

The Division is in the HOLLEBERM Sector, holding the centre Divisional front of the Australian Corpol with the 14th and 15th Australian Infantry Brigades in line; the 8th Australian Infantry Brigade is in Divisional Reserve. 			The G.O.C. lectured in the KEMMEL School House at 5 p.m. this afternoon, to junior officers. The subject was "The duties and responsibilities of junior officers."  At 9.54 p.m. a S.O.S. Signal was sent up on the right of the OOSTTAVERNE Group and the left of the MESSINES Group; our batteries opened fire before the rockets had reached the ground. The enemy put down a heavy minenwerfer barrage, isolating one strong point. Under cover of the darkness the wire had previously been aut. A party (reported to be 4 officers and 70 others) then attempted a raid. They were repulsed with Mills grenades, leaving I wounded prisoner, a light machine gun, two rifles, and some grenades.
