It has only been quite recently erected and was completed with the exception of putting in the necessary power plant at the Railway end. The overhead cable about is inches) has been placed in position and is at present badly damaged by shell fire in 6 places. There is a large drum of cable at railway siding, also a number of pulleys and tipping buckets.

As the structure appears to be of very little value under present conditions. I would recommend that as much as possible of the detached parts be salvaged and steps taken to prevent the remainder from being cut down by unauthorised persons; quite a lot of timber has already been taken in this way. "
