

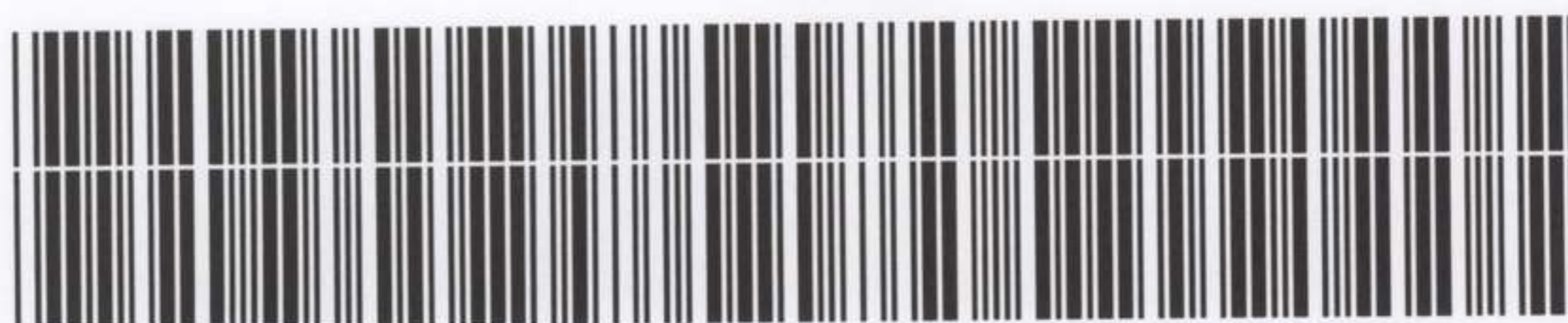

1. "All ranks of the AUSTRALIAN Corps Heavy Artillery deeply appreciate the kindness of the 2nd Australian Division in presenting to us 5.9" Gun No 2499, and desire to express our grateful thanks to you and to all ranks of the 2nd Australian Division for the very graceful compliment paid to us.
2. It is proposed to present this piece of Ordnance to the Regimental Authorities with an inscription stating that it has been very kindly presented to us by the 2nd Australian Division. "

The following comforts have been distributed free during the month of August from a total number of 25 Y.M.C.A. centres established for varying lengths of time in the Divisional Area :-

Biscuits .....	2521 lbs
Half-pint servings of hot drink .....	61340
Soft drinks .....	1500
Cigarettes .....	214000
Matches .....	2376 boxes
Newspapers .....	30 copies

Comprised in these figures are the normal distribution from 1st to 7th August at 7 centres and the special distributions accompanying the advance from the 8th at 9 Dressing Stations and 9 Y.M.C.A. centres, 11 of these latter being in villages and positions taken from the enemy. Nine of the "shows" were worked in conjunction with the 5th Divisional Y.M.C.A. The total cost of the above distribution was £ 360.

During the short period of rest towards the end of the month the ordinary social and institutional activities were provided in 6 centres.

TROPHIES OF WAR.

With reference to Administrative Memorandum No 175 of 26:9:17, setting out the procedure to be followed in rendering returns for captured trophies together with claims for disposal after allotment by the War Office.

1. Units in many cases are claiming the trophies for the Australian War Museums only. Where claims are rendered in this way the trophies will be allotted by the War Museums to the State to which the Unit belongs where possible after the war. Should units desire the trophies allotted to any particular department then Units should show on their claims the ultimate destination as follows :-

(a) Australian War Museums,  
Australian War Records Section,  
Public Records Office,  
Chancery Lane, LONDON, W.C.

to be finally sent on allotment to - name of Public Department and State to which it is desired to send the trophies.

(b) Where it is desired by units the trophies should be left with the Australian War Museums for disposal, then it is necessary only to state on claims :-



2. <sup>119</sup> As all returns are now consolidated in this office it will only be necessary in future to forward one copy of returns of captures and claims instead of three copies as heretofore.
3. Captured trophies will be securely packed and labelled prior to being handed in to D.A.D.O.S. for despatch to Base.
4. Claims for Guns, Howitzers and Carriages will be submitted on separate pro-forma to Machine Guns, Trench Mortars, and other Stores.
5. Units in submitting Claims invariably copy the same numbers of the guns from the return rendered in first reporting capture, and in many cases after the guns have been carefully checked at D.A.D.O.S. an alteration is made and consequently difficulty is experienced in identifying the guns. This could be avoided if the receipts obtained by the Unit from D.A.D.O.S. were checked against the numbers enumerated on the return of captures previously rendered and this office advised of any alterations when submitting the Claim.
