

Two additional Staff-Nurses reported for duty on 26th January, which brings the number up to 7 as things stand at present, exclusive of the Head-Sister.

ORDERLY ROOM . -

During the Month of January, 1917, 28 men were dealt with for drunkenness, accompanied by one or other of the following offences: Obscene language, creating a disturbance, absence and gambling in Camp.

76 Men were convicted on a charge of absence with-

out leave and were dealt with accordingly.

56 punishments were meted out for offences (minor) against discipline.



HEALTH & SANITATION REPORT FOR MONTH OF JANUARY 1917.

I have the honour to report that the health of Westham Camp is satisfactory and shows an improvement compared with last month.

SICK. The Daily Average Number of sick has been 14.

DRESSINGS. Men requiring dressings numbered 30. X

MASSAGE. The number of men requiring Massage was 53. X

HOSPITAL. THE total number of cases, including Venereal & Scabies, for the month was 24. This is considerably less than the admissions for December which was 44.

VENEREAL & SCABIES. The following cases were transferred to Monte Video for treatment and isolation.

Gonorrhoea. 7. Venereal sores. 1. Scabies. 8.

INFECTIOUS DISEASE. Only one case of Mumps occurred and the patient has been isolated in the Drying Room.



There has been no overcrowding and the huts have been kept well ventilated.



> The Cookhouse has been taken over by the School of Cookery, and all the cooking for the Camp is now


done by them.

Month ending January 31st, 1917.

Roads

Paths

General maintenance of Roads and Paths has been carried

out as necessary.

A new Footpath is under construction from existing path at North Eastern corner of Hut 2 to the existing Road at Main entrance of the Y.M.C.A. Hut.

All Footpaths between Huts 1 to 25 are now

completed and are a great improvement.

Sewerage

All Sewers, Gullies and Manholes are disinfected weekly.

Surface Water

Drainage

The Foul Drain at No.2 Cook House has been opened

and a Choke removed.

Foul Drains from Nos.1 and 2 Cook Houses have been cleaned. Cleaning Rods have been put through all Drains. A New Foul Drain has been laid from Hut 28 (Dispensary) to existing Drain at North Western corner of No.4 Latrine.

Ablution Houses & Latrines

The material having come to hand for the repairs to No.6 Ablution House, this work is being proceeded with.

All Urinals are treated with heavy Oil at regular intervals and all Latrine Pans are disinfected daily.

Huts.

All Huts are in excellent habitable state from point of view of Cleanliness. Floors, Tables, Forms, etc. are scrubbed at regular intervals and all breakages promptly repaired.

Painter & Glazier

The Reading and Billiard Room has been treated with dis-temper and the Book Cases have been painted. Breakages have been light during the Month and all broken Windows promptly repaired.

Carpenter & Joiner Hut No.50 has been made into an Isolation Hospital and two partitions have been erected forming three compartments and a door fitted to the North Side for the centre compartment. A partition has been made in No.4 Companies Orderly Room and small joinery work has been carried out in the Hospitals, etc.

Bath Houses

The Bath Houses are thoroughly cleaned.

Cook Houses

The Ranges and Boilers in the Cook Houses have been overhauled and cleaned. No Tops of Grate being available, these are still required, otherwise all are in good order.

Incinerators All Incinerators are in good order.

The cultivation of Ground ready for the planting of Potatoes is well in hand.

Water Supply

Water has been laid on in Hut 28 (Dispensary) and a Sink complete with Waste, etc. fitted.
