

31st May Plugges Plateau. The Regiment, having been out as Reserve to Force who were throughout the early hours of morning engaged in extricating W.M.R. from a perilous position of 30th May, wherein W.M.R. & C.M.R. have heavy casualties, return to bivouac at 8.30 a.m. Enemy shell our hill wounding 13/380 Tpr.
