

In addition about 7.45 p.m. enemy opened a heavy bombardment on our front trenches on the extreme left flank with field guns and both field and heavy howitzers. Our artillery replied and fired about 450 rounds on their night lines. At 8.15 p.m. gas alarm was passed to us from the left but was unconfirmed. The enemy shelling and machine gun fire included the roads and communications in rear but owing to our promptness in getting the reserves up to their posts, this fire was ineffective Most of enemy shelling was directed into the salient at N.6 Central. The damage done to our trenches was not great and at 9.25 p.m. the situation was again normal, no infantry attack having been haunched at our front. It was noticed that the enemy at once immittated our light signals and sent up a succession of green rockets. During the shelling we put out 3 listening posts 80 yards in from of our parapet to give warning of infantry attack. We sent out patrols after midnight but no enemy movement was seen.

(i) Our artillery shelled FROMELLES Station, goods sheds, water tower and Fme. DU HOYON, and obtained direct hist on all targets. Movement on the right at 0. 16.b.2.8. was several times dispersed by our gun fire during the day. (ii) We fired a number of rifle grenades from our right brigade to which the enemy replied with rifle grenades and trench mortar bombs all of which fell in rear of our front line.
