GLISY	1918 May 1		<p><u>Railhead - AILLY-sur-SOMME.</u> Corps advise 1500 Water tins arriving on pack and 6000 iron rations can be drawn from C.T.B. Coy SALOUL for Reserve Rations. Asked O.C., 'C' Coy., 1st Bn Tanks if he requires dump of petrol and oil established in forward area for operations imminent. Stated he had transport to carry this into effect and was able to supply all requirements without any assistance. <u>Bridge at Sheet 62d N.34.b.2.g. closed to traffic pending repairs. Subject: Reorganisation of Brigades on a three Bn. Basis.

1. Reorganisation.

Reorganisation of 13th. A.I. Bde. will take effect immediately by withdrawing the 52nd Battalion.

The designation "52nd Bn." thereafter will apply to the Training Unit of the Brigade.

2. Personnel.

Personnel of the 52nd Battalion will be distributed, territorially, as far as practicable, within the Brigade including all Officers on the Seconded List of the Battalion. Officers on the supernumerary list will remain as such and will not be transferred.

Subject :- Reorganisation of Brigades on a Three Battalion Basis.

1. REORGANISATION.

Reorganisation of 12th Aust. Infantry Brigade will take effect immediately by withdrawing the 47th Battalion.

The designation "47th Battalion" thereafter will apply to the Training Unit of the Brigade.

2. PERSONNEL.

Personnel of 47th Battalion will be distributed, territorially so far as practicable, within the Brigade, including all officers on the Seconded List of the Battalion. Officers on the Supernumerary List will remain as such and will not be transferred.

Officers of the 47th Battalion seconded for duty at the time with the Training Battalion will be transferred to another Battalion of the Brigade and then seconded for duty with the 47th Battalion. Similarly officers belonging to other Battalions of the Brigade and seconded for duty with the Training Battalion (other than on Battalion Headquarters) will automatically be seconded for duty with the 47th Battalion.

Officers "missing" will remain on the Battalion List until struck off at expiration of three months from date of being reported "Missing".

The Assistant Adjutant and Q.M. will be transferred to the Training Battalion for a tour of duty on the Permanent Cadre.

Officers holding appointments such as Adjutant, etc., will automatically relinquish such appointments on transfer unless posted in a similar appointment.

Numbers by units of transfers and postings to be reported to this office on the day they take place. Posting of officers to be submitted as soon as possible for publication in A.I.F. orders.

3. TRANSPORT.

The Battalion Transport will be kept intact pending further instructions, and will be available for work under the Corps Transport officer. In the meantime it will be handed over to C.O. 4th Aust. Div. Train for administration and discipline.

4. MOBILIZATION STORES.

All Mobilization Stores, except Transport Equipment will be returned to D.A.D.O.S. accompanied by detailed lists in triplicate marked "ON REPAYMENT". Original and Duplicate lists will be signed by D.A.D.O.S., one for preservation with Battalion Records and one for submission to this office. 

Report of Div. Burials Officer for period 28/4/18 to 23/5/18.

On taking over new sector on 28/4/18 a reconnaissance was made of ground and enemy dead were found at Sheet 62d, O.29.c., at O.34.b. and U.4.a. The ground seemed clear of British dead, having apparently been cleared of these before Division had taken over.

The Brigades were informed of locations of dead, and nearest units buried them. The Bois d'Aquenne on first inspection was clear, but later D.B.O. was informed of British dead at O.33.b.5.1., and an Australian (unidentified) at O.33.c.6.6. These could not be moved to a cemetery and were buried at the locations given. Bodies were found at O.35.b.c., at U.4.a.4.8, and at U.4.B.

A Cemetery was established at O.28.c.5.6. on or about 30/4/18, and Brigade Burial N.C.Os were instructed to make all units acquainted with its location, in order to use same for casualties which occurred in front line. The location of this cemetery has been handed on to D.B.O. of 3rd Division.

The 18th Field Ambulance at St. Acheul were in need of labour to dig trench for those who died there. A party was arranged for and instructed to carry out work to the satisfaction of the C.O. of Ambulance.


