

Remarks and Place Hour Date Summary of Events and Information references to Appendices June 6th. LA MOTTE. - Operations. 1916. 1st Australian Division. Our Activity. We shelled FROMELLES and several enemy billets suspected as Headquarters. Our snipers drew machine gun fire to which we replied. Enemy Activity. Normal. 2nd Australian Division. Our Activity. A special party consisting of 4 officers and 55 o.r. under Captain ROBINSON and Captain C.M. Foss 28th Bn. carried out a successful enterprise on enemy line south of the WAVRIN - AFMINITIERES railway. The party left our trenches at 9.40 p.m. and took up a position in No MAN'S LAND. At 11.15 p.m. our artillery and trench mortars opened fire and the former carried out diversions to the right and left of the positions to be entered. At 11.25 p.m. fire was directed on to the positions to be entered and after 10 minutes heavy bombardment range was lengthened and a barrage behind and to the flanks of the spot was formed. The raiding party entered the enemy's trenches unopposed and killed 12 and took 3 prisoners (for full report see Appendix A) Enemy Activity. The enemy were quiet during the day. He retaliated in return for our bombardment during and after the raid and our parapets were damaged in places but little damage was done and few casualties suffered. New Zealand Division. At 12.30 a.m. a raiding party of the 6th Bn. under Captain P.D. MONCUR left our trenches and took up position in NO MAN'S LAND. At 12.50 p.m. our artillery and trench mortars commenced a bombardment which lasted 10 minutes after which the raiding party crossed the enemy's wire and entered his trenches. Six prisoners were captured and at least 12 of the enemy accounted for. One trench mortar was destroyed and a machine gun was captured with its mounting but was too heavy to get more than half way across NO MAN'S LAND. It was destroyed by trench mortars during the morning. Our casualties were one officer and one stretcher bearer slightly wounded. During the day our artillery set a house on fire south of LA BISETTE. Enemy Activity. The enemy's retaliation to our raid was ineffectual; little damage was done. 2nd Australian Division. Our Activity. Our patrols were active but no enemy parties were met with. Our right group of artillery co-operated with the 1st Australian Division during the raid. Enemy Activity. With the exception of slight intermittent shelling in the BOIS GRENIER district the day was quiet. New Zealand Division. Our Activity. Our artillery were active and two or three enemy working parties were dispersed; our trench mortars damaged a small sector of enemy's parapet and wire. Enemy Activity. During the night enemy's machine guns opened on our flank and several mortars and grenades were fired at Trench 87. Retaliation to our artillery fire was weak.
