.G. Sqdn will move during the nights of June 29th/30th, to position occupied by Day Observation Squadron, and will take over day observation posts from W.M.R. at dawn on 30/6/18.
 - b. A.M.R. (less one squadron, and one sub-section M.G. Sqdn) will move during the night of the 30th June/1st July to bivouac site at present occupied by W.M.R.
 - c. W.M.R. and one section M.G. Sqdn will move during the night of 30th June/1st July to bivouac site at present occupied by A.M.R.
 - d. On arrival at new bivouac site the section of M.G. Sqdn at present attached to W.M.R. will rejoin squadron.
2. COMMAND
O.C. A.M.R. will take over command of No 4 sub-sector from O.C. W.M.R. at 1900 on 30/6/18,
3. TRENCH STORES
All Trench Stores will be handed over to A.M.R. and receipts taken, a copy to be forwarded to Brigade Headquarters.
4. AREA STORES
