The billets for the men were improved by supply of pallets from Division and these were much appreciated owing to cold weather setting in. Tables and forms were put up in mens billets and stables improved by cleaning out and washing walls with disinfectant. All horses were in the meantime on an open standing but as soon as stables were cleaned they were all put under cover in good stables. A good harness room was found and racks put up for harness and the drivers made a good effort to work up their harness.</p> <p>Influenza became very prevalent and it was necessary to establish an isolation ward to minimize infection. By degrees it was more or less stamped out and only isolated cases occurred.</p> <p>The towns of BOUTTENCOURT and BLANGY adjoin surrounded by beautiful country. BLANGY was quite a nice town with good shops.</p>

REPORT ON MOVE FROM BOUTTENCOURT TO EROUART.

Company marched out from BOUTTENCOURT in column of route to VISMES-AU-VAL, distance 8 miles, at 0900 on 25/11/18. Arrived at destination at 1200 and took over billets vacated by 55th Battalion. At beginning of march weather was fine, but it rained heavily half an hour before arriving at VISMES-AU-VAL.

Orders notifying postponement of train for 12 hours were received, therefore Company remained for two nights at this staging point.

Company marched out from VISMES-AU-VAL in column of route at 1300 on 27/11/18 and arrived at PONT REMY, distance 13 miles, at 1730. Camp fires were made in station yard and hot tea served to troops.

Train delayed and loading not complete until 2330, and train moved out at 2400, and arrived at BERTRY at 1930 on 28/11/18. Hot coffee served to troops from Y.M.C.A. at station. Detraining in rain completed by 2100 and Company marched in column of route to MAZINGHEM, distance 10 miles, and arrived at destination at 0100 in a very wet condition, as it rained heavily the whole way.

Company moved from MAZINGHEM at 1300 on 29/11/18 and arrived at EROUART distance 6 miles, at 1600, into comfortable billets.

In each case, advance party of cyclists were sent ahead to light fires in billets, and hot meals were served as soon after arrival as possible. No other arrangements were provided for comfort of troops.

No stragglers fell out on route to any destination.

Company arrived complete in every respect, except one horse left at MAZINGHEM owing to kick in stifle, and one horse lost at same place.

Reports forwarded accordingly.

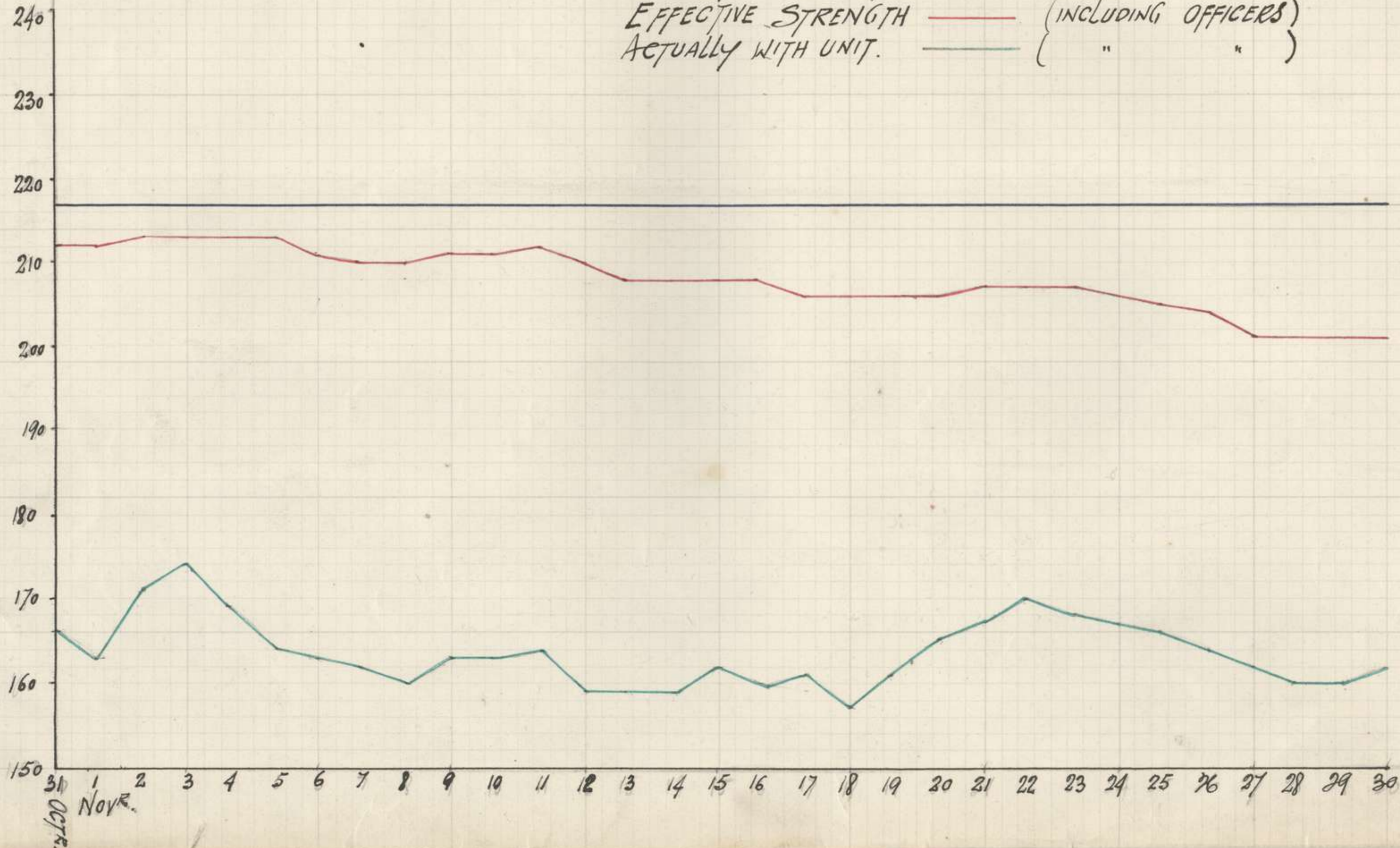
