Sanitation of the Camp is satisfactory. The ventilation regulations have been carried out in the Huts. Latrines, Kitchens, Institutes etc., have been kept clean and in a satisfactory condition.

BY-PRODUCTS. No margarine was manufactured during the period. By-Products have been sold at the value of £57-11-11. VEGETABLES. Large quantities have been purchased locally at a muchly reduced prices from those quoted by the N.A.C.B. This enabled me to supplement the daily menu to a great extent.
