

EU	Nov. lst.		C.O.O., ROUEN, writes to say that the ruling re issue of P.W. Clothing to L. of C. units is a D.O.S. Letter, and not a G.R.O. as stated in conversation with Col. LEANE. Held up correspondence until return of Col. LEANE. "Q" forward suggested establishment for increase of present ammunition units and addition of two further units for supply of ammunition forming an ammunition Section. I was satisfied with the establishment but stated that I would prefer to see Officers as well as Men in the new Units transferred to A.A.O.C. Visited Capt. BEST in hospital at ABBEVILLE. He was still sick and had very little sleep. Visited 1st Div. Ordnance. Lieut. KENT stated that D.O.S. had queried his gun indent on base and instructed him to demand from Gun Park and he asked me to take up with Army. Lieut. ANDERSON, Corps Troops Ordnance, had no worries, except difficulty in drawing meney. I signed two requisitions for him. Called at 2rd Div. Ordce. and discussed supercession of Cpl. Div., and arranged for two Armourers to be sent to Gun Park, ROISEL, to overhaul Lewis Guns which had been sent in by Divs. of this Corps in an u/s condition. Visited Ordce., Corps Troops, and confirmed move arrangements. Seven trucks to be loaded 12th and despatched if possible. Personnel to move by lorries on 13th to dump already engaged by Lieut. ANDERSON at ST. SOUPLET. Railhead will be BUSIGNY but I told Lieut. ANDERSON to let stores remain suspended at Base until he had landed his seven truck loads now on hand. E CATEAU.	Novr.		By carrto ST SOUPLET and saw Ordnance Dump - alright, but too far from Railhead. Tried to get one at BUSIGNY, but too late, will try again to-morrow. Visited IX Corps Troops No.2 who have several Units to move under their "Q" instructions. These, I hear, have been cancelled.	
E CATEAU.	13th.		Car to BUSIGNY Railhead where I booked a large barn for Corps Troops. Also saw 0.0., IX Corps Troops No.2 who agreed to administer all units until definite orders were received to transfer. Visited D.A.D.O.S., 4th Aust. Division who is having difficulty with supply of boots and grindery. Had wired ROUEN previously to find out whether last Indents had been supplied. S.I.O.M., B Section, 4th Army, and Capt. HENDERSON, I.O.M., A.A.O.C., called to find out where Workshops were required. Referred S.I.O.M. to S.O., R.A. and positions were agreed on. Wire received that Nos. 1 & 2 Aust. Ord. Ammunition Units had completed Course in German Ammunition and were now at No. Ordnance Repair Factory. D.A.D.O.S., Aust. Corps Troops rang up to say that he had arrived. Told him not to open up Armourers Shop; arranged rationing with "Q" Branch.	
E CATEAU.	14th.		Lieut-Colonel SOMERVILLE stated that Ammunition Units would not be required in move forward, and to dispose of them as Army requires. Ordnance Corps Troops would come forward and would carry horse rugs. To Ordnance, Corps Troops and gave instructions to tell Bases to send forward stores, to hand on to horse rugs and to send back Soyers Stoves. D.A.D.O.S., 4th Aust. Division wanted reserve of 3000 pairs boots, 1000 Jackets, and 1000 pairs Trousers. Called on D.D.O.S., 4th Army who said this was too much, but reserve could be approved if "Q" put it up. "Q" decided on 6000 pairs Boots for Corps, and 2500 Jackets and 1000 pairs Puttees, and 2000 Trousers, and 3000 pairs Horseshoes. We discussed his position as regards transfer to another Corps during move forward. Took letter to Fourth army. Corps asking that reserve of clothing might be sent to Corps Troops Ordnance, who would not unload but take forward in same brucks and hold as reserve for whole Corps. D.D.O.S. said "w" would put up to Q.M.G. and he would also endeavour to take a much larger quantity forward in the same way for Imperial Corps. E CATEAU.	16th		D.A.D.O.S., 25th Division called and asked if we required Cardigan Jackets and Underclothin None required. Cavalry Officer offered us 200 Trench Shelters. These were accepted; numbers actually received seem to be many more. S.O.R.A. advised that 12th (Army) Bde. A.F.A. are badly off for certain stores but Lieut. ANDERSON says they will be fixed up in time. At "Q" Conference; points discussed: - New clothing to be issued to troops marching to Germany. Tents to be sent to Base except by Labor Units. Trench Shelters to be brought up to BUSIGNY. Extra Traces to be issued to H.T. Vehicles. Acetylene Flares to be obtained from Railheads. A.A. Lewis Guns to be sent to Base. Field Kitchens of Units to be in good condition for journey. O.C., 1st Aust. Tunnelling Coy. called to say his Unit was on move with IX Corps by road and had not received Winter Clothing. Vests and drawers most urgently needed. Rang up Ordnance, Army, who knew of no reserves in Area. He went to Corps Troops and got some gloves and cardigans.	Ig.

C.I.O.M. has made changes for move forward as follows: - Cameron vice Handerson; Stamps vice A.O.D. I.O.M.; Pockett vice Grieve. Called on C.I.O.M. to say that A.I.F. would probably object to move of Henderson, but he stated that D.O.S. wished to select men who had done long service, and that A.D.O.S. had informed Henderson on arrival that he would be moved at will by C.I.O.M. LE CATEAU.	Nov.	17th	Lieut. ANDERSON, Ordnance, Corps Troops, arranged with "K" Siege Park to supply lorries to go to PICQUINY for underclothing to-morrow. Instructed D.A.D.O.S., lst Aust. Division to put in large estimate demands for clothing and boots particularly. He seems to be having difficulty in obtaining use of car.	
LE CATEAU.	18th		Advised that Colonel LEANE is to arrive to-morrow.* Saw "Q" re move to us of 1st, 2nd & 3rd Aust. Workshops. They refused to move without Army "Q" authority. No lorries with these shops and two light shops working for this Corps. Shops are all getting orders to collect Carriages 18-pdr. air recuperator for exchange with spring, but have no lorries to collect. "Q" wired Army for comfirmation. Arranged with S.O.R.A. for disposal of H.T.M.B. mortars and stores on 22nd instant. Decided with "AQ" that Corps Armourers Shop should accompany Corps to Germany.	
LE CATEAU.	19th		Received complaint from 3rd Aust. Divl. Arty., now administered by 0.0., Corps Troops, that IX Corps had held all their bulk stores which W.O. was sure had arrived, and handed over only A.P. Tunics. S.O.R.A. stated that 12th (Army) Bde. A.F.A. was in very bad way for boots and clothing. Wired Army to ask if any objection to Corps Troops sending lorries to ROUEN to collect clothing for Heavy Artillery. A.Q.M.G. instructed me to tell D.A.Ds.O.S. that an attempt was being made to provide reserve of clothing and horseshoes, but to submit fairly large estimate demands as well. Ordnance Workshops still hung up for want of lorries to collect guns and stores. Hastened "Q" who are endeavouring to procure at least 2 at once. Army have taken 150 lorries away from Corps. Captain GRIEVE and Major STAMFORD called. GRIEVE has no job at present. Colonel LEANE arrived, to collect kit and hand over office, will remain until Saturday.	
LE CATEAU.	20th		Colonel LEANE went through all papers which I had held for him to see; mostly concerning A.A.O.C. personnel. He made it clear that moves of Australian Is.O.M. have nothing to do with this office, even to and from the 3 Australian Workshops. Asked D.D.O.S. by wire and letter to instruct O.O., IX Corps Troops No2. to hand over to 3rd Aust. Div. Arty. clothing which had been sent c/o him to that formation. LE CATEAU.	Novr 21st		With Colonel LEANE to Corps Troops Ordnance, BUSIGNY, and met Ammunition Officers there. Heard unofficially of the death of Arm. Sgt. GORST, Corps Armourers Shop. Visited Ordnance, 4th Aust. Division but D.A.D.O.S. was out; Conductor said that necessary number of boots were on rail and no other troubles. Visited D.A.D.O.S., 1st Aust. Division who has several vacancies for Armourers still, and I advised him to put forward through Division. There may be difficulty as transfers between arms and promotions are only now to be allowed in exceptional cases. Asked Army to further hasten ROUEN for supply of boot leather to 4th Aust. Division.	
LE CATEAU.	22nd		Application submitted by Corps for reserve of boots and clothing to take to Germany, refused by army as normal supply should suffice for the present; G.H.Q. has been asked to form Depot in GERMANY. Arranged for 1 N.C.O. and 6 fatigue men to be sent to Corps Troops Ordnance. Army wired to find out what provision of clothing was being made for returning prisoners of war. "A" asked for 1000 suits of clothing. Blankets have arrived but no blanketcoats under Army arrangements. Wired D.D.O.S. to ask if any blanketcoats were available with him. D.A.D.O.S., 4th Aust. Division called, and asked if demands submitted obviously only to complete establishment should be supplied. Advised him to have indents passed for replacement by D.H.Q. and hold till definite arrangement is arrived at. Advised Capt. HENDERSON, if relieved, to refer to S.I.O.M. the question of taking batman with him.	
LE CATEAU.	23rd		D.A.G.A.I.F. asks for names of O.R. who left australia in January and February 1915, for furlough to Australia. This will take a good many more men from Ordnance and vacancies will be hard to fill. Excellent report received from No.4 Ordnance Repair Factory, on German Ammunition Course attended at No.15 Ordnance Depot by members of Aust. Ammunition Units. Report from D.A.D.O.S., 1st Aust. Division that Sgt. McNAUGHT is now suitable for promotion to S/Sgt again. He was recently reduced in 3rd Aust. Division. Asked Army to send further hastener to ROUEN for Grindery for 4th Aust. Division. Reported to Army that 11 Aust. Inf. Battalions had been disbanded and 337 Lewis Guns returned to Base. Advice received from Army that Gun Parks will soon close down. Colonel LEANE left for England to take up appointment of Director of Equipment.	June 1

They ask for another but this is not available as lorries are all in use feeding forward troops, and O.M.W.s work is not urgent just now. D.A.D.O.S., 5th aust. Division forwards complaint from 5th aust. Div. Train that a certain size of brand of horseshoes is faulty. Asked other Divisions if similar faults detected.	
LE CATEAU.	25th.		2nd Aust. Division report shortage in sizes 6 & 11 of Aust. pattern boots; thus causing trouble through issue of Imperial pattern boots which hurt men's feet. Army uphold 0.0., IX Corps Troops No.2 in appropriating stores sent to 3rd Aust. Divnl. Artillery whilst attached to them. Reason given is that troops moving to Germany had to have priority, and this Corps was the only one which complained. Forwarded reply to "Q".
