

II 24th 30th Mr. HOLMAN, Premier of New South Wales, visited 5th Aust. Inf. Bde. with Corps Commander and addressed the Officers. SUMMARY. No operations have been carried out during the month - the Division having been in Rest in the RUBEMPRE - SENLIS - WARLOY Area until the 17th and since that date in Reserve to 4th Corps in "M" Area ( BIEFVILLERS - BAPAUME - PEAULENCOURT ) . Training during the month has been progressive and much valuable work has been done. Field Firing Ranges constructed between the BEAULENCOURT ROAD and GUEUDECOURT have been in daily use with the object of training platoons in the attack in open warfare. Selected Platoons from Brigades have been under special training supervised by the General Staff to give demonstrations emphasing fundamental tactical principles. The Divisional Artillery has been detached from the Division since the move to "M" Area remaining at AVELUY, where refitting and training has been in progress. SITUATION WIRES.

9th June, 1917.

Wire received from Third Army 9-6-17.

Second Army wires successful in minor operation vesterday morning East of MESSINES which placed them on their final objective along the whole front. During yesterday enemy concentrations and attempted counter-attacks were successfully engaged by artillery. 3 hostile aeroplanes were crashed and 2 driven down out of control. Themy counter-attack after a heavy bombardment about 7 p.m. last night North of YPRES-COMMINES CANAL near KLEINZILLEFEKE was successfully repulsed on the whole front with exception of advanced points near KLEINZILLEF KE from which he was subsequently ejected. Other attempts to roid our trenches last night were all repulsed. Gas was successfully projected by 2nd Army on several points on their front.

On First Army frontraids were carried out over a front of 2 miles. Enemy lines were penotrated to a maximum depth of mile and very heavy casualties were inflicted; so far 114 prisoners are reported and some machine guns, 2 Trench mortars destroyed. Our casualties slight.

On our own front 5th Corps successfully raided HINDENBURG LINE in U.20.a. last night, one prisoner captured and about 20 casualties inflicted on enemy. Our casualties slight. I hostile aeroplane brought down out of control.
