

Every Officer who is not "G.S.", and evry Officer who is "G.S.", but who is not due to return to France at the expiration of his tour, must be preapred to march out for return to Australia on forghty eight hours (48) Notice. (CR.AIF. 42379 (A))

(1) All ranks in all Depots, who embarked from Australia between 1st Jan 1915 and 30th June, 1915, who have not since been back to that country and who are of Medical classification "A" or "BlA4", are to embark for Australia at an early date and pursuant to the terms of this Order. The only exceptions will be personnel on Permanent Cadres whose retention is absolitely necessary in order to carry on the Depot work, but in this respect Permanent Cadres in all Depots, save Command Depots, can be reduced by one half, as the numbers in such Depots will be decreasing rapidly during the next fourteen days. It is expected that the personnel first mentioned herein will sail for Australia by 14th instant.

(2) The following procedure will be adopted: 1600 tom, orrow , 2nd December, approximate number of "1915"
personnel available for Australia, stating separately: -

(1) Number of Officers, (11) Number of N.C.O's.

(iii) Number of other ranks.

(b) Nominal rolls will be prepared in duplicate and forwarded to reach these Headquarters not later than Thursday 5th December.

(c) Paybooks will be at once collected from these personnel and handed to Pay Corps Representative with Un Al, who will despatch them by special messenger to Chief Paymaster Administrative Headquarters, Horseferry Road, LONDON. They must reach Chief Paymaster by Wednesday 4th December. It is to be pointed out that Paybooks will be returned to individuals before sailing, unless they delay in handing them in, in which case they would run the roan the risk of having to sail without pay-books. A covering letter, with paybooks addressed to Chief Paymaster, will state that books are to be returned to R.B.A.A. by Wednesday, 11th December.

(d) This personnel must be equipped at their Unit with kit

for sea voyage. This equipment will be completed by Friday 6th December. The scale of equipment is attached to orders of 28.11.18 being Order No 6753.

(e) This personnel will be prepared on 24 hours notice to move on any day after Friday, 6th December, to R.B.A.A.

PERSONNEL FOR RETURN TO AUSTRALIA:

l. All personnel in Depots of all ranks end of any medical classification except "A", Bl A4, and BlB, are to return to Australia without delay. "A4" personnel are included in those who are to return . There are also included all personnel on permanent Cadres or attached , excluding only those whom it is absolutely necessary to retain for carrying on the work of the Depot, in which connection it is to be borne in mind that strength in Depots is being much reduced by this order combined with Orders already issued for the des patch of "B" and "C" Classpersonnell to Australia and despatch to France of all Reinforcements who have completed disembarkation Leave, and consequently permanent Cadre personnel not of "A" or BlA4 classification can be reduced proportionately. 2. Any such personnel for retrun to Australia, i.c., all medical classifications except "A" ,BlA4 and BlB will now march in to Depots as follows: -

(a) All such personnell available for return to Australia in FOVANT Depots A.I.F. under the Command of Brigadier-Gen McNicoll, CMG., DSO., will forthwith march out to No4 Command

Depot.

(b) Allsuch personnel available for return to Australia in Sutton Veny Depots A.I.F. under the Command oc Colonel Walson C.B., V.D. will forthwith march in to Nol Command Depot. (c) All such personnel in any A.I.F. Depot not in Fovant Depots or Sutton Veny Depots will forthwith march into No 2 Command Depot.

As orders have already been issued for B2 and C Class personnel to return to Australia this order applies mainly to (a) "B2" and "C" Class personnel of all ranks retained under previous orders to carry on work of Depots but who can now be spared.

(b) All personnel of all ranks of Medical classifications BlAl, BlA2, and BlA3.

4. Personnel so marching in to Nos 1,2 or 4 Command Depots will be immediately boarded for Australia by Medical Staffs, under arrangements to be made by thr A.D.M.S.

5. All Depots including Command Depots will:

(a) Telegraph to these Headquarters by Tuesday, 3rd December, approximate numbers available under this order, distinguishin between Officers, N.C.O's, and Privates.

(b) Forward Nominal rolls in duplicate to these Headquarters to arrave not later than 5th December of personnel available for Australia Hereunder:

communicate direct with No 4 Command Depots in Fovant Area will communicate direct with No 4 Command Depot by an Officer Messenger those in SUTTON VENY Area with No 1 Command Depot by an Officer messenger: other Depots with No 2 Command Depot by telegraph; in order to ascertain that the Command Depot concerned has accommandation for the personnel, and which is to march in to it from the other Depot concerned. Command Depots concerned will reply immediately and direct to the Depot proposing to send the personnel which will not despatch the personnel till notified there is accommodation. Nominal rolls are to accompany the, personnel marching in. If, in any case, the Command Depot considers it has not the accommandation required which is unlikely it will telegraph to these head quarters in the following form:

CHRISTMAS RAILWAY TRAVELLING

Owing to the present very great conjestion in travelling by rail short leave under A.C.1 1564 of 1917 i.e. Friday to Tuesday leave and Tuesday to Friday leave has to be suspended till 22nd January. 1919. This only refers to Good Conduct and competition leave, and is to be made up for as far as possible by Christmas Leave up to 12 days as authorised. It does not refer to disembarkation Leave for Reinforcements from Australia, nor to leave under existing demobilisation orders to personnel arriving from France for Australia or personnel for Australia now in depots getting short leave before embarkation., nor does it refer to hospital furlough or marriage Leave.

SALISBURY CATHEDRAL DIOCESAN WAR MEMORIAL. Attentior is directed to the following circular: -

After consultation with the Greater Chapter and a number of representative Layman of the Diocese, it is proposed that the re shall be a memorial in the Cathedral to all those from th County of Dorsetand such party of the County of Wilts as is included withinthe Diocese of Salisburywho have fallen in the War, to perpetuate our grateful memory of their herioc sacrifice and our hope for them in Christ. This Corporate memorial x in the Mother church is in noway intended to conflict with the personal memorials which will in many cases will be erected locally. It may be that those who have been in Training in the Various Camps, and especially those from Distant parts of the Empire, and who have visited the Cathedral in such large numbers, may like to be associated in the memorial. It is proposed to fill twettstained glass the Windows in the North Aisle, which shall henceforth be known as the Warrior's Aisle" and that there shall be a book of Remembrance containing thenames-several thousandin numberof those commemorated, and the parishes from which they went to serve their King and Coutry. Probably the sum of £5,000 willbe required for the five double light windows east of th North Torch. Should a larger sum be contributed it will be possible to continue the series westard with a view of ultimately completing the whole Aisle.
